Dear Parents & Friends of Boone High School,

Happy New Year! I am so excited to leave 2020 in our rear view mirror and put 2021 in our sights with great expectations for the year.

Boone High School graduates boast one of the top post-secondary success rates of all Central Florida high schools. I am convinced this is overwhelmingly due to the experience our students receive in the rigorous coursework opportunities provided to them. At Boone High School we offer courses that allow students to push themselves academically, while preparing them with the skills and strategies needed to be successful in both AP and traditional coursework. We encourage all students to challenge themselves scholastically and offer an open-door policy to student enrollment in AP courses. Here are some key facts about AP enrollment at William R. Boone High School: • 1,396 students are currently enrolled in at least one AP course at Boone High School. • More than 2,642 AP courses are currently being taken by Boone High School students. • Last year over 1,468 AP exams were taken and passed by Boone High School students, making it the most successful year of AP examination in Boone's history. • Our overall class pass rate increased to 68%.

Congratulations are in order for Mr. Holloway, a top-notch educator with a huge heart for exceptional education students, who was voted as Boone High School's Teacher of the Year. Course Selection

This year Course Selection will take place utilizing a custom-designed website and Google form. Please refer to: https://sites.google.com/ocps.net/bhscourse/ home/. This website will better enable families to make informed course decisions and understand course progressions for different subjects. After reviewing the website, students are taken to the Google form in which they can make their course selections for next year. The website and the Google form work in tandem to ensure the most appropriate placement level for each student. Students will have access to the website and course selection form beginning in January. Counselors automatically receive the student responses and will schedule the proper classes. Students and parents are still welcome to contact the Guidance Counselor with questions, however many questions will be answered during the instructional video on the website.

Ask your guidance counselor for this elective next year!





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
PTSO

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

Sports Physicals - Athletic Clearance

If your child is trying out for a Spring sport, take care of the physical and eligibility paperwork now! All paperwork is completed and submitted online at https://athleticclearance. fhsaahome.org. Parents or guardians must create an account for their child and complete all the steps and upload a digital image of the FHSAA physical form. All accounts must be completed in full, 48 hours before the first day. Your child will be ineligible to participate if this is not completed in time. All athletes must have an account, even if the physical submitted last school year is still valid. If that is the case, the date of the physical will be transferred into their account once it is created.

William R. Boone HS Navy JROTE Aim High at State Air Rifle Championship

Four cadets from Boone Navy Junior ROTC participated in the State Navy Air Rifle Championship, in December 2020. Navy Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (NJROTC) cadets from 58 units across Florida participated in the Air Rifle Championship. The annual event hosted by Area Seven brought more than 200 cadets, who qualified from a field of more than 7,000 cadets, together in order to establish who has the right to be called state champions. "Congrats to all the cadets that qualified to be here and especially the ones that came out on top," said retired Navy Lieutenant Commander Robert Strange, the NJROTC Senior Naval Science Instructor. The competition consisted of a month of firing by cadets, in which two divisions of competitors, Sporter and Precision, vied for gold, silver and bronze medals. Boone cadets participated in the Sporter division, finishing sixth out of 58 schools. "I am so happy Senior Chief Wade was so, tough on us as a Team to make us better," said



Cadet Zoey Willey, a junior from Boone and individual Sporter champion from prior meets. "The team is extremely excited as we improved our discipline and competed to earn the 6th spot."

"I'm so proud of my team as they worked so long hours for this common goal," said Senior Chief Darrick Wade.



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

Senior letters were mailed out early December. These letters reminded students of their graduation standing and outstanding credits remaining until graduation.








Science Tutoring
