Dear Braves,


- Attend school daily be punctual and prepared
- Develop a study time and place each evening where you will not be interrupted
- Use a daily planner
- Monitor grades in each class using Skyward and Canvas
- Reach out to teachers directly with questions about grades
 - They are here to help you find success, so keep the dialogue open with teachers as it relates to grading practices and ideas for improvement.

If parents have questions about specific grades and grading criteria, please log onto Canvas and Skyward with your student. Most questions relating to grading practices and specific assignments can be answered through those avenues. If difficulties arise or an understanding cannot be reached, parents/guardians should reach out to individual teachers to attempt to resolve the problem. If that is not successful or additional interventions may still be needed, please reach out to Student Services to be added to our parent teacher conference schedule. Parent teacher conferences will be held one Wednesday each month, and this provides an opportunity for families to meet with their child's teachers to create an action plan for success together. Consistent communication between the student, parent/ guardian, teachers, and guidance counselor is of paramount importance. This partnership is essential to student success. Counselors also utilize an appointment-based system that allows them to meet with counselors throughout the year. 
Prom Date: tentatively April 1, 2023

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



Let your students know that resources are available to them here on campus:

- **Snack bags** available at the front desk in the Main Office and Guidance
- Groceries- discreetly packaged in plain brown bags available daily at the Main Office and can be picked up after school
- Toiletries, including feminine products, dental care, hair care and soap- available through guidance counselors
- School supplies- available through guidance counselors



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Parking & Personalization Information

Any Junior or Senior who wishes to drive to school and park in the Boone High School student lot, will need to complete the Student Parking Contract. In addition to the paper contract, you will have to complete the Vehicle Registration Google Form. If you are a Senior and would like to personalize your space, there is an additional contract and Google Form that needs to be completed. If you do not have access to a printer, the contracts will be available for pick up in the front office. Please make sure that you have the 2022-2023 contracts. If spaces are available, Sophomores can apply later in the school year.

To Apply for a Parking Decal:

- You will print, complete, and sign the Student Parking Contract found at https://tinyurl.com/ BHSParkingContract22-23. Copies can also be picked up in the front office.
- You must complete the Vehicle Registration form online via https://tinyurl.com/22-23BHSParking. The form will be available on Tuesday, July 12th at 10am. Completion of this form does not guarantee a space. Required information for vehicle registration includes the following:
 - Student Information (First and last name, student ID number, driver's license number and contact information)
 - Vehicle Information (up-to-date vehicle plate number, year, make, model, & color)
- 3. You must have your obligations cleared by the media center. Do this by Wednesday, July 27th to ensure you will be able to get your decal at Braves are Back on Thursday, July 28th. Any student who does not have cleared obligations **WILL NOT** be able to receive a parking decal until they are cleared.
- 4. For *Braves are Back* you will need to bring the following:
 - 1. Printed and signed Parking Contract with obligations cleared by the media center.
 - 2. Boone Student ID and Valid Driver's License – Permits are not acceptable
 - 3. Physical or digital copy of your SchoolPay receipt.
 - 4. Proof of completion of the Vehicle Registration Google Form (email receipt of the google form)
- 5. The only form of payment that will be accepted will be SchoolPay, at https://www. schoolpay.com

If you are a Senior and would like to **paint your parking space**, you will have two transactions: \$75 for the space and \$15 for personalization.

- All regular parking spaces (Senior non-personalized and Junior lot) cost \$75.
- Use of SchoolPay does not guarantee a parking spot.
- Items will be available by July 12th to ensure the rollover for the new fiscal year.
- 6. If you will be driving multiple vehicles, you must complete the above process for each vehicle. Contact Mrs. Stilwell about payment process for the second vehicle.
- 7. At Braves are Back on Thursday, July 28th the student, or a family member over the age of 21, may pick up the decal. The family member must bring a valid ID and all items listed in item #4.

If you are a Senior and would like to personalize your space:

- 1. You will need to complete and sign the https:// tinyurl.com/PersonalizationContract22-23. Copies can be picked up in the front office.
- 2. You will need to complete an additional Google Form which can be found at https:// tinyurl.com/22-23SeniorPaintingBHS
- 3. This form will open on Tuesday, July 12th at 10am. It has specific instructions about personalizing your space, acknowledgement of requirements and guidelines, and it is where you will upload your design. Your design must be approved and this needs to be completed by Wednesday, August 3rd. You will need to bring your signed personalization contract with you on the painting day.
- Parking Space Personalization will be on Saturday, August 13, 2022 from 7:30am -11:30am for Seniors who purchased these specific spaces.
- 5. If you're unable to make it, or we are rained out, there will be a makeup day on Saturday, August 20th from 7:30am 11:30am.
- 6. We will provide some paint, mainly school colors (orange, white, light blue, dark blue, gray, and black) Paint is first come, first serve until we run out. You can use other colors, but the paint must be the specific type that is listed on the contract.

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
