CULINARY CORNER

"Tis the Season" Practice Safety While Holiday Cooking

by Captain/Chef Paul DeGaeta

Our Culinary Classes at CHS would like to wish all Tarpons Happy Holidays! Here's a few tips to consider to keep things safe!

PERSONAL HYGIENE:

- 1. Leave cell phones out of the kitchen, they can be like aircraft carriers of pathogens that can cause foodborne illnesses.
- Before entering kitchen, the single safest thing you can do to protect yourself and others is Wash Your Hands. 2
- Wash hands in hot water with soap before you start any job in the kitchen. Sing Happy Birthday twice 20 seconds, and 3. dry hands with single, disposable paper towel.
- Between every job, to prevent cross contamination: sanitize surfaces, wash hands, change cutting boards and utensils. 4.

SOME IMPORTANT COOKING TIPS:

- Set up a sanitizing solution in a small bucket with a cap-full of bleach in a half-gallon of water to keep on counter to 1. sanitize surfaces, utensils, sinks, etc. particularly that come into contact with poultry.
- Begin to thaw turkey in refrigerator several days before cooking; Never leave in sink to thaw. If frying a turkey, make 2. sure the turkey has been completely thawed and patted dry. Be sure fryer-oil is not overfull in pot. Fry in open space away from house/garage.
- Cook turkey to a Minimum Internal Temperature 3. of 165F. Thermometers are cheap and help you nail the perfect juicy turkey. Or 145 for ham/prime rib
- Best to cook dressing outside of the turkey 4.
- 5. Once cooked, do not leave food out for more than four hours. Refrigerate as soon as you're done with it.
- 6. Use timers to remind you things are on the stove. There's nothing worse than watching a great game, or the Grinch and forget you had the stove on, and burn something.

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DRUG FREE CHARLOTTE COUNTY

It's the most wonderful time of the year! There are decorations to put up, cards to mail out, vacations to plan, presents to buy, dinners to make, kids to entertain.... truth be told, it can all be a bit overwhelming and even stressful. All that stress can quickly zap the fun right out of all those merry plans that we've made and send us down a bah humbug spiral. - Create your squad Surrounding yourself with people who can give you support that you can feel comfortable reaching out to can make it easier for you to choose more positive ways of dealing with stress.
- Eat right and exercise believe it or not this isn't just good for your physical health, it is vital to your entire wellbeing and can help reduce stress in big ways. The better you take care of your body, the better it will work for you. Taking these healthy steps can help you avoid fatigue and irritation which are some leading causes of stress.
