

Health Care District of Palm Beach County

From the desk of your Health Care District school nurse:

As the school year comes to an end, it will be necessary for you to pick up your child's medication from the clinic.

You may pick up any extra medication between now and Friday, June 2, Mondays through Fridays from 7:00 to 3:00. Any medication not picked up after that day will be disposed of properly.

Please remember that if you need to bring medicine for the 2017-2018 school year, the school district requires that a 'physician authorization of medication/treatment for a student at school' form be filled out and signed by the child's physician. In addition, a photograph of the student must be kept in the clinic file.

The American Academy of Dermatology has named May as 'National Skin Cancer Awareness Month.' More than 10,000 Americans will die from skin cancer this year. Skin cancer is preventable and, if detected early, almost 100 percent curable. Skin cancers can appear on any area of the skin, but they often occur where there is a mole.

Become familiar with your moles and note any changes. Watch for asymmetry (one half does not match the other); border irregularity (the mole's edges are ragged, notched, or blurred); color not uniform (different shades of tan, brown, or black; patches of red, white, or blue); and diameter (wider than six millimeters, or growing larger).

Practice frequent self-examination of your skin and moles, and consult a dermatologist immediately if you see any of your moles exhibit any of these signs.

Guard against skin cancer: guidelines to follow:

- avoid the sun between 10:00 and 4:00, when its rays are strongest;
- wear clothing that covers as much of the skin as possible;
- if you're outside in the sun, use sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher on exposed skin:
- · wear sunglasses to protect your eyes and the sensitive skin around them;
- avoid using sunlamps and tanning salons.

Remember that early detection and treatment are the best ways to avoid the suffering and death caused by advanced skin cancers!


