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2022 - 2023 PARKING PASSES

Parking Permits for the 2022 – 2023 school year will be available for purchase using Payschools (www.payschoolscentral.com) beginning **Tuesday 7/5/2022**. **ALL** students driving to FHS – including but not limited to PSEO students, Butler Tech students parking at FHS to catch the shuttle bus, Flex, and CBIP student drivers are **REQUIRED** to purchase a parking permit.

Parking Permit Applications will be available for completion through Final Forms (www. fairfield-oh.finalforms.com) beginning **Tuesday 8/2/2022**. *Only complete this form for the STUDENT DRIVING – please do not complete for siblings riding in the same vehicle* and/or if carpooling with another student – if the sibling and/or other student will be driving to school at any time in a separate vehicle, please complete the Parking Application individually for that student. Please make sure that all required documentation has also been uploaded into your student's file folder in Final Forms. If further instruction is needed, please see 2022 - 2023 Parking Instructions. **If you have previously (prior school year) uploaded the required documents, you only need to upload documentation if the vehicle your student will be driving is DIFFERENT than the information that has already been submitted.** Please review your student's folder to ensure that all of the REQUIRED information has been either previously uploaded and/or newly added. Parking Permits will not be processed if information/documentation is missing.



REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- 1.) Student's Driver's License
- 2.) Auto Insurance for vehicle being driven
- 3.) Current Vehicle Registration

Please allow up to two (2) school days for processing. Students may stop in the office BEFORE or AFTER school only to pick up their parking pass. Passes WILL NOT be distributed during any of the lunch bells.

Students are only permitted to park in the student lot. Parking is on a first come basis. There is **NO PARKING** in reserved areas: Staff/

Visitor area, Drop-Off/Pick-Up areas, Handicap, Fire Lane, etc. ALL student parking is in the **FRONT** of the school building across from the tennis courts (excluding the top tier) and includes the lower Marching Band practice lot. **SENIOR PAINTED SPOTS ARE CONSIDERED A RESERVED AREA.**

***REMEMBER: Any student found parked or parking in a reserved area, outside of the student parking area, or parking without a Parking Permit will automatically have the parking fee (\$55) assessed to their student account and are subject to discipline action, and/or having the car tagged/towed at the owner's expense. Parking fees are a non-waivable school expense.

Sponsored by the Ohio Center for Law Related Education, "The Ohio Mock Trial Program is an academic competition designed to foster a better understanding of the American democratic legal system and to encourage development of analytical and communication skills. In moving from the classroom to the courtroom, high school students add an important dimension to their learning experience in citizenship education. Through first-hand experience, the Mock Trial Competition can serve to teach students about their rights and responsibilities under the Constitution and prepare students for possible future involvement as parties, witnesses and jurors in trials."

OBJECTIVES:

- To improve basic skills such as critical thinking, listening, speaking, and reading
- To develop a greater understanding and appreciation for the law, court procedures, and the judicial system
- To increase understanding of our constitutional rights and responsibilities
- To recognize students' academic and intellectual achievements

MEMBERSHIP:

- Any high school student may participate
- Meetings begin in early September and practice is once per week up and twice per week in December through the district competition, which is around mid-January.
- It is a program that is beneficial for pre-law students as well as other college-bound students in our district.



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Fairfield City Schools has partnered with FinalForms, an online forms and data management service, to simplify the back-to-school process for our families while reducing our paper usage. FinalForms allows you to complete and sign enrollment, back-to-school, and athletic/club participation forms for your students. FinalForms saves data from season-to-season and year-to-year, meaning that you will never need to enter the same information twice! FinalForms also pre-populates information wherever possible for each of your students, saving you time.

You may review your data at any time throughout the school year to verify it is current. You will be required to sign your forms once per year and after any update or as additional forms are added.

If you are a parent of a middle school or high school athlete who already has a Fairfield Final Forms account, please log on and fill out the forms with your existing username and password.

SENIORS

Seniors will have the opportunity to meet individually with their School Counselor starting in September to review all graduation information and discuss information about college and career post-secondary options.

SCHEDULE CHANGE POLICY

Students will have up to five (5) days after the start of the course to request a schedule change. A course dropped after twenty (20) days after the start of the semester will result in a "WF" (withdraw fail) for that semester of the course, will be computed into the GPA, and will appear on the transcript. A drop will not be permitted for seniors if it results in less than five classes for the year. A drop will not be permitted for underclassmen if it results in less than six classes for the year. Athletes—To be eligible for your sport you must be enrolled in & passing five (5) classes (excluding Phys Ed) the preceding quarter of the sport & passing at least five (5) classes the season of your sport.

Schedules at Fairfield High School will only be changed for the following reasons:

- Failure to meet the prerequisite course requirements.
- Obvious program error (i.e., omission of required subject, duplicate class, open period, inappropriate level or sequence placement, already earned credit for class
- Replacement of summer school course(s) successfully completed.
- Other reasons deemed appropriate by counselor, teacher, parent, and administrator team.
- Schedules will not be changed for the following reasons:
- Failure to complete the required summer assignment(s) for an AP or Dual-Credit
- Student requests a specific teacher.
- Student changed his/her mind.
- Student desires a different lunch.
- Student desires to be with friends.
- Student desires class at a certain time of day.

USEFUL MEDICAL INFORMATION FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

REQUIRED MENINGITIS IMMUNIZATION FOR 2022-2023 SENIORS

The state of Ohio Department of Health requires students entering twelfth grade to have a meningitis immunization on or after their 16th birthday. The students are also required to have a meningitis immunization in 7th grade, and this immunization does not meet the senior year requirement.

Please contact your student's primary care provider to schedule their appointment to receive their meningitis immunization. If your student does not have a primary care provider there are other options:

- Chain Pharmacies will administer the immunization-please call a pharmacy before stopping by and ask if your insurance will pay for the immunization.
- Clinics in grocery stores and pharmacies will administer some immunizations. I urge you to call before stopping by and ask if they administer the meningitis immunization. If you have insurance, make sure it will pay for the immunization.
- Students without insurance may benefit from Primary Health Solutions. Primary Health Solutions will charge on a sliding scale based on income. The phone number is (513) 454-1111.
- The Butler County Health Department will also be providing vaccine clinics (Vaccines for Children) starting on June 6. An appointment is required. There will be a small administration fee for uninsured children. Please call (513) 887-5253 to make an appointment or to ask questions.

Proof of Immunization forms may be faxed to (513) 942-3288, emailed to ramsey_d@fairfieldcityschools.com, or brought to the school from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. (no one will be available from 11 a.m.-12 p.m. due to lunch) during the summer.

The nurse must receive your immunization information by August **9**, or your student will not receive a schedule for their senior year.

STUDENTS THAT SELF-CARRY MEDICATION

Students that self-carry EpiPens and Albuterol Inhalers are required to have the section of the medication permit filled out

that states "If the student is to carry an Asthma Inhaler/EpiPen/Glucagon for self-administration, complete this section:" It is also recommended that your student have a back-up albuterol inhaler and/or EpiPen in the clinic.

The Medication at School Permit form is located on the district website: FairfieldCitySchools.com > Parents > Forms.

STUDENTS WITH DIABETES

Students that administer insulin for correction or that have insulin pumps should have orders in the clinic. Please send the packet of School Forms from Children's Hospital. The packet contains the orders we need to treat your child in case of hypoglycemia or hyperglycemia. If your child wants to self-carry glucagon, please make sure your child's healthcare provider fills out the section of the Medication at School Permit form stating, "If the student is to the Medication at School Permit form stating, "If the student is to carry an Asthma Inhaler/EpiPen/Glucagon for self-administration, please complete this section:" It is also recommended that your student have back-up medication in the clinic.
