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FROM STUDENT SERVICES

Freshman Scheduling

Below are important dates to be aware of as we move into the 2023-2024 scheduling season.

- **December 12:** All 8th grade students were invited to the CHS 8th grade transition to CHS Class of 2027. In the course, you will find an FAQ section, Honors Programming information, instructions for entering courses online in PowerSchool.
- **December 13:** Students will view an informational video during Core+ classes put together by CHS counselors explaining both the Canvas course and scheduling process. The PowerSchool online request system will open on December 12, 2022 and close on January 16, 2023.
- January 9: Academic Transition Night at CHS. This program will help 8th grade students and parents get acquainted with academic options, opportunities, and resources at Carmel High School. There will be booths allowing you to learn about specific courses and ask questions. All four Freshman counselors will be hosting sessions in classrooms for parents to meet them and ask specific questions about their child's



schedule. *We ask that parents and students hold questions until after this date. Contact information for your child's Freshman Center counselor can be found in the 8th grade transition to CHS Canvas page. Counselors will look forward to addressing individual questions following the Academic Information Night.

- **January 10:** CHS Freshman Center counselors will hold a live Zoom with all 8th grade students during Core+. They will be providing scheduling information and answering questions.
- **January 16:** The online course request system through PowerSchool will close on this date. All course requests must be entered by January 16, 2023.

NWEA TESTING

Students will take NWEA tests during their ELA and Math classes the week of January 9th. Please make every effort possible to have your students to school and on time that week. Carmel Clay Public Library cardholders of all ages can get free online homework help and tutoring assistance through the Tutor.com service. Available 7 days a week from 3:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m., the service connects students with a live tutor to assist with math, science, social studies, and English. Users can also access practice exams and get help with resumes and cover letters.

The tutors are experts in their subjects and include certified teachers, college professors, graduate students, select undergraduates from accredited universities, and other professionals. The tutor and student work one-on-one in a secure online classroom, and no personal information is exchanged between them.

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

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BRING YOUR ID EVERY DAY

ALL Students will be required to <u>bring their IDs to lunch</u> each day.

We will be implementing a "NO IDs GO LAST" procedure.

Reasons for this change.

- 1. This is not a new procedure we have done this before, but this will be the first time this school year.
- 2. 4 out of our 5 lunch periods have 300 plus students and if students come through the line without their IDs, the lines get delayed and we are struggling to get students through the lines.

What will happen if your child comes up to the lunch lines WITHOUT their IDs?

- Lunchroom Supervisors will call each row as they always do, but they will announce that "NO IDs" go last. This informs students tha DO NOT have their IDs to not come up until all the lines have gone through for students that have their IDs.
- If your child gets in line WITHOUT an ID during the regular rotation, they will be asked to go back to their seat until NO IDs are called at the end. We can assure you that your child will still have enough time to eat their lunch.

ATTENDANCE

Please call the school (317-571-4450) or use our School Dismissal Manager system if your student will:

- Have an all-day absence
- Late arrival where they will not be in school first thing in the morning.

If we don't hear from you regarding your students' attendance, we will call and email, as we are required by State Law to know your student's daily attendance.

Tardies:

- 3 Tardies An email will be sent out
- 5 Tardies Student will serve lunch detention
- 7 Tardies After school detention and every 3 consecutive tardies after result in another after school detention
- **At the Administration's discretion, a parent meeting can be requested at any time during this process.
