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



8TH GRADE SCIENCE



Freshman Scheduling

Following winter break, we will be working cooperatively with the Carmel High School Freshman Center counselors to begin the process of selecting high school classes. Please watch Canvas for an invitation to the CHS - 8th Grade Transition Course on December 11, 2023. In the course, you will find an FAQ section, course information, important dates, instructions for requesting classes via the PowerSchool Class Registration system and more.

In January, students will view videos and receive scheduling information and instructions during Core+. Freshman Center counselors will then be visiting to meet 1:1 with students to check over course selections and answer questions.

Carmel Clay Public Library cardholders of all ages can get free online homework help and tutoring assistance through the **Tutor.com** service. Available 7 days a week from 3:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m., the service connects students with a live tutor to assist with math, science, social studies, and English. Users can also access practice exams and get help with resumes and cover letters.

The tutors are experts in their subjects and include certified teachers, college professors, graduate students, select undergraduates from accredited universities, and other professionals. The tutor and student work one-on-one in a secure online classroom, and no personal information is exchanged between them.
