

Student Services News

Registration for 2024-2025

As we enter into orientation and registration for the 2024-2025 school year, please take a few minutes to review the curriculum guide which is available on the LHHS website and was linked on your student's registration form. This was distributed in their 5th period class on January 24; all materials are available on the school website. Take time to review all of the LHHS programs available to your student. As a reminder: core subject classes will be determined by your student's academic performance and assessment data. Students/Parents will be given an opportunity to review placements and request a course change. Your student will meet individually with their counselor to register for elective courses during the month of February. Middle School students will received registration materials when they visited campus in January.

Junior Credit Checks

During the second semester, all third year students will meet with their assigned counselor. At that time, such topics as current credit status, graduation requirements, and post high school plans will be discussed. Juniors are encouraged to take an SAT or ACT in the spring as well as begin to research and visit potential colleges. A "Road to Graduation" meeting was held for junior parents in the Fall, so if you were unable to attend, visit https://lakehowell.scps. k12.fl.us/student-services/ to view the presentation.

Financial Aid Forms and Workshop

The current financial aid forms for this year's seniors who are seeking financial assistance and scholarships to continue their education after high school are available online at http://www. lakehowell.scps.k12.fl.us/student-services/ college-career.stml. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid is required for most colleges and universities in order to determine Financial Aid. This form uses figures from the parents' income tax. The FAFSA can be completed online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Parents of current seniors were able to complete this form beginning December 31st, 2023. Counselors discussed Financial Aid at the Road to Graduation meeting in fall and will host workshops on February 13th and March 13th at 6:00 PM. There will be another Road to Graduation Meeting in the fall of 2024 where these topics will be discussed again. Any senior with financial aid questions will be best served by contacting the school they plan to attend next year. A good site for additional information on financial aid is www.studentaid.ed.gov.

Florida State Grants & Scholarships Program

Any senior interested in Florida State Grants & Scholarships (including the Bright Futures Scholarship) MUST COMPLETE AN ONLINE APPLICATION AT www. floridastudentfinancialaid.org. Counselors visited senior history classes in December to discuss. Once the application is completed, each student will receive a username and password number by email for future access. Please keep this information in a safe place. Parents, please make certain your student has done this; it is the student's responsibility to complete the application in order to be evaluated for the scholarship. Student Services will automatically send a transcript to the state for evaluation purposes in January and June, but an application completed by the student must be on file for the transcript to be evaluated. Also, don't forget to complete community service hours as each level of the award now requires it. Submission of documented community services hours are due by May 1st, 2024.





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






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Law Club

MOCK TRIAL

Beginning in October, Lake Howell Law Club members began preparation for the 2024 Florida Mock Trial competition. Preparation consisted of analyzing the case packet, writing questions and speeches, creating characters for witnesses, and rehearsing material. This yeas case, Alex Ross v. Palm Coast University, deals with a student who is suing a university over a breach of contract due to a wrongful expulsion involving the use of artificial intelligence. Their efforts paid off at their 18th judicial circuit competition that occurred on January 27th in Brevard County, being the only undefeated team and winning every judge's ballot. In the spring, the team will compete in two global competitions: Empire's, Spring Leagues and Mock On's, Tournament of Champions.

In mid-January, Law Club members submitted legal briefs to the Florida Bar Association's Moot Court competition. Similar to an appellate court, students are tasked to write and orally argue whether a case should be appealed or not. Court in May. As they anticipate hearing back regarding their briefs, participants also start working on arguments for national moot court competitions in the spring: Toronto Virtual Regional and New Haven Regional at Yale University.

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

 Open to 10th 12th graders with a 2.5 GPA:
- **ATF 1103.** Private Pilot Ground Operations. full school year. 5 credit hours

Open to 11th – 12th graders with a 2.5 GPA:

- **ASC 2562.** Unmanned Aircraft Sys. Ops & Cross-Country Data Entry. ½ semester. 3 credit hours
 - Industry Certification through the Unmanned Safety Institute
- ASC 2564. Unmanned Aircraft Systems Security. ½ semester. 3 credit hours
 - Students will have hands-on experience with unmanned systems (drones) and certified flight simulators.
 - Students are considered dual enrollment. As such, students will have the opportunity to attain university identification cards and access the Daytona Campus.
 - Students can earn 17 college credits from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. An estimated value upwards of \$25,000.00.





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
