What began here in the 1975/76 school year has blossomed into a Nationally Recognized School of Excellence for its commitment to academics, the arts, and athletics. It is important to remember to **maintain good attendance to school**. Consider this important information as part of the *#EverbodyEveryday* campaign:

- Your children can suffer academically if they miss **10 percent of the school year** or about 18 days. That can be just **one day every two weeks**, and that can happen before you know it.
- Some absences are unavoidable. We understand that children will get sick and need to stay home occasionally. The important thing is to **get your children to school as often as possible**.
- **Sporadic absences**, not just those on consecutive days of school, matter. Before you know it –just one or two days a month can add up to nearly 10 percent of the school year.
- If too many absences occur, it is still a problem whether they are excused or unexcused because they represent too much lost learning time in the classroom.
- **Driver's license** will be revoked if a student has **15 unexcused absences** (excluding out-of-school suspension) in a period of **90 calendar days**.
- Each evening, **phone messages are sent home indicating that your student has missed one or more class periods**. Reach out to **Dr. Rentz** for ideas on improving your student's attendance.
- Track your student's attendance and grades in their classes by using Parent Portal. Contact Ms. Beatty at extension 37814 or rkbeatty@volusia.k12.fl.us to establish your account.

If you have not done so already, please return your student's **Emergency Information Form**. This form was distributed during your student's **second period class** and is to be completed and returned each school year. Please note that **only those individuals listed on the emergency card will be allowed to sign a student out of school**. Weekly messages will go home from the school as phone, email and text messages. If you are not receiving those messages, contact Ms. Young, our school's registrar to update.

Welcome new and returning Hawks! The Guidance Department is excited to be back, and we are looking forward to starting the 2023-2024 school year. We have had some staff changes so your student's Counselor may have changed. The new counseling assignments can be seen if you use the QR Code or go to our counseling website (https://sprucecreekcounseling.weebly.com/).

All students have the same lunch period again this year, which allows ALL teachers to be available for Office Hours in their classrooms at the beginning of this extended student lunch. Students may use this time to get extra help/tutoring, make up a test, etc. Also, students may see their

Counselor without an appointment before school or during student office hours/ lunch. All other needs can be addressed by emailing the Counselor directly, filling out a "Request to See Counselor" form on our Weebly site (https://sprucecreekcounseling.weebly.com/) or by using the QR code found around campus and pasted in this update. Counselors will then call for students as quickly as possible. In some cases, such as schedule change requests, students will not even have to miss instructional time and we will send the changed schedule to them in their class.

Beginning in September, and through the month of October, Counselors will meet with Seniors to go over graduation requirements and to assist with their plans after graduation. Counselors will also register ALL Seniors for Florida Bright Futures Scholarships. Please ask your Senior about their visit.
