A Message From Our Dean

Thank you all for your continued support of LCMS! What a great start we had to the beginning of the year. Both Meet the Teacher and Open House were well attended and we thank you for showing such interested in our campus.

A few reminders from the discipline department are necessary; please review these with your children. First, cell phones and other electronic devices are of constant concern on our campus. PLEASE remind your children that all electronics MUST be turned OFF and placed in their backpacks once they enter campus unless they are told otherwise by their teacher. If their teacher should allow electronics out in class, then they must be used as directed by the teacher.

Second, please remind your children that LCMS supports the SCPS dress code. We have been thrilled with how well our students have been following this code. A few reminders: shirts must have a collar OR sleeves and undergarments must not be exposed, shorts/skirts must be mid-thigh or below and worn at the waist and undergarments must not be exposed, and clothing must not contain offensive or suggestive language (please review the policy in its entirety at www.scps.k12.fl.us to ensure your child is in compliance).


Next, please help us ensure a speedy dismissal by directing your child to the end of the car ramp when being picked up in the afternoon. Also, please encourage them to pay attention and go immediately to the car. This is a great social opportunity for our students, but we need them to be exiting quickly. Student pick up should be taking place on the car ramp ONLY. Parents should not be stopping on Sanctuary Drive asking students to walk across the parking lot to the car. This poses a great safety risk to your child. On the line of transportation, it has been passed down from the transportation department that bus passes are NOT allowed to be given to students to ride another student's bus unless it is a medical emergency. Parents, please do not encourage your children to ask for bus passes as this request will be denied for their safety. Bus drivers only have emergency information on the students ASSIGNED to their route.

From The Front Desk... Things You Should Know...

Early Dismissal of Students

When signing a student out early, you must be present (no prior phone calls), **show a picture ID and SIGN your child out.** Students **will not** be called out of class after 3:40 p.m. (2:40 p.m. on Wednesdays). Please make an effort to schedule appointments, etc. around the school day. Only those listed on the student's emergency card will be authorized to leave with your child.

CONTACT INFORMATION

If any additions or changes need to be made to your student's card, please be sure to contact the front office. Please ensure that your primary contact number is updated as this is the number that will be called in case of an emergency.

Late Arrivals

Students arriving after 9:10 am must check in at the Administrative Center, Bldg. 1, before going to their classes.

Student Pick Up and Drop Off Procedures

At Lawton Chiles, our first priority is to maintain a safe and orderly environment. Please adhere to the following procedures:

1. Students can be picked up in front of the school (Sanctuary Drive entrance). Please follow the directions of the staff on duty.
2. Car riders are to be dropped off and picked up at the Sanctuary Drive entrance car ramp ONLY, **please do not drop students off on the bus ramp as this may delay our busses, also, please do not drop students off at the 419 entrance to the school.** Signs alerting visitors to this procedure are posted at the entrance to the bus ramp.
3. Please do not park on the pick-up ramp and exit your car. If you must exit your car for any reason, please park in a parking space.
4. For those students riding a school bus – students may ride ONLY their assigned bus. Students will not be permitted to ride home with a friend unless an EMERGENCY situation arises such as a medical emergency. Emergency situations do not include sleep-overs, the desire to play with a friend, or needing to work on a project. In order to receive an EMERGENCY bus pass, EACH student is required to have a note written and signed by parents. The note will then need to be delivered to Wendy Cora, Dean for possible approval.

Visitors

All visitors must report to the front office to sign in and get a name tag before going on to any other location on campus.

Excused Absences

Students are required to bring a written note from a parent or guardian and give it to their first period teacher when they return to school after being absent.

Positive Behavior Support

As a school, we are committed to the safety, success, and comfort of our students. In order to best maintain our campus, we have teamed with the county and state of Florida to continue our Positive Behavior Support initiative. To review, PBS is a positive discipline plan for the entire school where the approach is to proactively prevent or reduce challenging behaviors and produce positive outcomes (Turnbull et al., 2002). The focus of this approach is to make problem behavior less effective and desired behavior more relevant. According to the American Heritage Dictionary, discipline is "training that is expected to produce a specific character or pattern of behaviors, especially training that produces moral or mental improvement." This is the focus of PBS. School-wide PBS works under the assumption that like reading and math, behavior can be taught. PBS seeks to create positive environments by utilizing proactive strategies such as introducing, defining, modeling, teaching, and supporting positive behavioral expectations school-wide and then reinforcing and rewarding students for these positive social behaviors (Scott et al., 2002). It is about creating positive school environments so that all children feel safe and can learn.

At LCMS, we have several programs to positively highlight our students' positive behaviors. **Student of the Month** is offered monthly to students selected by teachers. These students are invited to attend a Student of the Month luncheon in the main media center with their guidance counselor, grade level administrator, and school principal present. Students are rewarded with pencils, Student of the Month certificates, and coupons from our business partners. Additionally, students nominated for Student of the Month are invited to sit out on the cafeteria patio with three students of their choosing. The Student of the Month program resulted in 251 students being nominated for this award last year.

We also offer our **212° Student Recognition Program**. Staff members are asked to nominate students who exemplify effort in attitude, focus, perseverance, determination, friendship, etc. These students are recognized with a 212° pin and encouraged to wear it always as a reminder to students that they should "think 212." They also receive a \$2 certificate to the school store. Teachers consistently engage students in activities, discussions, etc. about what it means to put forth the "extra degree" in everything they do.

Our **PBS PAWS** allows teachers the opportunity to nominate students that demonstrate acts of respect, encouragement, preparedness, and/or responsibility on campus for a weekly reward. Students' names are written on a PAW and the PAWS are displayed in the cafeteria for all to see. PAWS are drawn weekly and winners from each grade level are announced. Even the nominating teacher gets a prize!

Safety And Security Are Top Priorities

In order to ensure that all students are properly supervised while on school property, parents should be aware of the school hours and school supervision policy. The regular attendance hours are 9:20 a.m. to 3:55 p.m. with early release on Wednesday. Any person, including a student, who comes onto the campus at times other than those stated above, does so at his or her own risk. Parents are requested to help ensure everyone's safety by not allowing students to come onto school property when there is no supervision. Students are NOT allowed on campus before 8:45 without prior permission from a faculty or staff member. Students are required to have a pass from the faculty or staff member that grants them this permission - it is the responsibility of the student to get the pass. Students WILL NOT be allowed to enter campus WITHOUT a pass. The Media Center is open at 8:30 for students needing to work on homework, projects or to take an AR test - students are not required to have a pass to go to the media center.

GIFTED - Mrs. Krista Darling

Is your child the absent-minded professor? This year, all gifted students will be participating in Science Fair. While sixth and seventh grade students are working on projects for the classroom, eighth graders will compete at the school and district level. A long-term project such as a Science project can be extremely frustrating for students and parents alike when the child has poor time management skills. This fall and winter, help your child pay special attention to intermediate due dates for long-term projects and help them stay on track. Posting a copy of the timeline of due dates on the refrigerator or above the desk and checking off each section as completed is a wonderful way to practice staying on target with task completion.

LANGUAGE ARTS - Mrs. Melissa Laudani

Our 8th graders spent the first part of this year focused on memoirs. They first read and highlighted one by Cynthia Rylant, "When I was Young in the Mountains" and then had to write their own version. They were encouraged to use their five senses to come up with details for their personal memoirs. The next memoir was from "I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings" by Maya Angelou. Ms. Angelou tells how she overcame a difficult time. These two pieces also lead to discussions of author's purpose, setting, author's perspective and main idea. All three grade levels are encouraged to participate in the Literature portion of the PTSA Reflections Contest. Please visit the LCMS website for more information.

MATHEMATICS - Mrs. Donna Hunziker

Join the Team Chiles Math Club every Wednesday during homeroom. Our Panther mathletes will be problem solving and producing engineering projects in order to get ready for our math competition in the spring. All students are welcome to attend. We currently meet in the cafeteria but will be forming teams soon. Students should see their math teacher for more information.

Our 6th grade math students are working cooperatively when problem solving. Using a Rally-Coach cooperative learning structure, students orally explain their thinking aloud to their team mates as they write the solution. Their partner either coaches them when they have difficulty or asks questions for clarification. This promotes mathematical communication, listening and social skills, and mastery of concepts. As you help your child with homework, ask your child to use the rally coach structure they use in the classroom.

Having trouble in Algebra? Hagerty HS Honors math students are volunteering their services to help you succeed. Extra help is available on Monday and Friday afternoons from 4:00-4:45pm in room 2-214. See your Algebra teacher to sign up.

SCIENCE - Mrs. Angela Holladay

The science department is off to a great start with our student scientists working on a variety of projects and activities within our classes. Sixth graders are going into the Geologic Time unit where they will learn about the history of the Earth. This includes a study of fossils

and students learning how to mold and cast fossil forms by making their own fossil. Seventh grade is studying cells and have created candy models of plant and animal cells with different types of candy to represent the cell parts. Eighth grade is working on Motion, Energy, and Energy Transformations. Students completed the Spark Timer Lab where they calculated the speed of toy cars. All 6th, 7th, and 8th grade advanced/gifted science students are continuing to work on their science fair projects. The projects are progressing well. Students have started their experiments at home and continue to collect data. We are looking forward to seeing many excellent projects on display at our school science fair. The LCMS Science fair is scheduled for Thursday, January 12th at 6:30 pm.

SOCIAL STUDIES - Mrs. Laura Estes

As the midpoint of the first quarter passes, our students have adjusted wonderfully to the routines and coursework of a new year. All grade levels have maintained the focus on building students' academic vocabulary and developing each student's ability to work and learn in a cooperative learning environment. In 8th grade, students examined how the first Americans adapted to their environments. Students then acted as explorers and "claimed new lands" in the classroom. This simulation helped students identify why Europeans explored and established settlements in the Americas. Students then focused their attention on the English colonies in North America. They considered the similarities and differences among these colonies. Advanced classes participated in a colonial fair where they created a booth for their colony and tried to persuade other students to settle there.

The 7th Grade Team has finished reviewing the Foundations of Geography and completed a unit on Florida. They applied the five themes of Geography to a Florida city and created a poster project. Our next unit for this nine week quarter will be studying Europe and Russia. This unit continues into the next nine weeks grading period as well. Students will work on various Physical and Political maps of Europe and Russia. They will also act out a Mini Drama about the history of Europe. Shortly the students will begin working on an individual "Facebook" Project.

Sixth grade Geography students have just completed learning the Five Themes of Geography and are creating their Island Advertising projects. The Island projects allow the students to use their imagination while incorporating the first five chapters of their Geography textbook. It is a culmination of their first 9 weeks of lessons in one end of term project. They are very excited and motivated to use their lessons and imaginations!

The Reading Department continues to improve its courses for students scoring levels 3, 2, or 1 in the FCAT. We welcome our newest teacher, Mrs. Merna Cronin. Mrs. Cronin teaches the sixth grade comprehension classes; she was our full time substitute in sixth grade last year. We also have a new course in our double blocked classes called Read to Achieve. Our double blocked classes in Corrective Reading focus on Decoding the first period and Comprehension the second period. Read to Achieve focuses on decoding content area articles and study skills for the content areas during the first period and comprehension the second period. Placement in our comprehension classes will be based on FAIR testing in September and October so there may have been some student schedule changes to help the students read at a level more appropriate for them.

If there is one thing our reading teachers recommend to **all students** is to make time every night for reading. Twenty minutes is okay. Thirty minutes is better. It's just like physical exercise—the more you practice the more skilled you become! Happy Reading, Panthers!!!
