

The 2017-2018 school year is underway! On August 10th we welcomed 2,142 Knights and 166 staff members. Is your student "plugged in" at Creekside? Creekside High School has over 65 clubs and extracurricular organizations, and more are forming every day. These extracurriculars are designed for your students to get involved with the Creekside Community.

This year our teachers are using an online tool called Schoology to keep students informed of upcoming dates and deadlines. All students can login using their Active Directory username and password – there will be a Parent Portal feature, information will be released as soon as it is ready. Creekside High School is also a B.Y.O.D. (Bring Your Own Device) school, which means your students can bring their own laptop or tablet to school and connect to the school WiFi for schoolwork.

Individual conferences can be scheduled with each counselor, or come to our Guidance Parent Night on September 28 for presentations about vital information for your child's grade level. Our guidance counselors are going to be working in the classrooms this year as well as hosting lunch sessions for students on a variety of topics.

Creekside FBLA Students Place at **National Competition**

Sixteen students from Creekside High School attended the FBLA National Leadership Conference in Anaheim, California this summer after advancing from the Florida State Leadership Conference/ Competition held earlier this year. Students who attended include:

Each state could enter their top four participants for each event. Creekside is proud to announce their finalists:

- Ronnie Piccione and Juliana Martinez placed 2nd in Management Information Systems
- Trevor Flint, Clay Carter, and Teegan Bailey placed 4th in Network Design
- Anna Perkins placed 6th in Public Speaking for 9th and 10th grade students





In the Network Design and Management Information Systems events, students had to score in the top 15 nationally on an objective test to qualify for the final round of competition. The performance component (final round) consisted of examining a case study, within 20 minutes or less, and then presenting the case study along with their version of the solution to a panel of judges. Public Speaking participants had to compete in two rounds with the final round including to the top 16 in the nation. The top ten competitors or teams (if it was a team event) were recognized at the 2017 National Leadership Conference Awards of Excellence Program on July 2, 2017 in Anaheim, California. Six of the students above graduated from Creekside in 2017. The students returning this year are now more eager than ever to get back to Nationals again next summer, which will be held in Baltimore, MD.

Lynda Kelly, with Kathy Sinardi assisting, established the Creekside's chapter of Future Business Leaders of America in the fall of 2013. With 244 members last year, 130 members participated in the District 27 Competition, where 81 members qualified for the State Competition. 75 of the 81 members competed at State in Orlando, where 33 members placed in the Top 5 at the State level. FBLA has over 60 competitive and skills events from the areas of technology, public speaking, communication, business, finance, and management. More than 9,600 of America's best and brightest high school students traveled to Southern California to establish their own Legacy of Leadership as they competed for the opportunity to win more than \$170,000 in cash awards.

October 2017 PSAT/NMSQT®

Creekside High School will administer the PSAT to all students in grades 9-11 on Wednesday, October 11, 2017. The purpose of the test is to give all students an opportunity to experience taking a college readiness test and to identify students who might benefit from advanced coursework.

Students in 9th and 11th grade must pay a \$20 registration fee in order to receive their scores. Please make checks payable to Creekside High School and write your student's name, grade level, and "PSAT" in the memo line. Students may submit registration fees to the Testing Coordinator, Mrs. Mackoul, before or after school in room 130. The last day to pay for registration will be Friday, September 29th. All 10th grade students will receive a score report at no charge. Your student's Score Report for the PSAT/NMSQT® will be available in mid-to-late December from College Board.
