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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Hello Hurricanes,

Spring Break is now behind us; time to buckle down and stay focused in the 4th Quarter and finish the year strong. Even though the school year is nearing the end, we need to remind ourselves that we still have high expectations and goals to achieve for the remainder of the year.



State Testing began at Manatee Middle School in early March. On March 1st, our students completed the Florida State Assessment

(FSA) in Writing. Both 6th and 7th graders completed a paper-based writing based on a specific prompt, while 8th graders completed a computer-based writing also on a specific prompt. The writing scores are combined with the reading portion of the FSA and will be reported to you at the beginning of next school year if all goes well with the state scoring process. FSA Reading and Math tests begin in April and your child will spend nearly one week testing these subjects during that time. In May, our 7th graders take the Civics End of Course (EOC) exam, our Algebra students take the Algebra EOC and our 8th graders take the Science FCAT. More information is included in this newsletter on the specific dates from Dr. Merhar, our Assistant Principal of Curriculum and Instruction.

Beyond testing, there is so much to share. First, Manatee Middle School is now ranked as a "B" school in the eyes of the state of Florida. We couldn't have done this without the focus and determination of our students and teachers. Congrats to our Hurricane family!

In addition, we are excited to share the news about our Intermediate/Advanced Orchestra which earned all Superiors at their recent performance. Let's not forget to honor Shannen Teresias for her 2nd place win in the district –wide Laws of Life Essay Contest. We are so proud of her! Furthermore, our Boys Soccer Team won the district championship and has now clinched the championship 5 times in 6 years. Congratulations to the team and the coaches!

To close, I cannot remind you enough how important it is to be involved in your child's education. I often comment to everyone how supportive our parents and families are to our school. If you haven't been to an event this school year, please try to make it out to the March 31st "FSA Parent Pep Rally" to show your support and celebrate our growth as a school and a community. LANGUAGE ARTS DEPARTMENT

Greetings from the Language Arts Department! There are so many fantastic things taking place at Manatee to share regarding our amazing language arts students and staff. On March 1st, our students tackled the Florida State Assessment (FSA) for writing. Our teachers and students worked tirelessly to prepare for this assessment and we know that they did their absolute best! Can't wait to see scores this summer!

Other exciting news regarding language arts is enrichment Saturday the program established ACE provide students with to extra practice to sharpen their comprehension skills. Remember, ask your child what they are currently reading in language arts class, you might be surprised where the conversation takes you!

SOCIAL STUDIES DEPARTMENT

Sixth graders continue to investigate ancient civilizations and make connections between the past and present. Students have investigated Ancient Greece and Ancient Rome and will focus on the Islamic world, early African civilizations, and the early Americas in the 4th quarter. Students access Discovery Education using iPads and view video segments to respond to thought-provoking questions prepared by teachers. During the unit on ancient Greece, students created a time line of Alexander the Great's major achievements. During the study of early African civilizations, students will create propaganda posters to reflect current views on protecting elephants. Students are enthusiastic, hard-working, persistent learners.

Seventh graders continue to explore the foundation of American civics. Student activities allow students to understand and appreciate the important role of civics in their lives on a daily basis. In the 4th quarter the focus will be on the U.S. economic system, goods and services, personal finance, and economic challenges before the Great Depression and in the present. Students will also examine the world economy. Preparing students for the end-of-course exam for Civics will be a focus throughout the last quarter of the year.

Eighth graders learned about the beginnings of United States history by examining events from the early inhabitants of the Americas. During the 4th quarter, students will study events through the period of reconstruction following the Civil War. A major focus of study is on the writing process in which students write a formal research paper. A research paper analyzes a perspective or argues a point. The finished research paper should present a student's own thinking backed up by others' ideas and information. Several students will participate in the History Fair. The topic this year is "Exploration, Encounter, Exchange in History". Students will learn about the U.S. Civil War and participate in activities that bring this part of U.S. history alive.

MATH DEPARTMENT

Manatee Middle's Saturday ACE Program continues on April 2nd and 9th as your student's Math teachers create lessons to help them better understand concepts and how they relate to everyday life! Ask your student to bring home a permission slip that allows them to get transportation to and from home as well as a snack and great material on the weekends as well that will prepare them for the FSA testing that begins in mid-April. As always, please contact teachers with any questions that you might have; we love speaking with and interacting with parents!





SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

This year 6th graders went on the SWAMP field trip and went through knee high water exploring the everglades with their courageous teachers! In seventh grade science there have been many hands on activities while learning genetics. Upcoming will be dissections to learn about the human body. Eighth graders this year built their very own rocket using cardstock to deepen their knowledge of force and motion. Upcoming events for the Science Department are a visit from the Conservancy of Southwest Florida near the end of March.
