# Principal's Message


Greetings Parents, Students, and Community Stakeholders,



#### McKinney-Vento Program (MVP) - Homelessness

The McKinney-Vento Program (MVP), the District's Homeless Education Program provides assistance to homeless children and youth, including unaccompanied homeless youth throughout the District in compliance with the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act. The McKinney-Vento Act protects the educational rights of children and youth experiencing homelessness and seeks to remove barriers often experienced by students experiencing homelessness in enrolling, attending, and succeeding in school.

#### Who is Eligible for Services?

If, due to a loss of housing, you must live in a shelter, motel, vehicle, or campground, on the street, in abandoned buildings, or doubled-up with relatives or friends, then you are eligible to receive services provided under the McKinney-Vento Act. Unaccompanied youth experiencing homelessness are also eligible for services under the McKinney-Vento Act. Our school's contact person is Ms. Cadet. #### Author Randi Pink to Visit 10th Grade Reading Classes

For the second year in a row, author Randi Pink will be visiting Atlantic Community High School to discuss her historical novel Angel of Greenwood. Last year, students were so engaged in reading during class and were blown away hearing Ms. Pink speak, that reading teacher Alicia Ostendorf begged to have her come back to our school again.

Angel of Greenwood is a work of historical fiction that accurately depicts the success of Greenwood, Oklahoma, which was commonly known as "Black Wall Street," and the subsequent racially motivated bombings. Ms. Ostendorf has created a full instructional unit based on the book, which hits all required Florida standards. The unit culminates with a beautiful reading journal in which the students get to create a new cover based their interpretation of the novel's theme. This year, the novel will also be presented in a second

reading teacher's class, expanding the number of students that will be impacted by the author's visit.

Ms. Ostendorf has already had a great response reading the novel this year, with students emailing her to take the book home to read ahead, and begging to continue reading even though class time has ended. The students cannot put this book down! Author visits have been shown to be amazingly impactful for students, but seeing the students excited about reading is the best feeling a reading teacher can have.

Meet Atlantic's newest student authors!

Seniors Olivia Gonzalez and Nedjie Aurelien are Atlantic's newest published authors! Author/ publisher Stephen Kozan visited Atlantic High School last year and offered a writing contest to a group of students. Olivia won the contest and went on to write and publish a complete YA novel. Her book, "Spiraling Out of Control is a gripping narrative that plunges readers into an unexpected journey throughout space and history. Told in a blend of poetry and prose, two individuals have the weight of the world on their shoulders. They find themselves thrown together in a place that belongs to neither of them, befriended by a group where no one is what they seem" (https://kidswritestories.net/book/spiraling-out-of-control/).

Senior Nedjie Aurelien was offered the opportunity to publish her book this October, and has been one of the fastest students to be published by Mr. Kozan. Her book is a compilation of poems

exploring the pain and angst of being a teenager who has experienced loss but still manages to find hope. The novel is currently in production and will be released in less than a month. Nedjie hopes that her book is a "champion of diversity for young black women that may see themselves within the literature field," which is a task she manages beautifully (https://kidswritestories.net/book/spiraling-out-of-control/).

Both students will participate in a book launch at Delray Beach Public Library on April 6 at 1p.m. The event will be open to the public, and will feature a Q&A with both authors, a reading from both authors, and the chance to get copies of their books signed! The following week, both students will participate as panelists in the BAM! Festival of Books, Art, & Music at the Mandel Library, April 13 10a.m.-3p.m. Both events are free and open to the public.




