I want to begin by thanking you for your continued support of our school and for your kind words regarding the changes happening here at Dixie.

We continue to try and create the most caring and inviting school community possible. At the same time, we want to build a school that is highly competitive in all areas – academics, clubs, sports and the arts.

Of course, we also want to be a highly innovative school that pushes the boundaries and transforms into a place that our students, faculty and staff enjoy being a part of.

- **Our new College and Career Center is up and running.** Mrs. Noser, our college and career specialist, has joined with our counselors in creating a great environment for our students to explore college and career options.
- **Our after-school tutoring is also open.** On Tuesdays and Thursdays after school, we have our Study Hub (room 401) open from 2:30 – 4:00 p.m. as an open Study Hall environment where students can work on homework or projects and, of course, we have individual tutoring in reading, writing, math, and biology. Any student is welcome to join in.
- **A new online tutoring program is coming soon.** Stay tuned for information coming soon on our Dixie Virtual Tutoring program, which we are piloting this year. For those students who have internet access at home (or in a library), we will have live “tutoring chats” with our faculty and staff on a number of subjects that will serve as tutoring sessions and possible extra credit opportunities for our kids.
- **Our DixieU after-school enrichment program** for our students, faculty and parents is also running again this year. It is open every Tuesday and Thursday after school with a wide variety of opportunities for our kids to learn and explore their creative side in the areas of arts, writing, music, etc. As part of DixieU, we continue to have open our 4940Studio (for arts exploration), our faculty trainings in the areas of reading, writing and technology, and (starting in November) our workshops on writing the college essay (and relate college entrance support). Of course, any student is welcome to join in.

There are many, many other exciting ideas and changes coming to Dixie and we are excited about the pride that many of you have in this school, its past and its future. We thank you for that.

Before I close, let me thank the community for its continued support of our efforts. We have a growing list of businesses and community members who continue to step up and help when we've asked. This month, a special thank you goes out to SweetBay Supermarkets, Sonic Restaurant and Aquarium Professionals for their kind and thoughtful contributions.

At Dixie, we will continue to promise nothing less than a high quality education for your sons and daughters.

5517.01 Policy against Bullying/Harassment (Grades K-12 and Adults) 5517.03 Teen Dating Violence and Abuse Policy (Grades 7-12)

In response to the state law, the *Jeffrey Johnston Stand Up for all Students Act*, the School Board adopted a policy that prohibits bullying and harassment. The policy ensures that all students, employees, and volunteers learn and work in an environment that is safe, secure, and free from harassment and bullying of any kind. Florida is now one of 47 states with a law regarding bullying in schools.

The Policy defines Bullying as systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students or employees and may involve but is not limited to: teasing, social exclusion, threat, intimidation, stalking, including cyberstalking, physical violence, theft, sexual, religious, or racial harassment, public humiliation, and destruction of property.

The policy defines harassment as any threatening, insulting, or dehumanizing gesture, use of data or computer software, or written, verbal or physical conduct directed against a student or employee that: Places a student or employee in reasonable fear of harm to his or her person or damage to his or her property, has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's educational performance, opportunities, or benefits, has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of a school.

The School Board strictly prohibits any act of Teen Dating Violence and Abuse committed by one student against another on school property, during a school-sponsored activity, or during school-sponsored transportation. This policy applies only to students in grades 7-12.

"Teen Dating Violence and Abuse" is a pattern of emotional, verbal, sexual, or physical violence and/or abuse by one person in a current or past relationship of a romantic nature to exert power and control over another when one or both of the partners is a teenager. Abuse may include insults, coercion, social sabotage, sexual harassment, threats and/or acts of physical or sexual abuse. The abusive partner uses this pattern of violent and coercive behavior to gain power and maintain control over the dating partner. To be subject to this Policy, Teen Dating Violence and Abuse committed by one student against another must occur on school property, during a school-sponsored activity, or during school-sponsored transportation.

We are committed to providing a safe learning environment and will not tolerate Bullying/Harassment or Teen Dating Violence and Abuse of any kind. Incidents can be reported to the principal or any staff member or reported online at one of the below links:

Parents, now that this year's Title I Parent Involvement Plan has been completed for the 2011-2012, it is important that you are able to access this plan. Research shows that education begins in the home and the degree to which students are successful is directly related to how involved their parents are in monitoring their child's grades, attendance and graduation requirements. If you still need a Portal password, drop in the guidance office with your driver's license to get your user I.D. and password.

This year Dixie has planned many events to encourage parental involvement here on campus. On Sept. 13th we had our Annual Title I Parent Information Meeting/ Spaghetti Dinner with the PTSA. There were door prizes and a guest speaker who spoke about parents as their child's #1 advocate. On Oct. 13th we had a parent workshop ("Interpreting the Spoken Word") in conjunction with the student 4940 Art Expo. Parents who attended this workshop learned how to use 'One-Sentence Summaries' and were given an assignment that required them to observe student work in order to critique it using this literacy strategy. On Oct. 28th the Taste of Dixie Homecoming Dinner and football game took place, on Nov. 9th the new College and Career Center at Dixie hosted a fair, and in the Spring 'Partnering with Parents' will present its second annual Parent Workshop/ Family Day here at Dixie. As a Title I school, parents play an integral role through collaboration and continuous learning that results in graduating students who are "life-ready".

GUIDANCE INFORMATION

Senior Info:

Guidance Counselors have completed senior credit checks with each senior. If you are unclear on where your child stands in relation to graduation requirements, please contact your child's guidance counselor. Monitoring your child's grades and attendance through the entire senior year is important for a smooth road to graduation in June. If you need a Portal password you may bring a photo ID to the guidance office and we will be happy to assist you.

General Information:

We were able to take 40 seniors on a field trip to the Health Center at St. Petersburg College. These students had a rewarding experience and were exposed to a variety of health career options offered through SPC.

Dixie Hollins hosted a Career and College Fair on November 9. We had over 20 participants from a variety of colleges and technical schools. Students were able to speak with admissions counselors and receive information on post high school options, to assist them in developing plans for after graduation.

Tenth grade seminars were completed last week. Topics included : graduation requirements, college admission requirements, Bright Future Scholarship eligibility, PTEC and SPC information etc. Please ask your child to see the handouts given.

The military will be offering the ASVAB on December 7. Students may sign up through their guidance counselor.

Dixie Hollins now has a College and Career Center in room 321. We are in the process of arranging for coverage so that students may come to the center at scheduled times and explore colleges, careers, scholarships etc. Mrs. Noser, a new math teacher in our school, did an amazing job getting this project underway.

Credit Recovery:

Students who have failed a class or are behind in credits may need to make up classes outside of their traditional school day. Dixie Hollins offers a night school program for students who have failed certain academic classes. Florida Virtual School is another option for credit recovery. At times, students are also able to participate in Nova Net during the school day to make up failed classes.

Doorways Scholarships:

The Pinellas Education Foundation is accepting nominations for Doorways Scholarships. Students must meet the following criteria:

- C's or higher in all classes for each grading period
- Be in grades 6-11
- Qualify for free/reduced lunch
- Have a history of good attendance and discipline.

A Doorways Scholarship provides a 2 or 4 year scholarship through the Florida Prepaid College Program. Anyone may nominate a deserving student at www.pinellaseducation.org.

Dual Enrollment:

Registration for dual enrollment with St. Pete College began on November 2 for the spring semester. Interested students need to meet with their guidance counselor immediately to discuss eligibility requirements and begin the application process, if they have not already done so. Contact your student's counselor if you have any questions.

Music Department Info

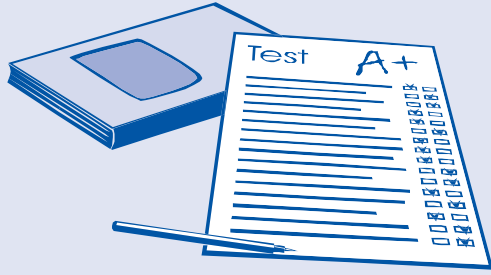
Long ago, the ancient Greeks included music as a core subject along with mathematics, philosophy, and astronomy. This tradition is alive and well at Dixie Hollins High. Music is valued highly at the school and music programs continue to grow. Signs of this growth are evident in the addition of Dr. Michael Zelenak to the music faculty, the installation of a state-of-the-art digital music studio, and the expansion of course offerings. Students can now enroll in diverse courses such as chorus, band, string orchestra, guitar, keyboard, AP theory, and digital music composition. Dixie is at the forefront of music education in Pinellas County.

Since the beginning of the year, music students have been actively taking part in special performance events. In September, chorus students participated in USF's Festival of Voices and a choral workshop at Stetson University. Select students have also been preparing for the Florida All-State Choir and the Pinellas County All-County Choir. On Oct. 4, a pop music concert was held in the choral room. This concert provided students with an opportunity to perform "their-own" music for their friends. Band, guitar, and digital music students also performed at the 4940 Expo on October. 13. There will many other opportunities throughout the year for students to demonstrate their talents.

Band students have been performing at football games and other events. The Royal Rebel Marching Band has been putting in many hours preparing for band competitions such as the Tarpon Springs Outdoor Invitational and the Chamberlain High School Band Competition. Marching season will soon end and concert season will be underway. So if you are a musician, it is never too late to start making music. Speaking of making music, congratulations to Jessica Leasure who was selected to perform in this year's Festival of Winds at USF, Tampa.

Upcoming events for chorus: On Thursday Nov. 17, choral students will perform their fall concert at Pinellas Park Middle School. The concert starts at 7pm. We are excited to have this opportunity to perform with two of our major middle school feeder programs: Pinellas Park Middle School and Tyrone Middle School. It's an absolutely free concert, and open to the public. We hope you'll join us!
