Our MCJROTC competed against eighteen other JROTC programs from across the state of Florida. Out of the 12 events, our JROTC placed 1st in nine of them! As a result of their efforts, our MCJROTC placed 1st overall! This was the first time in school history that our MCJROTC unit has won the Iron Bear Challenge. In addition, it was also the first time in history that any MCJROTC unit has taken home this prestigious award. Thank you to Maj. Hughes and Sgt. Maj. MCJROTC Wins the Iron Bear Competition

For most, October 2nd was just an average Saturday. However, Clearwater High School Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (MCJROTC) would have called it anything but that. On Saturday, Clearwater High School's MCJROTC program brought full energy into Brooksville, Florida for the 16th Annual Iron Bear Competition at Central High School. A bus filled with 30+ cadets was ready to take home the winning trophy – and that's exactly what we did.

Annually, our program competes in the Iron Bear Competition, an athletic competition for JROTC units from all around Florida to compete in a variety of events. Eighteen schools, representing the various branches of the military, competed in a total of twelve events. These events included Mount Suribachi, Agility Course, Obstacle Course, Hamster Wheel, Truck Pull, Tire Flip, 100-Yard Relay, Fire Hose Relay, Damage Control, Clacker Board, Sea-Bag, and the Tug-of-War. Of those events, Clearwater High School MCJROTC won 1st place in nine of them.

Best of all, we left the competition with the most coveted trophy, the "Iron Bear" for finishing 1st place in the overall competition. For many years, our program has fought hard to take home this trophy. This was the first time in school history that our MCJROTC unit has won the "Iron Bear". We weren't the biggest team, or the strongest, and we faced challenges like no one else, but our program prevailed through its strict discipline and perseverance. 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


