MASK UPDATES

Masks are required during the school day

Just a guick reminder to all families to please send your student(s) with back up masks in their backpacks. If your child repeatedly comes to school without a mask, you could potentially be contacted by the school and asked to drop off a mask to school.

Mask policy for extracurricular events

This message was sent out on Thursday, November 11, 2021 to all CCS families by our superintendent Dr. Beresford.

Dear Carmel Clay Schools Community,

Today, we are announcing that face masks will be optional during after-school extracurricular activities beginning today, November 11, 2021.

Masks must still be worn during the school day. Current guidance from the Indiana State Department of Health does not require students wearing masks to be quarantined. This is important to keep our students in school. This change in the mask policy only applies to optional after-school activities.

This updated mask policy at extracurricular events is consistent with policies at public venues throughout the state. When traveling outside the district to events, CCS students and staff should adhere to masking policies at those locations.

We are hopeful and optimistic that protocols will continue to be relaxed as we approach the second semester. We will continue to monitor our local data and work with state and county health officials to ensure the safety of our students and staff while adhering to legally required contact tracing and quarantine guidelines.

It's hard to believe we have 24 school days until winter break. We are thankful for your continued cooperation and support.


The Team Atlas Green Team participated in Rubicon's **Trick or Trash campaign**.




