


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# CHS PTO BACKPACK PROGRAM Collecting Gift Cards for Breaks

#### ATTENDANCE OFFICE REMINDERS:

 We encourage you to use <u>School Dismissal Manager</u> (SDM) to help us manage absences, late arrivals, appointments, and leaving early. We encourage parents and guardians to download the app or bookmark the site.

- Any time your student is going to be late to school, please send us a message using School Dismissal Manager or the phone line. This will allow us to excuse your student's late arrival.
- You may elect to receive notifications from the PowerSchool App when your student has an unreported absence for any portion of school or tardy to a class throughout the day. If you would like to start receiving push notifications, please install the PowerSchool App on your mobile device. When downloading, use CCS Code GKZX. Once you are in the app, go to settings and allow notifications. If you receive a notification and your student is supposed to be at school, please contact your student and have them report to class. The PowerSchool app also allows parents and caregivers to monitor your student's attendance, regardless of push notifications.
- If you receive a push notification from PowerSchool that your student is marked UNV or TDU, this means we do not have a message from home about your student's absence. Please use School Dismissal Manager or the phone line to report the absence or late arrival.

#### **STAYING INFORMED**

We thank you for your partnership in helping your child(ren) be successful at Carmel High School. With so many avenues of support, we wanted to remind you of some of the best ways to stay informed:

- Be an observer in your child(ren)'s Canvas courses. This will allow you to see what they see including assignment information and deadlines. Please follow this link for instructions as to how to set up a parent Canvas account.

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

#### SUMMER SCHOOL-GENERAL REMINDERS

Indiana Online (IO) and Summer School Registration: The window for CHS students registering for IO's summer school will close Wednesday. May 29th. IO summer courses run June 10th-July 21st. To register, go to https:// indianaonlineacademy.org and follow the link to enroll for the summer session. You will need to have your student's school student number available when you register and enter it as the local id. CHS students may register for any course in which a student has made a C+ or lower or needs to recover credit and/or a counselor approved math course to get back on sequence. Students cannot take a math course to work ahead unless the student is trying to get back on track in math. There is no charge for CHS students taking courses through IO. (Any student wishing to retake a PE credit will need to register through their counselor for the CHS Edmentum summer course. CHS is not contracted with IO to take PE.)

NOTE: Registration for PE I & PE II will close on March 1st and will be administered through Edmentum this summer. This session runs May 29-July 3rd. More information will be sent home to those who put it in their course requests as we approach the start date.

Students are allowed to take up to two credits total in one summer. PE I and PE II cannot be taken in the same summer.

#### STANDARDIZED TESTING INFORMATION

All juniors took the SAT at school on March 5, 2024 as a part of state accountability testing. This testing is part of our state required testing program. Students who were absent will be tested during the

make-up testing window.

Students who wish to sign-up for the ACT or SAT test can do so on their own. The ACT will be offered at CHS on April 13. The ACT is also



offered at other testing locations on June 8 and July 13. The SAT will be offered on the following Saturday's at CHS: May 4 and June 1.

Registration for Saturday tests can be found online at either www.collegeboard. org or www.act.org. The cost for the SAT is \$60. The ACT costs \$66 or \$91 with the optional writing section. Most colleges are **NO LONGER** requiring the writing section, so plan ahead to see if you need to take the ACT with or without writing. Be sure to include the Carmel High School code (150445) with your registration. <u>We</u> also encourage you to select up to four colleges to have your test scores sent <u>directly</u>. This is offered as a part of your registration process for both the SAT and

ACT tests and is free of charge at the time of registration. Please know that if you send scores to colleges and later decide to apply without test scores, the colleges will NOT pull testing information that may have been previously submitted.

It is recommended that students who plan to attend college take the SAT and ACT at least one time during the winter/spring of their junior year. Because most colleges will consider the highest combination of any college admission test scores presented with an application, many students will take either the SAT or ACT two times prior to their senior year. Please know that many colleges are now TEST OPTIONAL, so check out the admission requirements for colleges you are interested in applying to in order to see if the SAT or ACT are necessary to take.

Please keep in mind that standardized testing is only one piece of all the information that represents and presents students and their accomplishments. For most colleges and universities, the most important part of the student's record is the quality of the student's academic course work and the grades that they have earned in those classes. For highly selective schools, the quality of the student's character and her/ his leadership in school and/or community activities weigh heavily.

Be sure to take advantage of the FREE online SAT test prep available through the Khan Academy. You can find this information within your College Board account. For additional test prep opportunities, please visit our Canvas Counseling Course.

#### **TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS**

If your student has a 504 Plan or an IEP with testing accommodations, accommodations have been requested through the College Board. You should have received a letter indicating the approval or denial of accommodations along with an assigned SSD#. Any accommodations for which your student is approved was administered on the March 5 School-Day SAT. These

accommodations will also be in place for any future SAT or AP tests.

If your student has an IEP or 504 Plan with testing accommodations and will need testing accommodations for an ACT test, please indicate the need for accommodations during the ACT registration process. Our office will receive an email to make the accommodations request, and you will be notified once that is approved or denied.


#### NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FINALISTS ANNOUNCED

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#### FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION IMPORTANT FAFSA UPDATES FOR SENIORS:

 The U.S. Department of Education has announced that there will be delays in sending FAFSA information to colleges/universities. Currently, they are estimating that FAFSA data will be sent to colleges by mid-March. This will delay the communication of financial aid awards to admitted students from the colleges to which they have been admitted. Please be sure to carefully read all



**communication from your colleges of interest** to fully understand how they are handling the FAFSA delay.

- Starting with the Class of 2024, new Indiana legislation requires all high school seniors to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or formally opt out. While we encourage all seniors planning to attend college in 2024-25 to submit a FAFSA, families who choose to opt out must complete an official opt-out form and send it electronically to the CHS Registrar, Wendy Nordhoff-Pemberton, wnordhof@ccs.k12.in.us
- Need help understanding what to do after submitting the FAFSA? Seniors and Senior parents are invited to attend "After the FAFSA: Finalizing College Financial Aid" o Thursday, March 9th at 6:30 p.m. in the CHS Community Room. This presentation by our partners at INvestEd Indiana will review how to understand what comes next after submitting the FAFSA, how to read financial aid notification letters and more!

#### **CARMEL EDUCATION FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Carmel Education Foundation (CEF) provides financial scholarships to at least 80 CHS seniors each year, ranging in value from \$500- \$6,000. CEF scholarships can be used for expenses related to college, certification, or trade school. We encourage seniors to review the CEF scholarship materials available at https://www.ccs.k12.in.us/ foundation/scholarships/application-process. Simply click on the directory outlining all scholarships and their criteria, application instructions, and the application link.

As an applicant, seniors will be asked to create a profile and respond to a series of questions in a common application format to determine their scholarship eligibility. Once their general application is submitted, applicants will be directed to a list of scholarships for which they will be considered and they may be asked to complete a required essay for specific scholarships. Approximately half of the scholarships require a short essay, and the prompts are listed in the directory found on the CEF website.

The CEF application deadline is Friday, March 1st at 5:00 p.m. All applicants will be contacted to verify their application content before they are notified of their application status in early May 2024. Scholarships will be presented at the CHS Community Scholarship Night on Tuesday, May 14, 2024. It is important to note that because CEF awards no more than one scholarship to a single student, they are truly spreading the wealth!

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 Carmel High School creates a more balanced approach to the end of our semesters through our ACE end-of-semester schedule, which addresses:

- Students' desire for more preparation and intervention time with teachers.
- A balanced approach with scheduled periods for assessments and culminating experiences.

- Opportunities for unique classroom experiences.
- Graduation and Senior Celebration activities being on the last day of the semester, impacting Senior attendance on May 23rd.

#### UNDERSTANDING "ACE" & "P&I" TERMS:

Assessments & Culminating Experiences (ACE) are required in-person, endof-term assessments or culminating experiences such as presentations, projects, exit conferences, passion projects, Genius Hours, unique laboratory activities, etc.

Preparation & Intervention (P&I) time is scheduled for students to connect with teachers in-person, via Zoom, Canvas messages, or email to prepare for any upcoming ACE. P&I sessions will occur in the morning during e-learning instruction from 9:05 am - 12:05 pm each day.

Attendance is mandatory during all ACE classes, with no exceptions. Students will be engaging in meaningful classroom activities such as presentations, projects, exit conferences, passion projects, Genius Hours, unique laboratory activities, etc. Following these attendance expectations ensures we maintain a high level of educational excellence at CHS.

In-person attendance is not required during the morning P&I time on May 21, 22, and 23. Students can use their morning P&I time preparing off campus or at CHS on ACE days. Students may schedule meetings with specific teachers or will be assigned to a quiet study session monitored by staff. Teachers may also require individual students to be in attendance during P&I time if work is not complete and additional support is necessary.

Parents/caregivers who want their students to remain on campus for the entire day in supervised study areas on May 21-23 must complete a Google Form. This will assist us in preparing for lunch service and appropriate supervision. Students working virtually during P&I time or only attending scheduled meetings with teachers do not need to fill out the form. Students registered for the full P&I time are expected to remain on-campus all day.

#### LUNCH DETAILS:

- Students working off-campus on May 21, 22 or 23 may eat lunch offcampus or at CHS.
- Students registered by their parents for a full day on campus may not leave to eat lunch.
- CHS cafeteria menu offerings will be limited and will be served from 12:05 - 12:35 pm for students wishing to eat lunch at school.

#### **ACE SPECIFICS:**

  - » 9th-11th grade students will have their B3 & B4 ACE on May 23.
- ACE sessions begin May 20, during G4, a full in-person school day.
- On May 21, 22, and 23, ACE classes begin at 12:50 pm each day. Students not already on campus may start arriving at 12:05 pm. Please read through transportation details for drop-off details.
- Students must remain on campus during an ACE period unless it is an emergency or necessary absence, and Student Services give permission.
- Any student with a family-related conflict during ACE periods will make up their work once they return from their pre-approved conflict.
- Medical documentation must be provided to the Attendance Office for excused medical absence. Without a doctor's note, students must be seen by our Health Center nurses. The absence will be excused if the Health Center staff finds the student too ill to attend. Otherwise. students will be expected to complete the ACE. If medical documentation is provided and the student feels better before the end of the week, they are allowed to work with their teacher(s) to complete the ACE. If unable to complete their ACE during the final week of the semester, the student will complete their ACE when they are well enough to return. This may require entering an Incomplete for the student's grade until the ACE is completed. Students who are not medically excused and have not been pre-approved through the Attendance Office to complete their ACE later will not receive credit for their ACF.

#### **P&I SPECIFICS:**

- Students should request a pass from each teacher in advance for in-person visits. Students will have their passes verified by school personnel before being allowed access to the building before 12:05 pm.
- Students with their own transportation not signed up for a full day of attendance may sign in for the P&I visit, then depart CHS until classes begin at 12:50 pm. If you prefer to stay on campus after your teacher meeting, you may do so by reporting to one of the designated study session locations.
- Students must present their ID at sign-in tables inside Doors 9 (main cafe), 13 (freshman center) or 17 (fieldhouse) and keep it visible in the hallways, as hallway supervisors will monitor student activity. Students must be on a preapproved list to visit a teacher.
- Students must use the study sessions to prepare for their upcoming ACE only. No games (card, board, or video) will be allowed. Students are allowed to bring individual-sized snacks/drinks and use headphones for listening to music.
- Students registered for the study session can show supervisors a pass to be released to a teacher's classroom. You would then report back to your previous study session location until campus opens at 12:05 pm.
- All students on campus prior to 12:05 pm must be accounted for and will not be allowed to gather in unsupervised areas of the building such as the gym, Greyhound station, main office commons, etc.

#### **TRANSPORTATION, ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL INFORMATION:**

• Buses will provide transportation to and from school on the normal schedule.

- Dismissal will operate as usual for all students, including parent pick-up at the stadium.
- Students who wish to work off-campus in the morning will be responsible for their own transportation to school and must be ready for ACE sessions starting at 12:50 pm.
- Campus will be open and lunch served at 12:05pm. Students are welcome to arrive before campus opens but must report directly to their respective study location unless possessing a pass to work with a teacher.
- Students may be dropped off at Door 9 (main café) or Door 13 (freshman center). Please note traffic volume may be high. To avoid traffic congestion, students should arrive by 12:15 pm.
