PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Bayside Families,

I have spoken with many of you and/or your students over the past two weeks regarding school safety and security after the tragic events at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School. Our thoughts and prayers are with the students, families, school personnel and first responders in Broward County.

I met with all faculty and staff to review our safety and security plan and various safety procedures. As you know, we have made several adjustments to help secure our campus. All classroom doors are now locked at all times. We have prohibited parking, pick up and drop off in the Theater Parking lot. This ensures that those gates will remain closed and locked before, during and after school, limiting access to our campus while students are present. Bayside has also received some of our District Security Upgrades, including front office security doors and video camera. District Security is already gathering information regarding additional security concerns we have for phase II of the school security upgrades.

We are working with the Palm Bay Police department, who will participate in our second school lockdown drill of the school year. We will be scheduling this drill within the next couple of weeks and look forward to any feedback the PBPD can offer us. We will communicate with you before and after the drill via email and/or text. We plan to have at least one other lockdown drill prior to the end of the school year.

Parents, I welcome any concerns or suggestions regarding student safety. Please call or email me, set up a time we can meet, or you can send me a letter, however you prefer to communicate. This is my first year as Bayside's Principal and I take the safety and security of my campus, my students, faculty and staff, very seriously, as my number one priority.

In closing, please know that I am so proud to be part of this community. Your Bayside Students have been compassionate, thoughtful, mindful and respectful. Many are concerned about the security of the school and have gone through appropriate channels to voice their concerns by setting up meetings with me or the School Resource Officer, or both. Many of our students want to make a difference, and they too are going through appropriate channels to begin clubs and organize their fellow classmates while always respecting the instructional integrity of our school.

BAYSIDE HIGH SCHOOL NAVAL JROTC TEAM TO COMPETE IN NATIONAL ACADEMIC BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP IN WASHINGTON, DC

Palm Bay, FL – April 9th, 2018 -- After advancing through two phases of online competition, the Bayside High School NJROTC Academic Team composed of Nathan Johnstone, Thomas Kang, Jordan Wiggins, and Isabella DuFrane will compete in person at the Championship event in Washington, DC. **The 2018 U.S. Navy JROTC Academic Bowl Championship** will be held on the campus of The Catholic University of America, June 22-26, 2018. The event is conducted by College Options Foundation.

Bayside's JROTC team earned top scores out of more than 170 U.S. Navy JROTC teams that competed from around the world. The team is one of only eight U.S. Navy JROTC Academic Bowl teams in the nation to advance to the finals. During the two fast-paced preliminary rounds, students were tested on their knowledge of JROTC curriculum, English, Math and Science. One of the main goals of the JROTC Academic Bowl is to prepare students for state exit/graduation exams as well as college entrance exams, such as the SAT and ACT.

The winner of the U.S. Navy JROTC Academic Championship will compete against the winners of the U.S. Army, Marine Corps, and Air Force JROTC Academic Bowls in the **JROTC Joint Service Academic Bowl Championship**.

The JROTC Leadership & Academic Bowl (JLAB) is a nationally recognized academic competition created exclusively for JROTC students. By participating, cadets learn the values of citizenship, academic competition, and college opportunity. The competition creates tremendous opportunities for JROTC cadets by allowing them to demonstrate leadership and academic abilities.

College Options Foundation is a non-profit organization dedicated to enriching the academic development of high school students and assisting them in their preparation for higher education. PROM

Prom will begin promptly at 8:00 p.m., at the Eau Gallie Civic Center, located at 1551 Highland Avenue, Melbourne, FL, 32935. Students must be prepared with their tickets and identification to present at the door. All students will be searched prior to entering the facility. If you are bringing a date that who does not attend this school, your date **MUST** show photo ID to gain entry. Date approvals were done prior to ticket purchase. If you lose your ticket(s), you MUST show photo ID or you will not be allowed into the dance. During prom we ask that students enjoy themselves and conduct themselves in a manner fitting this elegant event. Semi-formal attire is required (no jeans or sneakers). If you decide to leave the prom prior to 11:00 p.m. you will NOT BE ALLOWED RE-ENTRY. Prom will end promptly at 11:00 p.m. If you need to arrange transportation, please ask your parents to be there to pick you up promptly at 11:00 p.m. We remind all students to act responsibly and drive safely as they proceed home.

GRADUATION REHEARSAL

Graduation Rehearsal will be **May 17, starting at 8:30 a.m,. in the Bayside cafeteria for breakfast**. Please park in front of the gym and walk down the front of the school to the cafeteria doors - you will not be allowed on the main part of the campus. Bring nothing with you unless you are returning textbooks or dual enrollment books. After breakfast, students must be in the gym by 9:15. **ALL SENIORS are required to participate in graduation rehearsal to participate in the graduation ceremony**. During the rehearsal, we will form our graduation lines and practice the processional to the football field. We will be outside for the second half of rehearsal so consider wearing sun screen, hats and/or sunglasses. Once the rehearsal has concluded, you will proceed back to the gym to get your GRADUATION TICKETS. **YOU MUST BRING PHOTO ID TO PICK UP YOUR TICKETS. Each senior will receive a total of 8 tickets: 2 tickets for track seating and 6 tickets for general admission seating in the stands**. Any student with a financial obligation must settle the obligation before tickets will be distributed. You can check with any of your teachers to see if you currently have a financial obligation.

BRIGHT FUTURES

Any student applying for the Bright Futures Scholarship must have their application completed and community service hours submitted to guidance by May 17, 2018. Final transcripts will be submitted to the Department of Education by the district office in mid to late July.

SENIOR EXAMS

Senior Exams will be given during your regular 47 minute class period, therefore there is no altered bell schedule. Exam days are regular school days and we encourage students to stay in school for the entire day. If you are meeting the criteria for being exempt from your exam, your teacher will notify you in advance. Here is your exam schedule:

May 15	Periods 3 & 4

Please remember to return textbooks to your instructors on exam day, if applicable.

NOTE: May 15 is the FINAL day to complete all coursework in all classes to be able to participate in graduation.

GRADUATION NIGHT

The ceremony will be held in the BHS Football Stadium starting promptly at 7:00 p.m. Gates will open at 6:00 for families to enter. **Seniors will need to report for check in at 5:30 p.m**. Please park in the parking lot in front of the cafeteria and walk down the front of the school to the gym lobby doors. Mrs. Bombriant and Ms. Setterbo will be checking seniors in through the hallway just south of the main parking lot cafeteria doors. Please do not bring purses, cell phones or any other items with you to the gym, there will be NO secure location to store items. Leave all personal items in your car and arrange to meet your family outside of the gym directly after graduation. Once you have been checked in, you will proceed into the gymnasium. Any student who received an honor cord at Senior Award Night or from a Bayside student organization should make sure to wear them. Don't forget your cords - no extra cords will be available!

Graduation is a dignified ceremony, meaning each graduate has the right to be valued and receive the attention they deserve. Therefore, inappropriate behavior from graduates is not acceptable. You deserve your moment to shine, but so do the students who come before and after you on the stage.



GRADUATION DRESS CODE

Dress Code for graduation is as follows:

<u>Gentlemen</u>

- Slacks, dress shirts & ties
- Dress shoes (sneakers are not permitted)

<u>Ladies</u>

- Dresses or Dress Pants and a Blouse
- Flat Shoes are recommended, however heels are acceptable. Sandals with a back strap are also recommended

Remember, you will be standing for long periods of time, walking in grass and walking up and down stairs. It is important to wear comfortable/stable shoes. If anyone needs assistance with clothing, please see your school counselor and he/she will do their best to assist you.

Students MUST return back to the gym at the end of the commencement ceremony to collect their diploma.
