

It is hard to believe we are in the final quarter of the 2017-2018 school year. As we enter the fourth quarter, it is important that students remain focused on school. Whether it is school grades, attendance, discipline or testing, finishing strong in the last nine weeks is crucial for a successful year.

School testing plays a major role in the life of a high school student during the fourth quarter. We will test on the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) Writing and Reading (9th and 10th grade), Algebra One End of Course Exam (Algebra 1 students), Geometry End of Course Exam (Geometry and Geometry Honors students), Biology End of Course Exam (Biology and Biology Honors students), and the U.S. History End of Course Exam (U.S. History and U.S. History Honors students). College bound juniors and seniors will be taking the ACT and/or SAT test(s). As well, all students will be taking

final exams for each of their classes.

One of the questions we hear often from parents is about how they can help prepare their child for one or more of these tests. Below are some ways parents can help their child, who may have concerns or are nervous about taking tests.

Optimize brain power.

Teachers say the students who struggle the most on testing days are the ones who didn't have enough sleep or a good breakfast the day of the test. Encourage your child to get to bed early and eat a good breakfast in the morning. If your son/daughter isn't feeling well on the test day, it's better to keep him/her home and let him/her make up the test later rather than risk poor performance due to illness.

Know what to expect.

You should learn...

- What is the test and what will it measure?
- What's the format? (multiple choice, essay, short answer, etc.)
- Are there test-prep tutoring opportunities available at school prior to the event?
- How is it scored? Will students be penalized for incorrect answers or should they guess when stumped on a question?

Relax and remain positive.

The best test-takers are confident, committed, and at ease. Even if you, as the parent, are nervous about your child's performance, be wary of transferring that concern to your child. You never know, some kids actually enjoy tests! If your child is likely to get nervous, practice a few relaxation techniques, such as counting from one to ten or taking deep breaths, which can help him/her relieve tension during the test.

Discuss the experience.

Talk to your child about how the test went, what went well and what didn't. Think of it as a mini-debriefing or brainstorming session. You can talk about test-taking strategies after the fact as easily as beforehand and these discussions may improve performance on future tests.

Students will be receiving a "Class Request Verification" form in May. This form will allow them an opportunity to see their class choices one more time and make any changes. The reasons for schedule changes in August are very limited. We will change a class if a student is placed in the wrong level of instruction or if the student does not have the prerequisite.

Testing season is upon us. There is a very good chance that your son or daughter will be required to take an End of Course (EOC) exam- given for Algebra 1, Geometry, United States History and/or Biology. If your son or daughter is in 9th or 10th grade, they will be required to take the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) in Writing and Reading.

Eleventh and 12th grade students who have not yet passed the FSA will be retaking this test. In addition, students enrolled in an Advanced Placement class will be taking AP tests in May.

Students and teachers have been preparing diligently for these tests. Please encourage your son or daughter to get a good night's sleep the evening before and come to school fueled and ready to "show what they know".

FINISH THE YEAR STRONG- We have nine weeks of school left. Parents and students are reminded to check and monitor grades on FOCUS at least a couple of times a week. If a parent or student is not sure of log-in, please contact the guidance office. Students and Parents should communicate with the student's teacher and guidance counselor if there are concerns.

Science Olympiad



Lemon Bay's Science National Honor Society competed again this year in the annual Science Olympiad regional competition. Science Olympiad is a science competition that allows teams to compete in up to 23 events, all centered around the ever-changing nature of genetics, earth science, chemistry, anatomy, physics, geology, mechanical engineering and technology. Each event is unique, whether it is identifying a live snake in the Herpetology event or testing how many kilograms of sand the self-built towers can hold in the Towers event: Science Olympiad offers a myriad of events for each pair of students. On January 20th, Lemon Bay competed in the regional Science Olympiad competition at Florida Southwestern College. The team consisted of 13 students who competed in 16 events and contended against other teams across south Florida.
