School Counselors are determined to get back into classrooms to interact more with students with informational presentations in regard to graduation, resources, and testing information. Starting the week of September 5th, School Counselors will be holding Senior Meetings, and Junior Meetings will start in October. These meetings entail counselors meeting one-onone with students to show them where they stand for graduation, answering any questions they have, and for a copy of their transcript. Students will come down with their English class on their designated days.

Student Services offers the following tips to assist each student and family as they strive for Success.

- 1. Attend school daily be punctual and prepared
- 2. Develop a study time and place each evening where you will not be interrupted
- 3. Use a daily planner
- 4. Monitor grades in each class using Skyward
- Reach out to teachers directly with questions about grades. They are here to help you find success, so keep the dialogue open with teachers as it relates to grading practices and ideas for improvement

If parents have questions about specific grades and grading criteria, please log onto Canvas and Skyward with your student. Most questions relating to grading practices and specific assignments can be answered through those avenues. If difficulties arise or an understanding cannot be reached, parents/guardians should reach out to individual teachers to attempt to resolve them. Email address can be found on the website:

If that is not successful or additional interventions may still be needed, please reach out to Student Services to be added to our parent-teacher conference schedule. Parent-teacher conferences will be held one Wednesday each month, and this provides an opportunity for families to meet with their child's teachers to create an action plan for success together. Consistent communication between the student,

parent/guardian, teachers, and guidance counselor is of paramount importance. This partnership is essential to student success. Counselors also utilize an appointment-based system that allows them to meet with counselors throughout the year. Students also have the opportunity to book an appointment online through the Student Services webpage at any time during the year. The confirmation booking is your pass to see your School Counselor.

If a student has a true emergency, he or she may request to see a School Counselor or the School SAFE Coordinator/School Social Worker immediately.

Bright Futures Scholarships: This application opened up to all seniors on October 1st.

All seniors were provided with specific instructions concerning the Bright Futures application process and FAFSA during English class in October. Your student created an account on the Florida Bright Futures website and should have completed this application. We encourage any Dual-Enrolled student to contact their counselor if they have questions regarding this application. All counselors must confirm that this application was submitted.

ACT and SAT: Juniors and seniors are encouraged to sign up for ACT and SAT tests to reach their goals. If you are eligible for free/reduced lunch, then you are eligible for a fee waiver from The College Board or ACT to take these tests. Students are encouraged to use the free tutorials provided by CollegeBoard.org, ACT.org, and Khan Academy online at www.khanacademy.org to prepare for tests.

FAFSA: Free Application for Student Aid www.fafsa.gov. All seniors are highly recommended to fill out this form in order to try and get grant money, free money, to use for college or technical school. Even if the parent makes too much money, some private scholarships as well as some scholarships at the college will require the form. This year the FAFSA will not open until hopefully sometime in December. Your student will have made their FSA ID, and FAFSA login, in their English class. It is encouraged that one parent also make an account now, as it will be needed for the parent portion in December. The application will only be complete with parent information and electronic signature.



- School supplies- available through guidance counselors



Boone Resiliency Day

On Friday, September 15th Boone hosted the Back to School Bash to celebrate Resiliency Day! At the Back to School Bash the Student Services team gave out free popsicles to all students who attended.

Boone clubs also hosted activities and games for students to play and have fun while celebrating resiliency. Thank you to the Boone Foundation which purchased 1,300 popsicles for our students and to all of the clubs and their sponsors who set up games and activities.

Florida Statute 1003.42 requires public schools to facilitate at least 5 hours of mental health instruction in grades 6-12. Florida's First Lady Casey DeSantis has created the Resiliency Toolkit to help educators teach mental health and character education in their classrooms. OCPS has designated one school day each semester to celebrate and teach students resiliency. Students complete 30-minute interactive lessons on Canvas. There will be an adjusted bell schedule on these days, Sept. 15 and Jan. 11.




Science National Honor Society offers tutoring sessions for all science subjects. Tutoring takes place every Monday at 3:15 in Room 560.

- \$250 Family (good for 5 family members living in the same household)




Single-game tickets are \$9 for football and \$8 for all other sports (+ processing fee) and are available on GoFan only.


