



### 8th grade Social Studies students are looking to CHANGE THE WORLD!



# WHAT'S GOING ON IN IRAN?

As we returned from winter break this school year, one thing was on our 7th graders' mind, "What's going on in Iran?"

With current events developing, seemingly by the minute between Iran and the United States, students became increasingly aware of the situation through social media and memes, however the information was lacking depth and in some cases, was sensational.

We chose to take this opportunity to pause and have the students inquire more on the issue. Students developed research questions to help them investigate and understand the complex relationship between the United States and Iran since the 1950s. This inquiry cumulated with studentled small group discussions. Due to the students' efforts they are more informed with the United States foreign policy with Iran.

# Continuing the conversation with your child:

- Tell me what you learned about Iran and the relationship with the US?
- What were your feelings before & after you learned about this situation?
- What surprised you?





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# FROM THE CAFETERIA

I've been asked occasionally if school lunches are really healthy and I always answer emphatically "YES!" Through the National School Breakfast and Lunch Program regulations, breakfast is designed to supply approximately ¼ of the Recommended Dietary Allowance (RDA) for protein, calcium, iron, vitamins A and C. Lunch is designed to supply approximately 1/3 of the same nutrients. The nutritional value of the meals is evaluated over a period of a week rather than calculated on a single meal or food item. USDA has daily and weekly minimums and maximums for fat, saturated fat, sodium and calories that are age appropriate for all students grades K-12. Carmel Clay Schools have eliminated all fryers in the kitchens, and all foods served are steam or oven baked to assure no additional fats are incorporated into the product. A variety of fresh fruits and vegetables are available daily in every school. The Government Accounting Office (GAO) reports that "children who eat school meals consume more fruits, vegetables, whole grains and dairy items than children who do not eat school meals."

Please encourage your student to choose a complete school lunch for \$2.65 which includes a choice of entrée, a fruit, one or two vegetables and milk. It's filling, nutritious and a bargain!


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# **DINNER AND A MOVIE**



ILEARN is Indiana's new online computeradaptive assessment designed to measure your child's proficiency of the Indiana Academic Standards in Grades 3–8, Blology and U.S. Government. ILEARN fulfilis both state and federal legislative requirements as the accountability assessment for Indiana students.

2. What is a computer-adaptive assessment and how does it benefit my child?

Computer-adaptive assessments adapt to each student's mastery of the content throughout the assessment. Every time a student answers a question, his or her response helps determine the next question presented. The difficulty of the test will adjust to each student's skills, providing a better measure of what each student knows and can do.

3. How does ILEARN support all students?

The online testing system is easy to use and is more accessible to students who require tools or accommodations while testing. Tools and resources are available to help students show what they know.

- Bullt-in glossaries allow students to select unfamiliar words and read their definitions. Glossaries are available in English, Arabic, Burmese, Mandarin, Spanish, and Vietnamese.
- Students are provided with authentic tools, such as spell check, a dictionary, and a thesaurus for use when responding to the writing task.
- The Desmos calculator (provided for Mathematics Grades 6–8) is available for students to practice using free of charge at: <u>desmos.com</u>.
- Spanish translations (stacked over the English version) are available for Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies.

### 5. When will I receive score reports about my student's performance on ILEARN?

- Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, schools can access preliminary scores in the Online Reporting System within 12 days of students testing. Schools are responsible for sharing students' results with parents.
- Reports provide a scale score as an indication of overall student achievement in a grade level, as well as several subscores.
- Parents and guardians may request rescores of open-ended items through the local school.
