#### **CLASS OF 2024 AND THE ACT & SAT**

The first SAT will be on August 26. Registration for this test will open sometime in April. The second test date will be October 7 with a registration deadline of September 8. Students can register at the SAT website, www.collegeboard.org.

The first ACT test will be September 9. The registration deadline will be August 4. You can register at the ACT website, www.act.org.

Since many colleges are now TEST OPTIONAL with your college application, check out the admission requirements for colleges you are interested in applying to in order to see if the SAT or ACT are necessary to take.

We encourage you to send your test scores to 4 colleges for FREE within your registration process for the SAT and the ACT. Colleges will ultimately look at your highest test scores submitted to consider you for admission. If you wait to send your scores later, you will have to pay a fee for each college and run the risk of your test scores not arriving by your college application deadlines.

You can still send your SAT or ACT scores to schools through the registration process and decide later whether or not to submit your scores for admission. Even if you have submitted test scores to colleges, if you indicate you do NOT want test scores considered for admission, then the school will not include the test scores previously sent in your admission consideration.

Please note that both Indiana University and Purdue University, among other universities, will require your test scores (both SAT and ACT) to be received directly from the testing company. Please also note that Purdue University did announce they will start requiring SAT or ACT test scores for admission consideration beginning this fall.

Be sure to take advantage of the FREE online SAT test prep available through your PSAT scores and the Khan Academy. You can find this information within your College Board account. For additional test prep opportunities, please visit our Canvas Counseling Course.

#### **TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS**

If your student has an IEP or 504 Plan with testing accommodations and will need testing accommodations for an ACT test, please indicate the need for accommodations during the ACT registration process. I will receive an email to make the accommodations request and you will be notified once that is approved or denied.

If your current FRESHMAN has an IEP or 504 Plan with testing accommodations who will need testing accommodations for the freshman PSAT, please complete this **google form** before Friday, August 28, 2023 so that accommodations will be approved in time for the test. ## PSAT TESTING INFORMATION FOR INCOMING FRESHMEN, SOPHOMORES AND JUNIORS

The 2023 PSAT will be administered on Oct. 19 during the morning school hours. Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors will take the PSAT. Freshmen will take the PSAT 8/9. Sophomores and juniors will take the PSAT/NMSQT. These tests are meant to prepare students for future SAT exams and provide information on where their strengths and areas of improvement are with English Based Reading and Writing, and Math. The cost of both tests will be covered by the Indiana Department of Education.

If your incoming freshman has an IEP or 504 Plan with testing accommodations who will need testing accommodations for the PSAT or any AP exams in the spring, please complete this google form before August 28, 2023 to ensure ample time for the College Board to review and approve testing accommodations. Any requests turned in after Sept. 5th may run the chance of not being approved by the Oct. 19th test date. Only students with approved accommodations through the College Board will be permitted to use their testing accommodations.

#### **CLASS OF 2024: COLLEGE SEARCH & APPLICATION RESOURCES**

We hope that you are taking advantage of the summer months to both rest and rejuvenate, so that you can have the best senior year possible. We know that many of you have plans to jump into the college search and application process in order to get a head start, and we want to make sure that you have access to all of the resources you need to do so. No matter where you are in the process, be sure to take advantage of the following resources and opportunities this summer:

- Your Naviance Student account can help you explore majors and careers, search
  for colleges and universities that are a "fit", create a "colleges I'm applying to" list,
  and even build a resume for use on applications. You can access your Naviance
  Student account by logging into the <a href="CCS Student Portal">CCS Student Portal</a> (using your usual CCS
  login information) and clicking on the Naviance icon. See the Naviance Quick Guide
  attachment for more ways you can use this tool!
- We encourage you to spend some time exploring the Virtual Class of 2024 College Application Boot Camp Canvas Course. This resource covers everything you might want to know about the college application process, and the great thing about it is that you can use what you need when you want to use it. Whether you want tips on how to write a college essay, ideas for getting organized, or details about the financial aid process, we are certain that you will find the boot camp course helpful. Every CHS Class of 2024 student was invited to join this course in Canvas, and all you need to do to access it is accept the invitation. (Note: parents who are observers in Canvas can access the boot camp course content too!)
- We invite you to sign-up for an in-person College Application & Essay Help Session to get answers to application questions and/or have your essay reviewed by College & Career Resource Center (CCRC) staff. Prior to school starting in August, interested seniors can sign up for one 60-minute small-group session on August 1st (9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m.) OR August 2nd (9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m.) from their Naviance Student account, in the College Visits section. Space is limited for these



summer help sessions, but please know that we will continue to offer help sessions throughout the fall semester during SSRT.

We look forward to seeing you all again in August and to helping you plan for your future in the coming year!

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# CHS CLASS OF 2024: LILLY ENDOWMENT COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FOR NOMINATION

Each year, Carmel High School has the opportunity to nominate two seniors to be considered for the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship. The Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship is a four-year full tuition scholarship awarded to Indiana students who intend to work toward a baccalaureate degree at any accredited public or private college or university **in Indiana**.

Five years ago the endowment established a much earlier deadline, requiring high schools in Hamilton County to submit their nominations by mid-August. This means that we must start the application process during the summer months in order to give interested and eligible students ample time to complete an application by the **Friday**, **August 11th application deadline**.

**NOTE**: this application deadline falls **within the first week of school** for the 2023-24 academic year.

Nominated students must:

- Be a Hamilton County Resident (four students in Hamilton County will be chosen as recipients of this scholarship)
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Demonstrate financial need
- Plan to pursue a full-time baccalaureate course of study beginning in the fall of 2023 at a public or private college or university in Indiana
- Demonstrate a commitment to community volunteerism
- Demonstrate leadership and/or initiative in their school, community, and/or extracurricular activities

In order for CHS to meet the nomination deadline of August 18th, <u>student applications</u> <u>must be submitted online by 4:00 p.m. on Friday, August 11, 2023</u>. The attached document outlines scholarship requirements and application instructions.

Students seeking to be nominated by CHS must apply online at https://forms.gle/n2GvxQ6mGWDxghFQ6. **NOTE**: students must access the application using their Carmel Clay Schools Google login.

Applicants are required to submit two letters of recommendation, and interested students are encouraged to begin making contact with recommenders as soon as possible in order to secure those on time. Letters of recommendation should be sent directly from the recommender via email to Mrs. Stephan by August 11th.

#### **School ID Reminders**

- To enhance safety and efficiency, students are required to scan IDs in the cafeterias, Media Center and when signing in and out with attendance. In the event students don't have their ID card, they should stop by the Activities Office (across from the radio station) to have a new one printed. The cost is \$5 for a replacement ID card.
- Since keypads are not going to be utilized, students will want to keep their ID easily accessible. At the start of the school year, students and staff were provided a lanyard. While not required, students are encouraged to use it for convenience purposes.
- Students who do not have their ID readily accessible will be asked to wait until those with IDs are assisted. For example, students without their IDs ready in the lunch line will have to wait until others with IDs are served before checking out.

#### 2023-2024 ALL-SPORTS PASS & TICKET INFORMATION

The Carmel Athletic Department is looking forward to the 2023-2024 school year. Construction continues to be a major part of campus as various projects are getting started or nearing completion. So many exciting projects are going on that will positively impact Greyhound student-athletes and fans in the future! As with any construction project, there will be a lot of dust and inconveniences, but the end result will be great for our Greyhounds. A more in-depth overview of the current and planned projects can be found at the All-Sports Pass and Ticket Information page at www.carmelgreyhounds.com.

The home football schedule will feature some of the best teams in the Midwest as the Hounds will play defending and recent state champions from Missouri, Michigan, and Kentucky in 3 of the first 4 games of the season. Five home games highlight a terrific lineup of match-ups. On August 25th, the Hounds will face national power Christian Brothers College out of St. Louis. The Cadets are a private, all-boys school that has captured 4 of the last 6 large school state championships in Missouri, including the last two titles. The second home game will be a rematch of the 2021 Hail Mary Game between Detroit King and Carmel. The Crusaders are 2-time defending state champions in Michigan, winning 5 titles in the last 8 seasons. Lawrence North travels to Carmel for the Bill Duke Trophy game on September 15th. Long-time rival North Central will be the 2023 Homecoming opponent on September 22nd. The last regular season home game will be on October 6th against 9-time state champion Warren Central.

The Athletic Department continues its partnership with GoFan, a digital ticketing company, to bring an easy and convenient digital platform to all Greyhound events. Your season ticket will be available on your smart phone through the GoFan Mobile Pass instead of a separate plastic card. All athletic events will operate on a Cashless system at all events. Paper money will not be accepted at events or in the prepurchasing of tickets. Instead, tickets and passes may be purchased from your mobile device as your ticket into the event. Credit cards will be accepted at all venues as well instead of paper money.
