I am thrilled that we are back in business and that it has been another great start to the year. Though things look different right now, I want to thank every member of the Brave community for continuing to distinguish Boone High School as a place where there is a high standard of academic excellence and where our strong school pride fuels a collective purpose. Because of your commitment to ensuring our students' safety, social, and academic needs are met, we have fully embraced and successfully navigated the new LaunchEd/Face to Face hybrid model of instruction. We have one of the highest numbers of students and faculty back on campus and I think this serves as a testament to the notion that Boone High School is a place where people want to be. It is because of your continued support of our school and our students that we have established Boone High School as a place where all members of our community can feel safe, seen, heard, and valued.

The safety of our students has always been our top priority and we have further increased our safety measures under the CDC guidelines. The number of students per classroom is reduced, masks are mandatorily worn by all who enter the campus, gallon jugs of hand sanitizer can be found in every room, and our custodial staff has increased sanitization efforts frequently throughout the day. We have successfully raised \$3,300 to help our Brave families in need through Kiss the Pig; have celebrated our senior football, girls volleyball, swim, cheerleading, and cross-country teams; and kicked off meetings for our 33 student clubs and organizations. I cannot wait to see what the rest of the year has in store for our students.

Resilience is, and always has been, a core characteristic of our community, and I am so impressed with how all of our students, staff, and families have handled this pandemic. Thank you for your willingness to adapt and adjust to any sudden changes. With new information coming frequently, it is imperative that you take advantage of the various forms of communication our school has to offer. The Smoke Signals newsletter is mailed home four times a year and always contains useful information. 
