Cadet 2nd Lieutenant Kaia Nelson

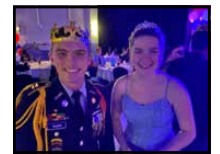
Our Bulldog Battalion came back strong after Winter Break. We started our third quarter with a lot of exciting events for all the Bulldog Cadets. The Battalion Annual Walk-A-Thon took place on January 26th. Cadets participated by walking around the track at school in order to raise money for the battalion. Sponsors supported the cadets by donating a certain amount of money per lap walked and funds raised go towards the battalion events held throughout the year. The Bulldog Rifle Team had their last meet of the 2023-2024 school year, with Jake Yeager taking 3rd Place in the county. Our Bulldog Drill Team has begun and has had several meets so far. The Bulldog Color Guard has two more events, the Awards Ceremony and graduation.

Battalion events in January and February included the JPA Inspection (JROTC Program of Accreditation), Cadet Challenge, and Military Ball. In February the Bulldog Battalion had its annual inspection, the JPA Inspection. We received a 97% overall evaluation for our Battalion, keeping our Honor Unit of Distinction. During our JPA there are two presentations, the Annual Service Learning, and the Continuous Improvement Plan. Each individual company is graded based on LET (Leadership Education Training) knowledge about American History, marching skills, and more.

Our annual Military Ball took place on February 24th. The Bulldog Battalion enjoyed an evening of dancing, dinner and games. Hayden Wilding was crowned King of the Ball and Kaia Nelson was crowned Queen of the Ball. Sarasota High attended the Military Ball together with Sarasota Military Academy, Riverview High, Desoto High and Booker High.

With third quarter behind us, the Bulldog Battalion is looking forward to the upcoming Awards Ceremony, where cadets receive medals for their outstanding performance in JROTC during the past year. We will also conduct our annual drill competition and the first ever Bulldog Battle. There is a lot to look forward to in JROTC as we finish the last quarter of this school year.

Sarasota High's very own Sailor Speech and Debate team has qualified for the national championship tournaments for the twenty-third year in a row. This season they competed in league and district competitions from September through January, placing in the top three in multiple events each time. The first championship tournament, which leads directly to the National Speech and Debate Association National Championship, was held at Suncoast Polytechnical High School in February. Junior Devin Escobedo placed first in Congressional Debate and qualified to represent the Florida Sunshine District in June in Des Moines, Iowa. NSDA first alternate was senior Anika Sackerlotzky in Extemporaneous Speaking. On February 23 – 24, the team competed at the FGCCFL Grand Finals tournament at Northeast High School. Devin Escobedo and Drew Light each qualified in Congressional Debate and will represent the district and Tampa-St. Petersburg Diocese at the NCFL Grand National Championship in Chicago, Illinois over Memorial Day weekend. NCFL first alternate in Extemporaneous Speaking was Andrew Springer.



Throughout the season the team has sold lollipops and held fund raisers at Publix to assist with the anticipated national tournament costs. In addition to assisting with researching, writing, and rehearsing for these national championship tournaments, the entire team is seeking donations to help our qualifiers pay for registration fees, hotels, and flights. 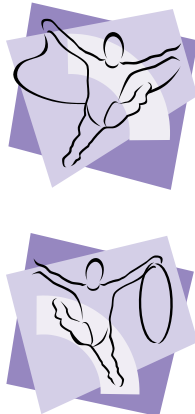

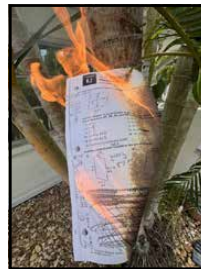

#### Wind Ensemble—Straight Superiors

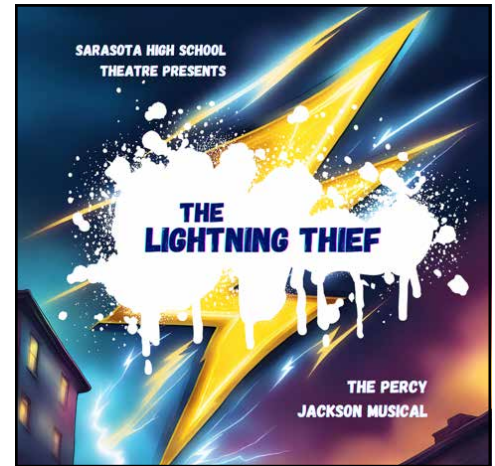

## SAILORS WELCOME NEW HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

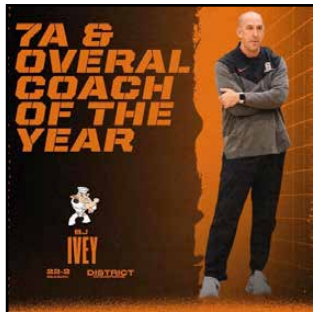
Sarasota High School is excited to welcome Amp Campbell as the next head football coach. "Coach Campbell is a local legend who has enjoyed success and overcome adversity at the highest levels, said Sarasota High Athletic Director BJ Ivey. We are excited for the transformational leadership he will provide to the Sailor football program."

Coach Campbell comes to Sarasota High from Riverview where he served as the Defensive Backs Coach since 2022. Prior to coaching at Riverview, Campbell served as a college football coach since 2002 in many capacities including Assistant Coach, Special Teams Coordinator, Passing Game Coordinator, and Defensive Backs Coach. Campbell was a scholarship athlete at Michigan State University where he played Defensive Back under then head coach Nick Saban. Campbell's college career is an inspirational story of overcoming adversity from what was thought to be a career-ending neck injury in 1998, yet he remarkably returned to the field the following season earning the role of co-captain, President's Award Recipient (1999), First-Team All-Big Ten (1999), and Third-Team All-American from the Associated Press (1999). Campbell went on to play in the National Football League with the New Orleans Saints in 2000. Coach Campbell has local roots, as a student athlete at Riverview High School.

Coach Campbell said, "I am grateful and excited to step into the role of head football coach for the Sailors. Fulfilling a lifelong dream to return home, my mission is to give back to the community and nurture the growth of these talented student-athletes."
