



### **Shoes with Heart**

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### **CLASSI 3 VISIT**

The Clovis Assessment System for School Improvement also known as CLASSI was instituted in 1994 as the means of assessing and evaluating the performance of the schools in Clovis Unified. This internal accountability model helps guide schools into maintaining a high standard of excellence. CLASSI is divided into three components. Component 1 focuses on academic achievement, Component 2 focuses on co-curricular programs and community involvement, and Component 3 focuses on Cultural Proficiency. This third component is divided into five areas: Curriculum and Instruction, School Culture, Parents and Community, Human Resources and Policy, and Professional Development. This past May, Clovis West was visited by a team of district and school administration and members of the Clovis West community to learn about some of the work Clovis West is doing in regards to the third component.

During the visitation Clovis West highlighted two areas. The first area highlighted was School Culture. Clovis West shared with the visiting team the Clovis West Ambassadors program that was first implemented in the 2017-18 school year. This program, which runs in partnership with Kastner School's Intermediate Safe School Ambassadors program, is designed to help empower students in addressing adverse peer interactions. Students are given skills to help evaluate and address each situation. Several students involved in the program presented information to the visiting team and acted out a scenario to demonstrate their training. Once students are trained, they continue to discuss



their impact on campus in "family groups" which are led by staff members who also attended the training alongside the students. Students shared with the visiting team various situations they've helped to resolve and discussed the impact they are making on campus.

The second area Clovis West highlighted was professional development. Many of our staff members have attended in-services on Culturally Relevant Teaching. This professional development module follows curriculum developed by the AVID program, a program designed to ensure career and college readiness for all students. The Culturally Relevant Teaching module helps teachers create supportive, safe, and respectful academic environments for all students. Staff members that attend this training learn how to help build relational capacity in the classroom, empower student voice, create high standards for all students, and empower staff and students to respect experiences. The visitation team was led through some activities that created great dialogue and discussion. Clovis West will continue to provide staff trainings on Culturally Relevant Teaching throughout the 2019-20 school year. Clovis West received a lot of valuable feedback from the visiting team and looks forward to implementing the many suggestions that came forth from this process.





#### WHO TAKES THE EXAM:

Any student may elect to take the PSAT. PSAT allows Junior students the opportunity to potentially qualify as a semifinalist in the National Merit scholarship competition. The PSAT/NMSQT is the official route of entry to the National Merit Scholarship Program as well as other scholarship competitions. Freshman and Sophomore students gain the experience of taking a standardized test, increasing their chances for becoming a finalist in the NMSQT competition their Junior year. Scores determine how they would score on the SAT exam and reveal their academic strength and weakness.


