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# SOCIAL STUDIES DEPARTMENT: ESSAY & COMPETITION OPPORTUNITIES

#### **Essay opportunity for 6th grade students**

To whom are you most grateful for the freedoms you enjoy? Are your freedoms more important than those of others? Are you ever disturbed when others practice freedoms that hurt or offend you? When? Why? What might cause you to lose your freedom? How would you feel about that?

In March, sixth-grade students will have the opportunity to write **What Freedoms to them**. For the past 39 years, the Sertoma Club of Broad Ripple has sponsored the annual National Heritage Essay Contest for sixth-grade students. "What Freedom Means to Me" is the essay subject topic that students are asked to address in their essays. The Sertoma Club



of Broad Ripple was chartered in 1958. It provides financial support to charitable causes in central Indiana and conducts programs to promote the prevention of hearing loss. Students will learn more about the writing competition in their social studies class.

#### Essay opportunity for 7th & 8th grade students

Dr. King, Jr had an important belief for all American citizens, and students will have the opportunity to learn about these beliefs, honor him, and earn a monetary prize all at the same time!

Encourage your student to participate in the essay contest offered through their Social Studies teacher. Students were shared a link that offers contest rules, guidelines, and prize information on their Social Studies teachers' Canvas page.

The essay should be based on a quote from Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Each school can only submit a total of FIVE essays, so spots are limited. Student entries should be submitted to the student's Social Studies teacher by February 16th and then a committee of Social Studies teachers will choose the best five essays (based on the contest guidelines) to move forward in the contest. Final essays will be submitted by February 28th, online. Seek out your child's Social Studies teacher with questions.



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
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


### AVID
