# WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 16 - TESTING FOR GRADES 9, 10 & 11 / SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR SENIORS

CHS freshman, sophomores and juniors will be involved in standardized testing during the morning hours of Wednesday, October 16. Information about the programming for seniors on that morning will be sent directly to parents of seniors in late September. Information about PSAT-9 and PSAT/NMSQT for sophomores and juniors is below. Students will attend classes that afternoon.

## PSAT 8/9 TEST- WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 16 (FRESHMEN)

The PSAT 8/9 is the first test in the SAT Suite of Assessments. It is closely aligned with the PSAT/NMSQT and the SAT. Student scores will establish a baseline for college and career readiness as students begin high school. The cost will be included in the book fees and other charges billed to parents later this fall.

## PSAT/NMSQT TEST – WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 16 (SOPHOMORES AND JUNIORS)

The PSAT/NMSQT is an important national test taken by college bound students. The test provides students the opportunity to check and monitor their progress toward college and career readiness. It also is an excellent way for students to preview and practice for the SAT. The PSAT/NMSQT also gives students access to a free, personalized SAT study plan created for them by Khan Academy. (Students must give their permission before the study plan is created.) For juniors, this test is the official route of entry to the National Merit Scholarship Program.

The PSAT test fee for sophomores and juniors is funded by the Indiana Department of Education. If you have any questions concerning the above testing programs, please contact your student's counselor.

#### **CLASS OF 2020 APPLICATION PROCESS**

**Seniors**— Counselors met with Senior SRTs on August 20 to provide details on how to request transcripts, letters of recommendation and counselor reports for college applications. You can review this process on the CHS Counseling Course within Canvas.

#### **NAVIANCE STUDENT**

The CHS Counseling Department will continue to use Naviance *Student* to assist students and their parents with college and career planning. Naviance *Student* serves as a one-stop-shop where students can research colleges, explore career options, sign up to participate in special programs, reserve a spot for an admissions rep visit, explore summer enrichment opportunities, create a resume, and more! Seniors will also use their Naviance *Student* accounts to request transcripts and letters of recommendation for college applications, as well as identify scholarship opportunities.

## GET HELP WITH THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

Several College Essay/Application Help Sessions are scheduled throughout the fall semester to allow seniors to get help from counselors with their applications. Assistance might include essay review, general application questions, or specific application trouble shooting. All help sessions will be held in the Media Center Multimedia Lab, and seniors must obtain a pass from Counseling for the SRT sessions.

The College Essay/Application Help Sessions are scheduled for September 18 (Late Start and SRT), October 1 (SRT), October 9 (Late Start and SRT), and October 16 (PSAT Day Option for Seniors) and October 24 (SRT).



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#### **COLLEGE ADMISSIONS REP VISITS TO CHS**

Colleges from across the country are scheduling their visits to the CHS Counseling Center to talk with interested students. Students will find the schedule posted in their Naviance Student account and on the CHS senior hallway bulletin board. There will also be regular announcements and social media posts about the dates and times of these college rep visits. Any student who wants to meet with a rep must sign up through their Naviance Student account at least 24 hours in advance. The list of students registered for each visit will be sent to all SRT teachers on the morning of the visit, and this will serve as their pass out of class. The admissions rep presentations occur during the SRT period and usually take place in the Counseling Center unless otherwise noted. Meeting with various college representatives and listening to their presentations is an excellent starting point for students to gain a working knowledge about the various educational opportunities available to them after high school. Please encourage your students, no matter their grade level, to take advantage of these meetings.

#### **FINANCIAL AID RESOURCES**

Financial Aid Night is October 22 at 6:30 pm in the CHS auditorium. A representative from INvestEd Indiana (www. investedindiana.org) will discuss the "how to's" of completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form and the differences between the various types of aid. Representatives from the Carmel Education Foundation (CEF) will be present to share details about their community scholarships, and Mrs. Stephan will highlight the scholarship and financial aid resources available at CHS. This is an excellent opportunity to find answers to your questions about paying for college. Information will be provided about both need-based financial aid as well as merit-based scholarships. Parents of current seniors are strongly encouraged to attend, but parents of students at all grade levels are welcome.

**Reminder!** The FAFSA application will open on October 1. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid can be completed online at www.fafsa.gov. The deadline to complete the FAFSA in the State of Indiana is April 15th. Please note that some colleges set earlier deadlines for FAFSA completion to be fully considered for available aid. The sooner you complete the FAFSA the better!

#### GET HELP COMPLETING THE FAFSA

Parents of Seniors who want assistance completing the FAFSA should plan to attend the FAFSA Completion Workshop on Tuesday, November 5. Financial Aid professionals from INvestEd Indiana will be available to help families complete the FAFSA no matter where they are in the process. The event will take place in the CHS Media Center from 10:00 am-1:00 pm and from 3:00-7:00 pm.

#### **IU GROUPS STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAM**

Is your student a first generation college student (mom and dad have NOT graduated from a 4-year college) or does your family fall into a lower-income category (based on federal guidelines for family size)? If you answered YES to one of these situations, contact Mrs. Stephan in the counseling center to learn more about the IU GROUPS Program. This program provides additional support for your student to attend IU Bloomington and become a successful college graduate in the future. IU Groups Program applications for current seniors are due by November 1, so don't miss out on this opportunity!

### **Testing Information**

#### SAT AND ACT COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTS

Your school counselors recommend taking both the SAT and the ACT once in the winter/spring of the junior year, comparing the results to determine the stronger score, and then retaking the stronger test later in the spring of junior year or early in the fall of senior year. A few highly selective colleges require the SAT Subject Tests. Talk with your student's counselor in the spring of the junior year about the SAT Subject and Advanced Placement (AP) exams. Remember, standardized testing is only part of all the information that colleges consider as they review a student's application.

Both the SAT and the ACT test offer an optional writing section for students. It is at the discretion of individual colleges whether they REQUIRE the writing section for admission. Please check with your colleges before deciding whether or not to take the writing test.

The preferred method of registration for the SAT and ACT is online. For the ACT, go to www.act.org or for the SAT go to www. collegeboard.org. Test dates are also available in the Counseling Course within Canvas.





### **Senior Meetings**

During September and October, all seniors will have individual meetings with their counselors. Counselors and students use this time to review the student's academic record to ensure that a plan is in place for meeting all graduation requirements and to discuss the student's plans for next year, including college and/or career options. Students will receive information about how college applications are processed and how to find information about scholarships. Students who plan to apply to colleges with competitive admissions standards may be asked to supply extra information for their counselors to use as they write letters of recommendation to support the students' college applications. At this time, students will also be asked whether they plan to participate in commencement next spring. Parents should call their student's counselor with any questions or concerns about college planning or the application process. Please first refer to the information on our Counseling Canvas Course under "Resources".



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# Changes in AP Exam Registration and AP Course Resources

College Board has put new processes in place this year for students enrolled in Advanced Placement (AP) courses. Specifically, students will have access to new AP course resources offered by the College Board, and AP exam registration will take place during the fall semester rather than the spring semester. Over the course of the fall semester, students and parents will receive detailed email messages outlining the steps students need to take to make sure that they are prepared to take AP exams during the weeks of May 4th and May 11th. With this in mind, please make sure the school has your most updated email for communication. Please note, students who are enrolled in spring-only AP courses will register for their exam(s) during 2nd semester (more information about this will be sent out at a later date).

- August 13th 30th Teachers will be working with students to join their online classroom, via College Board accounts.
- October 14 27th AP Exam Registration takes place, via Total Registration, for fall and year-long AP classes only. More details to come in the future.
- October 28th November 1st Late AP Registration, using Total Registration. A \$10 late fee will be added to each student registration.
- **January February** Spring-only AP course joining and exam registration will take place. Details will be given at the beginning of spring semester.
- May 4th 15th AP Exam administration window

Please note, this year College Board will be charging students a \$40 fee for the following:

- Registrations that occur after the initial AP Exam order has been placed.
- Exam cancellations that occur after the initial AP Exam order has been placed.
- Unused exams (when a student does not show up on the actual exam day)
