CHS STUDENT ID CARDS

Once students are issued IDs in the fall, they are expected to wear their ID over their neck and it must be visible at all times. Students will be required to show their ID when entering the school building and when they enter and exit the school bus. Students who do not have their ID will be issued a temporary badge. Those who repeatedly do not bring their ID to school may face disciplinary action.

If an ID is lost or needs repair, students should stop by the Dean's Office to get their ID or lanyard repaired or replaced. Students needing additional IDs, sleeves, or lanyards will pay \$2 for an ID and \$1 for a lanyard. Replacement sleeves are free.



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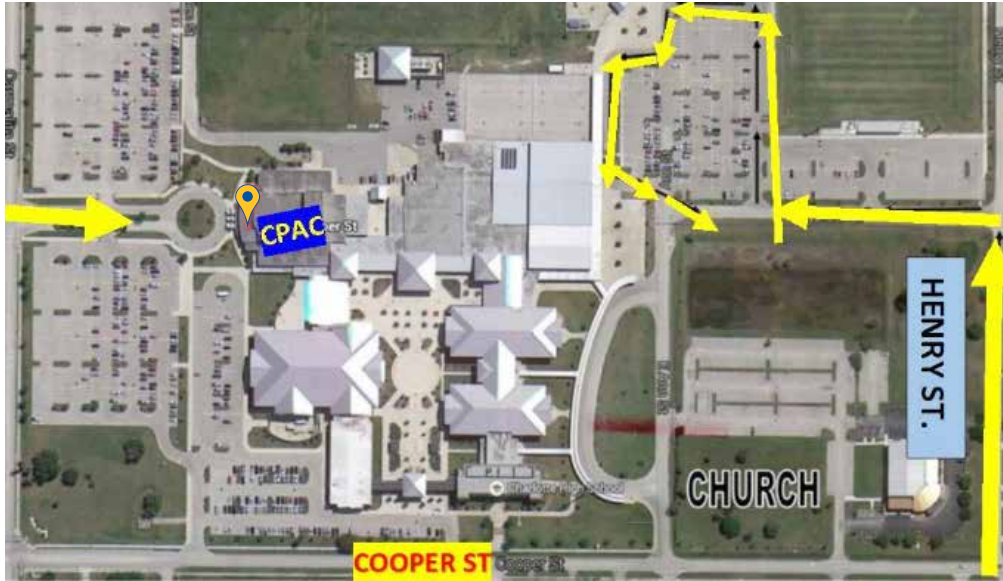




NO BULLYING
SAFE SCHOOL ZONE

Bullying, which includes cyberbullying, occurs when a person or group of people purposefully and repeatedly hurt, embarrass, or frighten another. During freshman year, all Tarpons participate in a classroom lesson about bullying run by our Assistant Principal and School Resource Officer. Our **MAIN parent drop off area** is just off Henry Street behind the Deep Creek Church. There are signs on Cooper Street directing you to this area. This is the largest area and is designed to accommodate a large volume of traffic. Students dropped off here enter the school on the gymnasium side of the campus.

Our **SECONDARY drop off area** is at CPAC. Because of the volume of students dropped off at CPAC, there is usually a waiting time to get in and out due to the seniors who drive to school who also use this area.

Dear Juniors, I am thrilled to be your counselor this year! In our recent Junior meetings, we discussed graduation requirements and met with our Career Specialist, Mrs. Eyster, who introduced Xello. As we approach the end of 2nd Quarter, it's important to start thinking about taking the ACT/SAT on a Saturday to kickstart your college plans. You still need to fulfill the testing requirements for graduation, including passing the Algebra 1 EOC and the FSA/ELA. With graduation only a year and a half away, please ensure you are mindful of all your graduation requirements, including maintaining a 2.0 GPA, earning the correct class credits, completing the mentioned tests, and taking an online course. If you have credits to make up in Edgenuity, please prioritize completing those courses. If you have any questions, please schedule an appointment with me by scanning the QR code or sending a message through Remind. Keep up the great work during this crucial year of high school!

Seniors, you are quickly approaching the end of semester 1 of your senior year, and will be starting your final high school semester in January 2024. 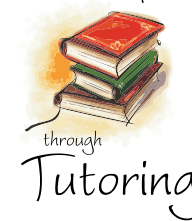
- SAT Test: March 9th 2024- Deadline without a late fee is February 23rd 2024. Deadline with a late fee is TBA. Register at www.sat.org.

ATHLETICS

Charlotte High School Online Athletic Clearance for Participation in Sports

1. Go to www.athleticclearance.com. Click on the Florida picture.
2. Click on "**Create an Account**" and follow steps. Or Sign in if you have previously created an account. Watch tutorial video if help is needed.
3. **Register.** PARENTS register with valid email username and password.
4. Login using your email address that you registered with.
5. Select "**Start Clearance Here**" to start the process.
6. **Choose the School Year** in which the student plans to participate. Example: Football in Sept 2023 would be the 2023-2024 School Year.
 - **Choose the School** at which the student attends and will compete for.
 - **Choose Sport.** *You can also "Add New Sport" if a multi-sport athlete. Electronic signatures will be applied to the additional sports/activities.
7. Complete all required fields for Student Information, Educational History, Medical History and Signature Forms. (If you have gone through the AthleticClearance.com process before, you will select the Student and Parent/Guardian from the dropdown menu on those pages)
8. Upload the physical form (EL2 page 4 only). You must upload your physical in order to be cleared. Physicals are valid for 365 days. If the athlete does not have medical insurance, you can purchase insurance online at www.schoolinsuranceofflorida.com.
9. Once you reach the **Confirmation Message** you have completed the process.
10. All of this data will be electronically filed with your school's athletic department for review. When the student has been cleared for participation, an email notification will be sent to the parent.
