- 1. The FAFSA is a free application for Federal Student Aid that is used to determine students' eligibility for post-secondary financial aid. We encourage all of our seniors to complete this application to see if they qualify for financial assistance to help pay for college or a technical program. The website is: https://fafsa.gov/
- 2. The Florida Department of Education, Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA), administers a variety of state-funded grants and scholarships to assist Florida residents with the cost of their postsecondary education. This Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) can be submitted at: http:// www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/home/ uamain.htm. Completing this application serves several purposes, including student application for all the various levels of the Bright Futures Scholarship. For more information regarding each respective level and it's requirements please go to: http://www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/ssfad/bf/. Students need to attain a certain GPA, SAT/ACT test scores, and community service hours to qualify for the various levels of the Bright Futures Scholarship. They should meet with their counselor to discuss submitting service hours.

Both the FAFSA and FFAA applications open October 1st. Please reach out to your student's counselor if you have any questions or concerns.

Congratulations to the CCHS IB Class of 2022 on their IB results! 70 out of 83 students earned their IB Diplomas (84%)! 100% of students in Psychology passed with over half of them earning a score of 6 (7 is the highest)! 99% of students passed English Literature and over 90% of students in History, Business, Biology, and Math Analysis and Approaches passed. 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Check and Connect

Check & Connect began in 1990 with a five-year grant from the Office of Special Education Programs, U.S. Department of Education. Check & Connect is an intervention used with 9-12 grade students who show warning signs of disengagement with school and who are at risk of dropping out. At the core of Check & Connect is a trusting relationship between the student and a caring, trained mentor who both advocates for and challenges the student to keep education salient. Students are referred to Check & Connect when they show warning signs of disengaging from school, such as poor attendance, behavioral issues, and/or low grades.

In Check & Connect, the "Check" component refers to the process where mentors systematically monitor student performance variables absences, tardies, behavioral referrals, grades), while the "Connect" component refers to mentors providing personalized, timely interventions to help students solve problems, build skills, and enhance competence. Mentors work with caseloads of students and families for at least two years, functioning as liaisons between home and school and striving to build constructive family-school relationships.

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


French National Honor Society

Registration deadlines are approximately a month before the test. Students can use concordant scores for graduation requirements when it comes to the FSA ELA or Algebra 1.

SAT: August 27th, October 1st, November 5th, December 3rd, March 11th, May 6th, and June 3rd

ACT: September 10th, October 22nd, December 10th, February 11th, April 15th, June 10th, and July 15th

SAT and ACT fee waivers are available to students who qualify. Students can pick up a waiver form from the guidance office.
