Florida Financial Aid Application

The Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) opened up to all seniors on October 1st. https://www.floridastudentfinancialaidsg.org It is one application that includes Bright Futures as well as 15 other state scholarships and grants. All seniors are recommended to complete this application before graduation, even if they do not qualify for Bright Futures.

Free Application for Student Aid

The FAFSA is an application to help students receive financial aid from the government and/or college. There is a student portion as well as a parent portion. The opening date was delayed this year, so it is crucial to apply as soon as possible. Make sure your student is checking each of their college's FAFSA priority deadline dates so they will receive the most money from the college.

Your student may have created their login (FSA ID) in their English class and a parent will need to create one as well. If you do not have one yet, from a previous student or your own college, go to studentaid.gov to create one. After creation, you will need to complete the FAFSA. 

- Dinner begins promptly at 6:45 p.m. Any student arriving after dinner is served may not receive their food and will not be refunded.
- Late arrival is not permitted. Students not checked in by 7:15 p.m. will not be allowed entrance to the dance. **No Refunds will be given.**
- The dance ends promptly at 10:30 p.m. and rides need to be ready.

Location/Theme:

The location and theme of prom will be announced with the digital prom invitation for all juniors and seniors. It will be posted to Canvas before ticket sales begin.

Dress Code:

- The dress code is formal. If you are not sure if your outfit is acceptable, please see any administrator before the dance to confirm you will be allowed in.
- BHS Administration reserves the right to refuse admission or dismiss you from the event if you arrive
 in unacceptable attire, show up late, or engage in any other behavior deemed appropriate for removal.

Check-in:

Check-in begins at 6:00. Students must present their Boone I.D. and table registration card when they arrive at the dance.

During the dance:

- Our dancing policy will be in effect. Students will receive a wristband at check-in. If they are dancing
 inappropriately the wristband will be cut. If they are caught dancing inappropriately again, then they
 will be asked to leave the dance.
- Behavior should be appropriate. This is a school function. If OCPS rules and regulations have not been followed by the student or the guest of a BHS student, administration reserves the right to use appropriate disciplinary action set forth by Boone High School and OCPS.



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Guests:

- All guests who are not BHS students must fill out and turn in a BHS dance guest form to purchase a ticket. This form will be released on Canvas closer to ticket sales.
- Guests should be of high school age and must be 20 or younger.
- Should a guest arrive who is not of proper age, that guest will be revoked entry and will not be refunded.
- Administration reserves the right to remove a student from this event if a student or accompanying person displays inappropriate behavior and no refund will be given.

Ticket sales:

- Ticket sales will be held Jan 29- Feb 2 and can only be purchased on SchoolPay. This is the only week tickets will be sold.
- Please note: NO TICKETS WILL BE SOLD THE WEEK OF PROM.



Steps to purchase a prom ticket:

- 1. Students check their current GPA/obligations. Current GPA can be found on the last report card and instructions to check obligations are on Canvas Student Body. Move on if **BOTH** are clear.
- 2. Print a permission slip form for the Boone student (and guest if wanted) and get an ink parent signature. Permission slips can be picked up in the front office or printed from the Canvas Student Body page.
- 3. Print the obligation form and get an ink parent signature. Obligation forms can be picked up from the front office or printed from the Canvas Student Body page. This is the form that must be emailed back if you have a guest attending who is NOT a Boone student.
- 4. Pay on School Pay for your ticket and either print the receipt or take a screenshot. If you need to purchase a ticket for a nonBoone student, please make sure you receive an email back confirming they are clear BEFORE purchasing their ticket. Tickets are nonrefundable.
- 5. Go to table registration during lunch (Jan 29- Feb 2) and submit the printed obligation form, the printed permission slip, and show proof of the SchoolPay receipt (can be printed or a screenshot). At this time students will pick their table and food choice and receive a table registration card.
- No seats will be held.
- NO SEAT CHANGES WILL BE MADE.
- Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis.

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Athletic Clearance

All athletic paperwork (Physical, ECG, NFHS Certificates) must be submitted online, in Athletic Clearance. Hard copies are not accepted. A new clearance must be created in Athletic Clearance every school year, regardless of when the physical expires. Physicals and ECG documents do not automatically roll over into the new clearance each year. To bring over and re-submit documents, select the button that says 'Choose Existing File' on the File Upload page. Every sport your child wants to try out for must be added to their account. Athletic Clearance is not mobile device friendly. It is highly recommended to complete the process on a computer. Congratulations to senior Lanie Gutch and junior Arianna Wertheim, who both won 2023 FHSAA State Championship swimming and diving titles.


Lanie won the second diving championship of her career, after winning the title as a freshman and finishing as state runner-up in both her sophomore and junior seasons.




