School Safety

Brave Parents,

As we close out the year, we need your help with school security. In addition to my role as assistant principal over discipline, facilities and school safety, I am also an aunt whose niece survived the Stoneman Douglas tragedy in 2018. School safety is my priority on this campus. Dr. Maestre and our staff work very hard to keep our beautiful campus safe, secure and clean. Parents, we are asking for your help. Please have a conversation about school safety with your student(s) about the following:

1. Please speak to your child about situational awareness; if they see a gate open on campus not attended by an adult or a door propped open by fellow students, they need to immediately report this to a teacher, administrator or other adult on campus. This is imperative, especially for the PE (700) building, which has doors that exit into the Wadeview parking lot. We need to be vigilant and consistent about keeping our children and community safe. By following safety procedures, we minimize the prospect of school violence at Boone. However, everyone must play their part.
2. Please speak to your child about peer pressure and the dangers of vaping and sharing these products with fellow peers.
3. Please remind your student that if he/she "sees something, say something." Do not wait. Talk to them about the difference between snitching and staying safe.
4. Ask your student who is his/her safe adult on campus? It is very important that your student has at least one said adult.
5. Please ask about your student's friends and/or the peers with whom they associate. I strongly encourage you to become acquainted with your student's friends/peers.

6. Please speak to your child about the importance of having a positive social media footprint and the dangers of various social media platforms. It is imperative that they keep their login information on their apps private and only accept people on their platforms who they know.
7. Please monitor their social media activity during the day. Their phones should be put away and out of site during their instructional time. Students should not be taking their phones and earbuds/headsets to the restroom. They are losing valuable instructional time out of the classroom. Academic disconnect (on phones and/or earbuds in use during instructional time) has a negative impact on your student's academic growth.
8. Please monitor your child's attendance daily. If your child is missing classes throughout the day, i.e. skipping, this is a safety concern because they are unattended and not being supervised by an adult.
9. Please talk to your student about the code of conduct and what is prohibited on school campuses. Here is the code of conduct for you to review:

In addition, check backpacks for anything that is prohibited on any of our school campuses. Inform your student NOT to hold anything that violates the code of conduct for a friend because he/she will be held accountable if found with the prohibited items.

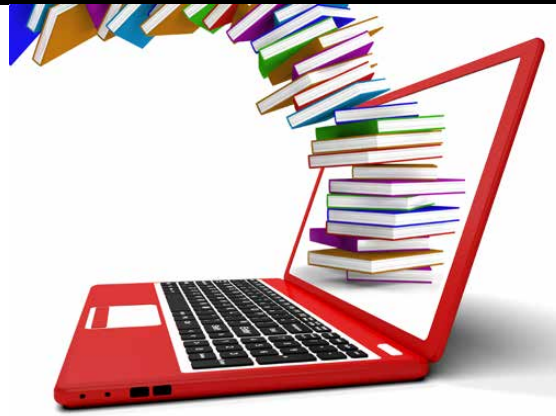

Check-in:

- Check-in begins at 6:00. Students must have their Boone I.D. and table registration with them at the time of check in.

During the dance:

- Our dancing policy will be in effect. Students will receive a wristband at check-in. If they are dancing inappropriately the wristband will be cut. If they are caught dancing inappropriately again, then they will be asked to leave the dance.
- Behavior should be appropriate. This is a school function. If OCPS rules and regulations have not been followed by the student or the guest of a BHS student, administration reserves the right to use appropriate disciplinary action set forth by Boone High school and OCPS.

Guests:

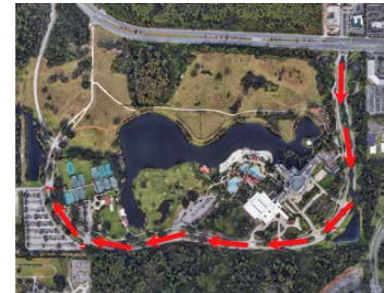
- All guests who are not BHS students should have already filled out and turned in a BHS dance guest form to purchase a ticket.
- Guests should be of high school age and must present an ID and their table registration to enter the dance.
- Should a guest arrive who is not of proper age, that guest will be revoked entry and will not be refunded.
- Administration reserves the right to remove a student from this event if a student or accompanying person displays inappropriate behavior and no refund will be given.

What to bring:

- Boone Picture School ID (or picture ID)
- Prom Table Registration Card
- Cash for Photography if desired (all students will get one free 5x7 photo)
- Self-Parking will be validated ONLY in LOT #7 (self parking is free) and use the shuttle bus to get dropped off in front of the ballroom entrance.
- Cash for valet if you choose to do so (\$40.00++)

Parking Information:

- All students driving and parking their own vehicle should follow the map below. All attendees parking their vehicles will use Lot #7 and will be picked up in a shuttle bus and dropped off outside of the ballroom bus loop parking.
- Any students being dropped off will not go to the above-mentioned lot, but instead will be directed to the Windsong Porte Cochere. This area will be designated for drop offs only. Limos and Ubers will also use this area. Students should advise Ubers not to drop off at the hotel's lobby-main entrance but again in the Windsong Porte Cochere.
- There will be human directionals waving down all students and ensuring they get to the right parking.
- We want to highly encourage all students to use these two options for parking. Our self-parking lot #5 will not be open for students to park and therefore we will not validate in that lot.
- If some of the students would like to Valet Park they can do so with a \$40.00++ charge that they will pay for on their own at the Valet booth.

Student Services

Course Selection:

Counselors have been meeting with all students through English classes for course selection. Students were presented a PowerPoint with their English teachers, then given a Google form.

Students had about a week to complete this form at home. The process is collaborative between the counselor and the student and allows families to make informed course decisions and understand course progressions for different subjects. After reviewing the PowerPoint in English classes, students are taken to a Google form in which they can make their course selections for next year. The PowerPoint and the Google form work in tandem to ensure the most appropriate course placement level for each student. Students also were given two opportunities (course selection day or the make-up day) to have one on one meetings with their counselors to finalize the scheduling process. Students and parents are welcome to contact their school counselors with questions or to inquire further with questions or feedback.

Juniors

Second semester is the time to really get planning for college. Mrs. Gurley, the College and Career Specialist, was in all Junior English classes. Students are welcome to make an appointment on her calendly if they have questions or do not have an English class.
