CHS NJROTC CYBERPATRIOT TEAM

CyberPatriot is an online, competitive team within the CHS NJROTC Unit that competes as a virtual Informational Technology Department of a small company and are tasked with managing the network by finding and fixing cybersecurity vulnerabilities while maintaining network services all in a 6 hour period of time.

CyberPatriot offers a load of educational experiences in regards to skills related to, but not limited to networking, coding and basic cybersecurity knowledge. You do not need any certifications or in-depth background knowledge of computer science prior to joining the team, but you need to be willing to learn. New members being training in practices and begin to learn more and more about technology and cyber threat protection. CyberPatriot is open to all in NJROTC Cadets who wish to join and are interested in learning more about cybersecurity.

The CyberPatriot Program was created by the Air Force Association to inspire students towards cybersecurity and STEM careers critical to the nation's future. Mark Turner, from CHS Information Technology serves as the CyberPatriot Team Mentor and has opened the minds of cadets to the cyber security field and the many threats that are out there working against the United States, and how we can defend ourselves from them. A quote from Senior Chief Turner about the team, "CyberPatriot is not easy, those who do it are not afraid to tackle it!"

The online competition involves thousands of schools across the USA and Department of Defense High Schools worldwide. CHS has two, five-person teams well positioned to place very well. There are three rounds scheduled, one month apart and the 4th round is an all-expenses paid trip to Maryland for the top ten teams to compete in the final round for scholarships. We are hoping to be a top 10 team this year!

CyberPatriot is one of many CHS NJROTC competitive teams, and one of the few teams that is uniquely suited to compete in the socially distanced world we are living in.

NJROTC READS NAMES AT VIETNAM WALL

On Monday, November 16, Major Billie Rankin led a contingent of Charlotte High School's NJROTC who participated in reading a portion of the 58,318 names on Punta Gorda's Vietnam Memorial Wall of Southwest Florida. This was a week-

long volunteer effort as part of the "Welcome Home Vietnam Vets 2020," to honor fallen, missing veterans of the war in Southeast Asia.

Spectators came and went during the readings, respectfully listening to names. They were lost in their own private thoughts about the war, those they loved or knew, who died there.

James Askin (CHS 1960), George Kidd (CHS 1956) and Frederick Richard Levins (CHS attendee).

DeGaeta has self-published a book: "Vietnam A Look Back; What One School Gave," about the 137 CHS students/Alum who fought in the war. DeGaeta maintains an historical exhibit at CHS dedicated to their service.











CHS STUDENT ID CARDS



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


Mrs. Eyster views each resume' and personal essay. Students should share the resume' (via Google drive) with staff members who have agreed to write letters of recommendation on the student's behalf. The student hand-delivers or emails a resume' to the community person who has agreed to write a letter of recommendation. Keep the letters UNSEALED and DO NOT fold them. If staff/community members want to seal the letter please have them either email it to me or place it in a large envelope so the letters remain unfolded.

Mrs. Eyster prints a copy of each application, resume, and personal essay to include in the student's scholarship application. From February-mid March, Mrs. Eyster distributes copies of completed scholarship applications to local committees that review applications and select scholarship recipients.



WHY YOU SHOULD FILL OUT THE FAFSA ASAP

A better chance at more state and school aid. Need I say more? Schools and states have a limited amount of aid, and a bunch of states have a FAFSA deadline of "as soon as possible after October 1," (meaning they actually could run out of financial aid) so it's good to be at the front of the line!

Get it out of the way so you can focus on other things, like college applications, college coursework, or applying for scholarships. It makes comparing colleges easier. If you submit your FAFSA early there's a chance that colleges will give you an estimated financial aid offer early, giving you more time to compare colleges before the college decision deadline.
