Dear Parents & Friends of Boone High School,

Happy New Year, Boone Braves! 2019 was a tremendous year for our school and community. I am so proud of our teachers and students for their work last year, earning Boone another "A" school rating from the Department of Education. We look forward to continuing our climb in 2020 to becoming the top producer of successful students in the district, state, and eventually the nation.

Boone High School graduates boast one of the top post-secondary success rates of all Central Florida high schools. I am convinced this is overwhelmingly due to the experience our students receive in the rigorous coursework opportunities provided to them. At Boone High School we offer courses that allow students to push themselves academically, while preparing them with the skills and strategies needed to be successful in both AP and traditional coursework. 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Student Services

Financial Aid Information:

This is a critical time of year for our seniors seeking Financial Aid support for college. The FAFSA application is a necessary step so that students can get loans, grants, and scholarships to help pay for college. All students were given the opportunity to complete the student portion of the FAFSA in class. If you need further assistance in completing the FAFSA, please do not hesitate to visit the College and Career Center here at Boone High School. Students who fully complete their FAFSA application will be entered into a drawing to win one of seven baskets that includes a free yearbook and a free prom ticket, Boone gear and candy. One student who completes his or her FAFSA application will win a laptop! *All seniors must have a social security number on file to ensure applications are linked correctly to Florida Bright Futures and FAFSA applications. If you are uncertain if your number is in our system, stop by Student Services.

Bright Futures Scholarships:

All seniors were given the opportunity to complete their bright futures application through their English class. Your student created an account on the Florida Bright Futures website and filled out the application. They can visit www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org to view their award status or to complete their application if they missed the session.

Valencia Dual Enrollment Students:

Applications open January 27th! The deadline to apply to Valencia Dual Enrollment is March 3rd and the testing deadline is April 13th. Students should check the Valencia dual enrollment website for eligibility requirements. http://valenciacollege.edu/dual/

Magnet Program:

The Magnet application window will close on February 15, 2020. Please be sure to meet this deadline by submitting your application via: www.schoolchoice.ocps.net. Parents should receive notification of their student's Magnet status via email.

All Seniors:

We would like to recognize your accomplishments! Please bring in all college letters of acceptance and scholarship offers to Mrs. Cullen in College and Career. Seniors who receive scholarships (whether they plan to use them or not) will be recognized in a slideshow at graduation and at Senior Awards Night. Students must bring documentation of the scholarship.

Valedictorian/Salutatorian:

Beginning with the class of 2020-2021, schools will only have one Valedictorian and one Salutatorian. The Valedictorian and Salutatorian will be the students who hold the highest weighted GPA based on the courses taken through the first seven (7) semesters of their high school coursework. Course taken in middle school for high school credit as well as any online courses or any dual enrollment courses will be included in these calculations. The Valedictorian will be the one student with the highest weighted GPA. The Salutatorian will be the student with the second highest weighted GPA. If two or more students have identical GPA when calculated to the third decimal place, all students with identical GPA will be recognized.



Graduation:

The Graduation date for the Senior Class of 2020 will be held on May 23, 2020 at 7:30 pm in the UCF Addition Financial Arena. More details pertaining to tickets and parking will be announced later in the spring.

Course Request For Next School Year:

Starting in February and going into March, students will be meeting with the counselors to input their course requests for next school year. Course request forms are grade-specific and will be distributed by your students' English teacher a few days prior to their registration day to allow them to have the opportunity to discuss their selections with you. If your student is unsure of the next level they need of a course, we recommend they speak with their current teacher(s) to get their input on proper placement. Course request forms are to be signed by the student and parent/guardian before being entered into the Skyward system. Students do not need to make an additional appointment with their counselor to discuss their selections as each student will have an opportunity to sit down with their counselor one on one during their allotted registration day. If your student is absent during the day their English class is set to go to Student Services, it is recommended that they email their counselor to find another available time.





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
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Prom 2020 Information

- Late arrival is not permitted. Students not checked in by 7:15 p.m. will not be allowed entrance to the dance. No Refunds will be given.

Location/Theme:

The location and theme will be announced with a digital prom invitation that will be posted to Canvas on February 14, 2020 inviting all juniors and seniors to the dance.

Dress Code:

The dress code is formal. If you are not sure if your outfit is acceptable, please see any administrator before the dance to confirm you will be allowed in.

Guests:


- All guests who are not BHS students must fill out and fax in a BHS dance guest form to purchase a ticket.

- Should a guest arrive who is not of proper age, that guest will be revoked entry and will not be refunded.
- Administration reserves the right to remove a student from this event if a student or accompanying person displays inappropriate behavior.

Ticket sales:

- Ticket sales will be held March 30th April 3rd. This is the only week tickets will be sold. Please note: NO TICKETS WILL BE SOLD THE WEEK OF THE DANCE.
- Tickets will be sold during both lunches in the gym lobby.
- Students must have with them their ID and an obligation form that is signed by them and their parents. At ticket sales, an administrator will check to verify they have a 2.0 cumulative GPA and that the student has no obligations.
- Students can pay online using SchoolPay or cash or check in the gym lobby. Students who pay online must bring the receipt to ticket sales to pick up their actual ticket and to reserve their seat.




Planning Your Schedule?
