We are more than halfway through the school year and there is a lot happening on the Pirate Ship. Believe it or not, we are already looking towards the 2023-2024 school year. Assistant principals and counselors have been meeting with student groups to discuss grade level specific topics and class selection for next year. We are adding a few new courses, so please check out the BCHS website for updated course selection sheets. We strongly recommend for students taking Advance Placement courses to also take an AVID elective. The AVID elective is designed to assist students with rigorous course work using college and cross age tutors, the Tutorial process, the AVID Binder, collaborative structures and more. In addition, AVID juniors and seniors are guided through the college going process and receive assistance with the FAFSA. AVID students consistently place in the top 10 of their class and last year's AVID seniors earned more than \$2.5 million in scholarships. Please contact your child's counselor now to ensure AVID is on their schedule for the 2023-2024 school year.

Spring is synonymous with testing. Prepping for district, statewide and/or national tests are critical. Student achievement scores have an impact on a student's course schedule, scholarships, and college placement. Pinellas County Schools provides students with an array of platforms for test prep that include Albert iO, Applerouth, Khan Academy, Lexia, IXL and more. Students may access these programs by logging into their Clever accounts. Additionally, we encourage all to attend our after-school tutoring program every Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday after school in the media center from 2-3 p.m. Certified teachers from the four core content areas plus Spanish are there to assist.

And lastly, I would like to encourage students from all grade levels to connect with our College & Career Center. Mrs. Milavickas and Mrs. Anderson-Rhodes are ready to guide students through exploring their post-secondary goals, creating a plan to achieve those goals, and helping them with next steps to make it happen. No other school in Pinellas County has such effective and efficient college & career counselors.



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



 questions missed are provided for free.

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
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Boys and Girls Wrestling Teams are Having a Great Year!

The boys and girls wrestling teams are having a great season thus far. The girls started off a bit slow placing 4th at the Princess Punchout after winning the tournament the previous year. That was a wakeup call as that was the lowest the Lady Pirate wrestling team has placed in its three-year history. They went on to win the Tarpon Rumble, were crowned Champions at the Cougar Invitational at Countryside, The Bulls Scramble at Parrish Community HS, The Pirate Scramble at Branden River; They were the Gladiator Invitational Champions, The Anna B. Alvarez Invitational Champions and also bested Wiregrass Ranch in a Girls only dual at the Ranch. The boys followed suit by missing the Dual regionals coming in third at District Duals at Lemon Bay. That also sparked something as the boys have brought home hardware in every tournament they have been to. They took 3rd at the Zephyrhills duals, City Championship Runnersup, brought home 2nd at the Gladiator Invitational, Won their dual against Admiral Farragut during Senior night in which Keyon Carbart, Devin Bonner , and Team Captain Leo Tiannoi were honored. Aiyana Edwards, Kierra Woods, and India Porter were also honored as our girls' seniors. As a side note Kathryn Ables, also a senior, was unable to wrestle this season due to personal reasons but was a huge part

seasons of existence. She was our team captain last season. Up next will be the State series. The girls competed in the 2nd PCAC conference championship and once again were crowned champions. Aiyana Edwards, Da'Maria Raymond, India Graham, Jamiyah Wade, and Janhiya Jackson all won conference championships. The girls also completed the district championship, and for the 3rd time, the girls are district champions- This is a first in the state as we have won districts all three years girls wrestling has been a sanctioned FHSAA sport. The following young ladies will advance to the regional championships on September 17th: Fiona Meade (4th), Aiyana Edwards (runner-up), Taraji Jones (3rd), Shanice Youngblood (4th) Da'maria Raymond (District Champion), Jamiyah Wade (District Champion), Janhiya Jackson (District Champion), and Current state champion, now district champion Kinea Moore. 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
