Principal's Message

Dear Seahawk,

While you are enjoying some well-deserved rest, we are working to be ready for the start of the upcoming school year on Tuesday, August 10th. I am sure you have many questions and the information included in this packet should answer many. The following dates and information are of particular importance as we prepare for the 2021-22 school year:

Student Parking Passes and Lockers:

Student parking passes and lockers can be purchased at the school on the following days (they can also be purchased at Open House and during the first week of school). The cost is \$75 for personalized and \$25 for standard parking passes. Student lockers are \$10.

- Seniors: July 26th (9:00 am – noon)
- Juniors: July 27th (9:00 am – noon)
- Sophomores: July 28th (9:00 am – noon)
- Freshmen: July 29th (9:00 am – noon)

Student Schedules:

You will have access to your schedule by noon on Thursday, August 5th. In order to see your schedule, you will need to log into Focus (lee.focusschoolsoftware.com) using your school district email and user credentials. If you notice that there are classes missing or you would like to request a schedule change, you have several options:

- Visit our school website (cch.leeschools.net) to complete a Schedule Change Request
- You can visit the school during our Open House on Thursday, August 5th (5:00 pm – 7:00 pm) and complete an online schedule change request form
- You will be permitted to request a change when you initially return to school (August 10 – August 13)

No Symptoms:

Proceed to school / work

Exposure to a known + COVID person with No Symptoms:

DO NOT go to school / work

Home for 10 days since exposure

*Employee or student within 6 feet of the COVID-19 positive person for more than 15 minutes.

Diagnosis + COVID with No Symptoms:

DO NOT go to school / work

• Home for 10 days since first positive COVID-19 test

*If you have tested and waiting for results, DO NOT go to school / work

Experiencing Symptoms:

DO NOT go to school / work

• Home for 10 days since first symptoms and 24 hours symptom free without using medication

List of COVID symptoms:

- Fever of 100.4
- or greater New loss of taste or smell;
- Nausea and vomiting;
- Fatigue;
- Diarrhea;
- Muscle or body aches;
- Chills;
- Shortness of breath / difficulty breathing;
- New cough;
- Congestion or runny nose;
- Sore throat;
- Headache

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Back to School

First day of school is August 10th! It will be an Odd Day (classes 1, 3, 5, 7).

IB Office

Congratulations to the CCHS IB Class of 2021! The IB scores were released on July 6th and 89 out of 97 CCHS IB Diploma students earned their IB diplomas. This 92% pass rate is the highest the CCHS IB program has ever seen! The IB diploma requires students to receive a minimum of 24 points total and our average score was 31 points which is also the highest average total score we have had. The IB subjects are scored on a scale of 1 to 7. A score of 4 or higher is considered passing. 11 of our 15 different tested subjects had at least 90% of students pass. Business Management, Visual Arts, Psychology, Biology HL, and Math Analysis & Approaches (HL and SL) all had 100% pass rates! English Literature and Math Applications & Interpretations had 97% of students pass. History and ITGS has 96% of students pass. IB Psychology had 18 out of 53 students earn the highest score, a 7! We are very proud of the class of 2021's accomplishments and wish them the best in their future!

Students will fly their kites in class during exam week. They created a variety of kites shaped as kites, trapezoids, hexagons, and even 3-dimensional figures. We are very proud of all their accomplishments this year.

Mentoring To Impact Three Generations

Teen Trendsetters is a reading mentoring program for first, second, and third graders who are reading half a year or more behind their grade level. These struggling readers are assigned a teen mentor from middle and high school who meets with them weekly, and they work together to improve reading.

The program also engages the mentees' parents, who sign a contract agreeing to read with their child at least twice a week. To help encourage their continued learning at home with their parents, the mentees also receive a home library over the course of the school year. We also provide information to parents who might want to improve their own literacy skills.

The Barbara Bush Foundation provides training for both teen mentors and program advisors on age-appropriate books for mentees, and a high-quality mentoring guide for the teens with evidence-based strategies to help mentees learn to read.

150 Programs Across 11 States

The Barbara Bush Foundation supports Teen Trendsetters programs because they are proven to improve literacy skills and reach learners across three generations.

Most dramatically, it is a lifeline for mentees who may otherwise slip even further behind their grade level. But teen mentors also report learning just as much from the program. As teen mentor Ciara said, "I didn't expect to learn from them as much as I did. It was such a wonderful surprise." Mentees' parents also benefit from the personalized support for their child and their own dedication to reading with their child at home.


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Check and Connect

Engaging Students to School

Check & Connect began in 1990 with a five-year grant from the Office of Special Education Programs, U.S. Department of Education. Since then, many grants have furthered the development of Check & Connect, including replication, efficacy, theory development, sustainability, adaptation, and evaluation studies.

Because Check & Connect is an empirically-supported intervention, the goal of the Institute on Community Integration's ongoing research agenda is to modify and improve Check & Connect to improve student outcomes.

Of the dropout prevention interventions reviewed by the U.S. Department of Education's What Works Clearinghouse, Check & Connect is the only program found to have strong evidence of positive effects on staying in school.

Check & Connect is an intervention used with 9-12 grade students who show warning signs of disengagement with school and who are at risk of dropping out. At the core of Check & Connect is a trusting relationship between the student and a caring, trained mentor who both advocates for and challenges the student to keep education salient. Students are referred to Check & Connect when they show warning signs of disengaging from school, such as poor attendance, behavioral issues, and/or low grades.

In Check & Connect, the "Check" component refers to the process where mentors systematically monitor student performance variables (e.g., absences, tardies, behavioral referrals, grades), while the "Connect" component refers to mentors providing personalized, timely interventions to help students solve problems, build skills, and enhance competence. Mentors work with caseloads of students and families for at least two years, functioning as liaisons between home and school and striving to build constructive family-school relationships.



FAFSA

1. The FAFSA is a free application for Federal Student Aid that is used to determine students' eligibility for post-secondary financial aid.
