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

SAT/ACT

For a better chance of increasing your standardized test scores, take time out this summer to prepare for them. Sign up over the summer to take the first available test during the school year. Please visit:

SAT - www.collegeboard.org

ACT - www.actstudent.org

KhanAcademy.org/sat offers free practice for the SAT. If you took the PSAT this year, you can connect your Collegeboard.com account to your Khan Academy account. Khan will then give you practice questions that are prescriptive (tailored towards your weak areas).

SAT and ACT scores are important for:

- 1. Admissions to 4 year colleges and universities
- 2. Bright Futures Eligibility
- Concordant score for the FSA (Can use the reading score to satisfy the FSA requirement)
- 4. Eligibility for Dual Enrollment
- 5. College Readiness Scores

<u>Bright Futures</u> - If you plan to volunteer over the summer please submit your proposal (Form 1) to your counselor before the end of the year. Failure to do so could mean picking a project that does not qualify for the scholarship program.

<u>College</u> - Before making the final decision on which college or university to attend, it is important to make room for a college visits. During this time you can get a feel of the campus and student life, speak to students about their experiences, as well as speak to faculty. As a general rule, the priority deadline for many college applications is November 1st. Applying later in the year may significantly decrease your chances of being accepted to the college or university of your choice. The first step in the process is the application. You do not have to wait until you have your recommendations or acceptable test scores in order to apply.

<u>Scholarships</u> - Go to <u>www.pcsb.org/clearwater-hs</u> for the latest scholarship information. The listings are found by clicking the scholarship tab. Class of 2020, visit https://opportunity.collegeboard.org for information on Collegeboard's new "Opportunity Scholarships".

<u>Summer Credit Recovery</u> - If you are either behind in credits or need to improve your GPA, Clearwater High School is offering credit recovery opportunities starting June 3rd. Students will need to attend Monday thru Thursday from 8:30 am – 12:30 pm. Contact your child's School Counselor or Administrator for further details.

Remind App - Next year, School Counselors will begin to communicate with students via the Remind App. This will be a quick and efficient way to send out reminders as well as other pertinent information to students. A message will be sent through your student's FOCUS account detailing instructions on how to sign up.
