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A Message from our Assistant Principal...

Welcome Back Braves,

I hope that everyone had a restful, safe Winter break with family and friends. As we begin the new semester, I am hoping everyone is healthy and practicing CDC recommended safety precautions https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/index.html) and self-care.

In conjunction with my message of staying healthy and safe, I want to share some valuable information on the dangers of vaping that you may want to have a discussion with your family. Here our Boone family are being proactive and combining resources for our children to provide prevention awareness. We have united with our SAFE and our Discipline departments and our partners at Caron Treatment Center (www. caron.org) to create a focus group of diverse BHS students to participate in being change agents in their community as members of the **Role Models for Change Program**. This program will consist of a small group of students that will learn about current trends in substance use and ways to make healthier choices. These peer leaders will then be trained on how to facilitate portions of the program to their peers.

Here are 3 dangers of vaping use/abuse for your teen:

- Negative Impact on your child's developing brain.
- Negative Impact on mental health and potential Cannabis Use Disorder in the future.
- Negative impact on motivation and decrease in academic performance and attendance.

A few alarming statistics from Drug Free.Org (https://drugfree.org/):

- According to the CDC National Youth Tobacco Survey, 1 in 5 high school students have reported vaping in the past month https://drugfree.org/drugs/e-cigarettes-vaping/.
- JUULS currently contain 59 mg/ml of nicotine in each pod in the U.S- an amount equal to about 1-2 packs of cigarettes (https://drugfree.org/article/what-parents-need-to-know-about-vaping/).
- In the past year, there has been a wave of severe lung injuries, illnesses and deaths associated
 with vaping known as EVALI standing for E-cigarette or Vaping product use Associated Lung Injury
 (https://drugfree.org/article/understanding-vaping-illness-its-symptoms-and-more/).

Tips for Parents:

- Stay informed.
- Teach your teen refusal skills.
- Teach your teen healthy coping strategies.
- Teaching resiliency is very important and prepares them for the future obstacles they may experience and how to cope.
- Identify your students' coping strategies and allow them the space to practice them.
- Educate yourself on Cannabis Use disorder and other potential mental health issues.
- Remind your student you are his/her confidant and it's okay to share his/her concerns about a friend, school safety and especially for his/her own mental and/or physical health concerns.
- Watch videos like this to be able to identify the NOT so noticeable e-cigarettes and disposable vapes https://www.youtube.com/ watch?v=iLSo9L4uOkw

Warning Signs as a parent to be constantly vigilant for in your teen:

- Physical changes
- Productivity changes in school
- Behavior and attitude changes
- Evidence of paraphernalia

Course Selection at Boone will take place utilizing a custom-designed website and Google form. Please refer to: https://sites.google.com/ocps.net/bhscourse/home. The process is collaborative between the counselor and the student and will allow families to make informed course decisions and understand course progressions for different subjects. After reviewing the website, students are taken to a Google form in which they can make their course selections for next year. The website and the Google form work in tandem to ensure the most appropriate course placement level for each student. Students will also have one on one meetings with their counselors to finalize the scheduling process. Students and parents are welcome to contact guidance counselors with guestions or to inquire further with guestions or feedback.

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

- Late arrival is not permitted. Students not checked in by 7:15 p.m. will not be allowed entrance to the dance. No Refunds will be given.
- The dance ends promptly at 10:30 p.m. and rides need to be ready.

Location/Theme:

 The location and theme of prom will be announced with the digital prom invitation for all juniors and seniors. It will be posted to Canvas on Valentine's Day.

Dress Code:

- The dress code is formal. If you are not sure if your outfit is acceptable, please see any administrator before the dance to confirm you will be allowed in.
- BHS Administration reserves the right to refuse admission or dismiss you from the event if you arrive in unacceptable attire, show up late, or engage in any other behavior deemed appropriate for removal.

Guests:

- All guests who are not BHS students must fill out and turn in a BHS dance guest form to purchase a ticket. This form will be released on Canvas closer to ticket sales.
- Guests should be of high school.
- Should a guest arrive who is not of proper age, that guest will be revoked entry and will not be refunded.

 Check-in begins at 6:00. Students must have their Boone I.D. and ticket with them at the time of check in.


Ticket sales:

- Ticket sales will be held March 23rd March 30th. This is the only week tickets will be sold.
 Please note: NO TICKETS WILL BE SOLD THE WEEK OF PROM.
- Students will need to purchase a ticket online using SchoolPay and bring the receipt to the ticket sales line during both lunches in the PAC lobby.
- They will also need an obligation form to show they do not owe the school money.
- To pick up their ticket at lunch, students must have with them their ID and a cleared obligation form. Students must also have a 2.0 cumulative GPA (it will be checked by administration at the ticket sales line).
- Students will choose their seat and food choice when they come to the ticket sales line during both lunches. No seats will be held. NO SEAT CHANGES WILL BE MADE. Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. Tickets are nonrefundable.
