FINAL REMINDER- ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

Good attendance also creates a habit that can carry over into work later. Consider these tips. Set expectations. Being out for even a day or two a month means losing valuable learning time. Tell your student that the only acceptable excuses are illness, family emergencies, or pre-approved college visits. Discuss Results. Point out that missing school means the student has to make up coursework. If he or she falls far behind, the student may have to retake courses.
