CHS PTO Backpack Program



Mark Your Calendars March 1st, 2023

On Wednesday, March 1st, all Carmel High School Juniors will take the SAT as required by the Indiana Department of Education. To ensure a successful testing environment, students in grades 9, 10 and 12 will have an E-Learning day. Additional information will be provided through school messenger in early February.



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Attendance Office Updates

We are excited to be using two new tools for student attendance:

School Dismissal Manager and the PowerSchool App Push Notifications.

Using School Dismissal Manager is preferred to help us manage absences, late arrivals, appointments, and leaving early. We encourage parents and guardians to download the app or bookmark the site. However, families may still call as needed.

You may elect to receive notifications from the PowerSchool App when your student has an unreported absence for any portion of school or tardy to a class throughout the day. If you would like to start receiving push notifications, please install the PowerSchool App on your mobile device. When downloading, use

- **CCS**
- **Code GKZX.**

Once you are in the app, go to settings and allow notifications. If you receive a notification and your student is supposed to be at school, please contact your student and have them report to class. If needed, please use the notification as a reminder to call in any planned absences. You will receive a follow-up notification indicating they arrived tardy when they return to class. The PowerSchool app also allows parents and caregivers to monitor your student's attendance, regardless of push notifications.



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School ID Requirements

To enhance safety and efficiency, students and staff will now be required to scan IDs in the cafeterias, Media Center and when signing in and out with attendance. In the event students don't have their ID card, they should stop by the Activities Office (across from the radio station) to have a new one printed. The cost is \$5 for a replacement ID card.

Since keypads are not going to be utilized, **students will want to keep their ID easily accessible.** At the start of the school year, students and staff were provided a lanyard. While not required, students are encouraged to use it for convenience purposes.


Students who do not have their ID readily accessible will be asked to wait until those with IDs are assisted. For example, students without their IDs ready in the lunch line will have to wait until others with IDs are served before checking out.

Scheduling & Advising Meetings

CHS Counselors have wrapped up meeting with their 9th and 10th grade students and started meeting with their 11th grade students for individual advising meetings. During these meetings, counselors will review each student's course requests, identify how those requests meet diploma requirements, make any adjustments to their course requests if necessary, and discuss how their course requests fit in with their interests, strengths, and post-high school plans. The advising meetings are also a time for CHS counselors to discuss academic performance to date, identify any social-emotional learning needs, and answer student questions. Junior advising meetings began January 17th. **Each student is required to register for their appointment using the Google Calendar sent to them from their school counselor via email. Students can also find the message with the calendar link in their Naviance account.** If you have any questions please feel free to reach out to your counselor. If you don't know who your child's counselor is and can't locate it on our Counseling Canvas page please call our office at 317-571-5922 for assistance. We are happy to help.

Important deadlines for 2023-2024 course scheduling include:

1. The Application Course Deadline is February 1st. A list of courses requiring a special application is located in the Canvas scheduling module
2. The deadline to request a schedule change for any reason is March 1st.
3. The final schedule change deadline is May 1st. Please note that schedule change requests submitted between March 1st and May 1st are dependent on course availability.
4. The deadline to register for Summer PE is March 1, 2023

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Standardized Testing Information

The SAT will be given to ALL Juniors on March 1st at CHS. This is a state mandate and REQUIRED for all juniors to take at school (beginning with the class of 2023 and beyond). There is no registration necessary and no cost to families. The results of this test score will appear in the student's College Board account about 3 weeks after testing and can later be sent to colleges and counted for admissions purposes.


Students who wish to sign-up for the ACT or SAT test can do so on their own. The ACT will be offered the following Saturday's at CHS: February 11 and April 15. The ACT is also offered at other testing locations on June 10 and July 15. The SAT will be offered on the following Saturday's at CHS: May 6 and June 3. The SAT is also offered at other testing locations on March 11 (not recommended given that your junior is taking it at school on March 1). Registration for Saturday tests can be found online at either www.collegeboard.org or www.act.org. The cost for the SAT is \$60. The ACT costs \$63 or \$88 with the optional writing section. Most colleges are **NO LONGER** requiring the writing section, so plan ahead to see if you need to take the ACT with or without writing. Be sure to include the Carmel High School code (150445) with your registration. **We also**

encourage you to select up to four colleges to have your test scores sent directly. This is offered as a part of your registration process for both the SAT and ACT tests and is free of charge at the time of registration. Please know that if you send scores to colleges and later decide to apply without test scores, the colleges will NOT pull testing information that may have been previously submitted.

It is recommended that students who plan to attend college take the SAT and ACT at least one time during the winter/spring of their junior year. Because most colleges will consider the highest combination of any college admission test scores presented with an application, many students will take either the SAT or ACT two times prior to their senior year. Please know that many colleges are now TEST OPTIONAL, so check out the admission requirements for colleges you are interested in applying to in order to see if the SAT or ACT are necessary to take.

Please keep in mind that standardized testing is only one piece of all the information that represents and presents students and their accomplishments. For most colleges and universities, the most important part of the student's record is the quality of the student's academic course work and the grades that they have earned in those classes. For highly selective schools, the quality of the student's character and her/his leadership in school and/or community activities weigh heavily.

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Testing Accommodations

On March 1, 2023, all JUNIORS will take the SAT during the school day. If your student has a 504 Plan or an IEP with testing accommodations, accommodations have been requested through the College Board. You should have received a letter indicating the approval or denial of accommodations along with an assigned SSD#. Any accommodations your student is approved for MUST be administered on the March 1 School-Day SAT. These accommodations will also be in place for any future SAT or AP tests.

If your student has an IEP or 504 Plan with testing accommodations and will need testing accommodations for an ACT test, please indicate the need for accommodations during the ACT registration process. Our office will receive an email to make the accommodations request, and you will be notified once that is approved or denied.

If your current FRESHMAN has an IEP or 504 Plan with testing accommodations who wish to use those testing accommodations for the sophomore PSAT or AP exams, please complete this google form by the end of the school year so the request can be submitted before the deadline of August 22, 2023.

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Mid-Year Transcripts for Class of 2023

There are often occasions when a college/university requests that you send them a mid-year or 7th semester transcript. This might include the following scenarios:

1. You applied to a Common Application college which requires a mid-year report.
2. Your admission decision was deferred until the college receives a 7th semester transcript.
3. You applied to a college with a regular admissions deadline in January or February and your 7th semester GPA would be beneficial to your application.

If any of these scenarios pertain to you or you need a 7th semester transcript sent for a different reason, please follow the directions below:

- Common Application Schools: Counselors will send out a mid-year school report and 7th semester transcript to all Common App colleges in which you have applied. There is no need to request a mid-year transcript for these Common App schools.
- Non-Common Application Schools: If you need a mid-year/7th semester transcript for any other reason, please follow the directions below:
 - ø Login to Naviance Student
 - ø Select the *Colleges* link followed by the *Colleges I'm Applying To* link
 - ø Click on the *+Request Transcript* link
 - *What type of transcript are you requesting?* Check the Mid-Year box ONLY
 - *What additional materials, if any, do you want included?* Leave blank
 - *Where are you sending the transcripts?* Select each of the non-Common App schools which you would like to send your mid-year transcript.

It is very important that you only request a mid-year transcript for those non-Common App schools which require them. These transcripts should be ready to send out beginning the 3rd week of January. Please contact your school counselor if you have any questions.

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Financial Aid & Scholarship Resources

COLLEGE GOAL SUNDAY

Get help completing the FAFSA at the upcoming College Goal Sunday
Sunday, February 26th from 2:00-4:00 p.m.

Various locations throughout Indiana.

College Goal Sunday provides Indiana college-bound seniors an opportunity to receive assistance with completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Volunteers (many of whom are from college financial aid offices) who will walk you through the process of completing the FAFSA and answer your questions. For further information about College Goal Sunday visit the website at www.collegegoalsunday.org. NOTE: Every college-bound senior should file a FAFSA regardless of their current financial situation. Students must complete the FAFSA to be considered for grants, loans, and work study programs at the state and federal level. Many schools require completion of the FAFSA for consideration of school sponsored merit-based aid as well as need-based aid. The FAFSA application became available on October 1st and the deadline to submit the FAFSA in Indiana is April 15th. Some colleges/universities will set earlier FAFSA submission deadlines. Visit www.fafsa.gov for more information about the FAFSA.

LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS LIST IN NAVIANCE STUDENT

Seniors searching for scholarship resources should check the scholarship list in Naviance Student regularly. These scholarships are primarily local in nature and provide opportunities to supplement the aid that colleges and universities offer as part of their financial aid packages. Scholarships are updated year-round as the most updated information is received. It is a good idea for seniors to check the list weekly to make sure they stay aware of all opportunities.

CARMEL EDUCATION FOUNDATION (CEF) SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CHS SENIORS

The Carmel Education Foundation (CEF) provides financial scholarships to at least 80 CHS seniors each year, ranging in value from \$500- \$6,000. CEF scholarships can be used for expenses related to college, certification, or trade school.

We invite you to review the CEF scholarship materials available at <https://www.ccs.k12.in.us/foundation/scholarships/application-process>. Here, you will find a directory outlining all scholarships and their criteria, application instructions, and the **application link which is now open**. As an applicant, you will be asked to



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create a profile and respond to a series of questions in a common application format to determine which scholarships you are eligible for. Once your general application is submitted, you will be directed to a list of scholarships for which you will be considered and asked to provide any additional required information. Approximately half of the scholarships require a short essay, and the prompts are listed in the directory found on the CEF website.

The **CEF application deadline is Wednesday, March 15th, at 5:00 p.m.** All applicants will be contacted to verify their application content before they are notified of their application status on May 4, 2023. Scholarships will be presented at the CHS Community Scholarship Night on Tuesday, May 16, 2023. It is important to note that because CEF awards no more than one scholarship to a single student, they are truly spreading the wealth!

SCHOLARSHIP CONFIRMATION FORMS: SENIORS REPORT YOUR SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS!

If your student has earned a scholarship, please submit a copy of the official confirmation letter, including the amount, to Mrs. Melinda Stephan or Mrs. Leah Owens in the counseling center. Please submit only those confirmed college scholarships for the school the student will be attending. All monetary information will remain confidential. Submission of confirmations will enable your student to be recognized in the graduation program. The last day to submit scholarship confirmations for recognition is Tuesday, May 2, 2023. Due to coordination and printing deadlines, any awards received after this date may not be included for recognition in the graduation program. The scholarship confirmation form is available in the Counseling Canvas Course.



Hoosier Boys and Girls State

Applications will be available in late January for juniors interested in attending Hoosier Boys State or Hoosier Girls State this summer. **Hoosier Boys State** will be held from **June 11- June 16, 2023** at Trine University in Angola, Indiana. **Hoosier Girls State** will be held **June 18- June 24, 2023** also at Trine University. Hoosier Boys/Girls State programs are sponsored by the American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary. Participants learn about government processes, citizenship, and leadership.

Due to the generous support of organizations such as Carmel Lions, Carmel Rotary, Carmel American Legion Post 155, and Carmel High School, our selected delegates incur no cost to attend. Students interested in attending must complete an application (including three teacher recommendations) and must have a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average. *Delegates must be able to attend the entire week-long session.*
