There are many conversations we seem to be having right now, so I hope to share what will be most impactful to our families in this edition of our newsletter. These last weeks have brought a lot of anxious times to our public schools around safety and security. This newsletter will share what we know and are doing and our dedicated focus to keeping your children safe.

It is also a time of year that we are looking to the future, and the choices your student makes now regarding courses have great impacts on their path to graduation. We are currently meeting with all students about those choices to ensure everyone makes the best decisions for next year. It is important for you to realize that student choices <u>now</u> determine our schedule for next school year. Once those choices are made and classes assigned, it is difficult to change. Please be sure you are actively involved in this process and working with your child's counselor so you know that graduation requirements, college and career paths, and personal goals are being met.

It is NEVER too early to prepare for success. If your student has not already linked their PSAT account to their Kahn Academy account, please see your guidance counselor as soon as possible for instructions. This will assist your student in being successful on their SAT assessment as well as great support on their classes. In addition to SATPractice.org, Kahn Academy also provides excellent preparation for both the ACT and SAT. Remember, we also offer a large amount of courses which lead to an industry certification which will prepare your student for postsecondary readiness.

In closing, attendance and tardies should never be the reason a student isn't promoted or doesn't graduate. There is a Failure Due To Attendance Appeal process that will be managed by a committee and all appeals will require legitimate circumstances for approval. School Safety and Security

Brevard County Sheriff Wayne Ivey and Superintendent, Dr. Desmond Blackburn, outlined a four-pronged strategy to better protect our students and staff. You're sure to hear more about it in the days to come as the school board considers some of its measures.

The four parts of BPS' strategy are:

- **1. An education and awareness campaign.** This will include teaching students and staff exactly what to do in case of an active-shooter.
- 2. Continued "hardening" of our schools. BPS has already taken steps such as installing security fencing to create a "single point of access" at each school that can be monitored by video and locked down with remote controls.
- **3. More resource officers at schools.** Consistent with the governor's plan, we want all elementary schools to have full-time resource officers as we do at our secondary schools.
- 4. A school marshal program. Sheriff Ivey has proposed to the school board a Sheriff-Trained Onsite Marshal Program. This program would vet and select school-based volunteers. Those volunteers would undergo 132 hours of intensive training and be allowed to carry concealed firearms on campuses. Former military and police personnel would be ideal candidates, the sheriff said.

School board members will now solicit feedback, discuss among themselves, and determine if they will formally request the marshal program from the Sherriff. *Please be aware of these community input opportunities* so your voice can be heard.

Student-led activities such as vigils or assemblies to memorialize the Parkland shooting or to call for change is supported by Brevard Public Schools. BPS is OK with our young citizens making their voices heard – as long as it is done peacefully and in collaboration with school leaders.

We are in continual conversation on campus with our staff and local law enforcement and will make every effort to keep our families informed. We are working with student government and student leaders to support our students in their interests to voice their feelings and opinions.

Seniors are not exempt from exams due to an A in first semester.

FSA and SAT Testing

- Our 11th and 12th graders who have not passed the FSA ELA test or received a concordant score for graduation, will take the Reading Retake Test on March 20 and 21. This is a two-day test.
- Students who have not passed the Algebra EOC will take the Algebra Retake test on March 22 and 23. This is also a twoday test.
- Juniors who missed the SAT on March 7 will be given the opportunity to take it on April 10 at school.
- Seniors who still have not met the Reading requirement for graduation will be able to register/ pay for the April 10 SAT at RHS.
- Our 9th and 10th graders will take the Reading Test on April 16 and 17 or April 19 and 20. This is a two-day test.
- Our U. S. History EOC will be given April 23 and 24.
- Students in Biology or Integrated Science III will take the Biology EOC on April 26 or 27.
- Students in Geometry or Algebra will take their EOC April 30 and May 1 or May 3 and 4. These EOC's are two-day tests.

As you can tell, we have a very busy few weeks. It is critical for students to be at school on their assigned testing dates.


