Counseling News

STANDARDIZED TESTING

The SAT will be offered at CHS on Nov 4, and Dec 2 for seniors who want to try to improve their score for college admissions and for juniors who want to take it before the required SAT on March 5th. Remember that you can choose to send your scores to 4 colleges for FREE through your SAT registration. Colleges will only look at these scores if you decide to include your test scores with your applications. The ACT will be offered on Oct 28 and Dec 9 at other testing locations. You have the option of signing up for the test with or without the writing test. Most colleges do NOT require the writing portion of the test anymore, so be sure to check college websites before signing up for the writing test.



TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS

Testing accommodations have been requested for all SOPHOMORES and JUNIORS who currently have an IEP or a 504 Plan. Families should have received a letter from the CollegeBoard stating the accommodations approved for PSAT/SAT/AP testing. Students should receive these accommodations when taking the PSAT in October and the SAT on March 5th. If you are signing up to take the SAT on a Saturday, you must include the SSD number assigned by the College Board when you register for the test so that your approved accommodations are applied to the Saturday test.

If you need accommodations to take the ACT, please indicate that when you register for the ACT test. Accommodation requests for the ACT are made as students are registering for the ACT. THURSDAY, OCTOBER 19TH TESTING FOR GRADES 9. 10 & 11 / SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR SENIORS

CHS freshman, sophomores and juniors will be involved in standardized testing during the morning hours of Thursday, October 19th. Information about the programming for seniors on that morning will be sent directly to parents of seniors in early October.

Students will attend classes that afternoon.

TEST DAY LOGISTICS

- Room assignments will be shared during testing week in SSRT and posted in various locations throughout the building starting Monday, October 16th, following Fall Break.
- Testing will commence at 9:05 am on Thursday, October 19th. The testing timeline should take approximately three hours for regular testers.
- All students are expected to attend their revised Gold day schedule, and dismissal remains 4:05 pm.








WHAT STUDENTS SHOULD BRING

- Students are encouraged to bring a pen or pencil to use on scrap paper if needed.
- While students may bring their own calculator, it's not mandatory as calculators will be available for use in Bluebook. (The testing app that has been placed on their Chromebook desktop.)
- Students MUST bring their school assigned Chromebook, fully charged, and charging cord. Please ensure students turn their Chromebook on a week prior to the test date to allow the necessary automatic updates.

REGISTRATION AND FEES

• There is no need for students to register or sign up for this test. The State covers the test for all 9th-11th graders.

HOW TO PREPARE

- Your student's best effort on the exam is important for identifying whether
 you are meeting college and career readiness benchmarks. It will provide
 valuable insights into their strengths and areas where they may want to
 focus on improvement.
- All students received a Canvas message with a Study Guide to help prepare them on what to expect and included a practice test.

NEW & IMPROVED WAY FOR A CHS STUDENT TO REQUEST TO SEE THEIR COUNSELOR OR MAKE AN APPOINTMENT IN THE COLLEGE CAREER READINESS CENTER

Beginning Monday, October 16th students will no longer need to scan a QR code to make a request to see someone in the Counseling Department. COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

Popular college application deadlines are quickly approaching (November 1, December 1, January 1, etc.) Seniors should be certain to double check all deadlines and plan ahead in order to ensure that all application materials arrive on time. If counselor/teacher or recommendations are required, please allow recommenders at least two weeks to meet their deadlines. Application materials DO NOT all have to arrive at the same time, and students should NOT wait to



request transcripts, test scores, or letters until they are done with their part of the application. Instead they should make those requests now to ensure timely delivery of materials.

IMPORTANT: The deadline for submitting any college application related requests that need to be processed before the winter break is December 4th. If you have any questions regarding the college application process, please contact your student's Counselor.

FINANCIAL AID RESOURCES

- The 2024-25 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will become available for families in December 2023. This is a change from previous years, and as CHS receives more details we will share that with students and families.
 Families can access information about the FAFSA at https://studentaid.gov/.
- NOTE: Recent state legislation now requires all Indiana high school seniors to complete the FAFSA in order to maximize all financial aid and scholarship opportunities. Families will have an opportunity to opt-out of FAFSA submission if they choose. More information about this requirement will be sent to seniors/ parents in the coming weeks.
- Information about applying for Financial Aid will go out to all CHS seniors in early-October, and CHS will offer a Financial Aid Night for students and parents on October 25th at 6:30 pm in the CHS Auditorium. Our partners at INvestE www.investedindiana.org will be the featured presenter.
- CHS will offer a FAFSA Completion Event on February 13thfrom 4:30-7 p.m. in the Media Center. Seniors and their families can get assistance with the FAFSA

The deadline to submit the FAFSA in the State of Indiana is April 15th, but please note that some colleges set an earlier FAFSA deadline for scholarship and financial aid consideration. IU GROUPS SCHOLARS PROGRAM CHS is a nominating school for the IU Groups Scholars Program on the Bloomington campus. The Groups Scholars Program was created as a way to increase college attendance among first-generation, underrepresented students at Indiana University. The program provides academic, financial, and social support to help students attain abachelor's degree at Indiana University. Income guidelines are part of the eligibility requirements. If you are interested in learning more about IU Groups, contact Mrs. Stephan to learn more. IU Groups Scholars Program applications for current seniors are due by November 1 st, along with a completed IU Bloomington application.



After we return from Winter Break, the Distinguished Grad Application will be available online. This program celebrates the well-rounded Carmel Greyhound. Approximately 135 seniors will be recognized as either commended or distinguished at our CHS Graduation Ceremony. One extremely exceptional senior will be recognized as *THE Distinguished Graduate* for the Class of 2024. Seniors will receive information at the start of 2nd semester as to how to access the application and the Distinguished Graduate (DG) Worksheet online.

ATTENDANCE OFFICE REMINDERS

- We encourage you to use <u>School Dismissal Manager</u> to help us manage absences, late arrivals, appointments, and leaving early. We encourage parents and guardians to download the app or bookmark the site. However, families may still call as needed. You may enter a School Dismissal Manager message a few weeks in advance of an absence.
- You may elect to receive notifications from the PowerSchool App when your student has an unreported absence for any portion of school or tardy to a class throughout the day. If you would like to start receiving push notifications, please install the PowerSchool App on your mobile device. When downloading, use CCS Code GKZX. Once you are in the app, go to settings and allow notifications. If you receive a notification and your student is supposed to be at school, please contact your student and have them report to class. If needed, please use the notification as a reminder to call in any planned absences. You will receive a follow-up notification indicating they arrived tardy when they return to class. The PowerSchool app also allows parents and caregivers to monitor your student's attendance, regardless of push notifications.

DRIVING & PARKING ON/NEAR CAMPUS

Parking on campus property and adjacent to school buildings will be limited to staff and by permit parking only. All students should park at the stadium. Any exceptions must be approved by the Student Services office. Vehicles are to be parked properly in designated parking spaces with parking permits clearly displayed. Vehicles not parked properly in the designated parking spaces may face disciplinary consequences.

SCHOOL ID REMINDERS

- To enhance safety and efficiency, students are required to scan IDs in the cafeterias, Media Center and when signing in and out with attendance. In the event students don't have their ID card, they should stop by the Activities Office (across from the radio station) to have a new one printed. The cost is \$5 for a replacement ID card.
- Since keypads are not going to be utilized, students will want to keep their ID easily accessible. At the start of the school year, students and staff were provided a lanyard. While not required, students are encouraged to use it for convenience purposes.
- Students who do not have their ID readily accessible will be asked to wait until
 those with IDs are assisted. For example, students without their IDs ready in the
 lunch line will have to wait until others with IDs are served before checking out.

- Have access to PowerSchool through the PowerSchool Parent Portal. This will allow you to see the most current grade for your child(ren)'s courses. Please follow this link for instructions on how to access the PowerSchool Parent Portal.
