Nurse Notes

Welcome back Golden Eagles. Our health office is up and running and ready to assist all students with medical and health issues. Be sure to stop by and welcome Irene Benavides our new Health Assistant coming to us from Fugman Elementary. She will be a great addition to our office.



Our office is open daily from 7:30-3:00. We see and treat students for minor illnesses and injuries, store and provide daily and emergency medications on an individual basis with physician orders, provide education and referrals for acute and chronic health concerns, communicate student health needs and orders with other staff members as needed, and respond to emergencies on campus.

To provide these services in a safe manner, California Ed Code Section 49423 requires each student to have written permission from his/her physician and parent/guardian for the administration of any medication while at school. This includes all prescription and over-the-counter medication. These permissions are required with each new school year. Please also note that use of crutches, wheelchairs and other devices require a doctor's prescription indicating directions for use and that the student has been educated to use the

device. If you have any questions about this, please feel free to call our office at 327-2468.

EAGLE EXPRESS

The West Express is a coffee delivery service run by students in the Functional Life Skills program at CW. IMPORTANT CHANGES COMING FOR AP STUDENTS FROM THE COLLEGE BOARD

The Advanced Placement (AP) Program is a long-standing, rigorous curriculum developed by the non-profit organization, the College Board. Students who participate in these courses are generally looking for a challenging experience, in which they can possibly earn college credit. AP exams are administered in May, at the end of the course. If the student passes with a score of 3, 4, or 5, he or she MAY earn college credit, depending on the college they eventually attend. Currently, Clovis West offers 20 Advanced Placement Courses.

The College Board began to review data on the impact that their courses were having on student success. They conducted numerous pilot programs over the past two years in order to look for better practices to increase student involvement and performance. They found that an earlier commitment to the AP program and subsequent exam was highly beneficial for students. Therefore, beginning with the 2019/2020 school year, the College Board has instituted much earlier deadlines, along with extra fees for late registration as well as for tests not taken. The earlier schedule will be in place for all students and their families who are participating in the AP program.

Changes imposed by the College Board for the 2019/2020 AP registration process are as follows:

- Students will need to create a College Board account if they do not already have one and indicate which exam(s) they will be taking. This will also give them access to online course materials.
- Students will need to register with Total Registration (see school website for link) in order to PAY for their exams.
- Payment for each AP exam will be \$94.00 (plus a one-time Administration cost of \$5.00). Registration
 and payments for ALL AP tests are due on November 3rd 2019, but families will have an option to
 make payments through March 1, 2020. If a payment plan is arranged through Total Registration, an
 additional processing fee of \$2.75 will be incurred. November 3rd is the deadline to either make a
 deposit and arrange a payment plan or to make payment in full.
- Students who register after the deadline of November 3rd will be charged a \$40.00 late fee in addition to the cost of the AP exam(s). This fee is imposed by the College Board, and not Clovis Unified.
- Students whose household income would qualify for the Free/Reduced Lunch program would be eligible for a waiver and will pay a total of \$5.00 per exam. These students, however, will also be charged the \$40.00 late fee if they miss the registration deadline of November 3rd.
- Students who choose to register late (and pay the extra \$40.00 late fee) will have until March 1st to do so. After this time, students will no longer be able to register for the AP test(s).
- **IMPORTANT:** Students who have registered to take an AP exam (or exams) but then decide not to take it will receive a refund of \$54.00 per exam (\$94.00 original registration less a \$40.00 cancellation fee).

If you have any further questions, ask your student's Counselor, AP Teacher or AP Coordinator, who are all well-aware of the new AP Process.

While Community College may not be the intended plan for students, we believe that having the Community College application complete, even if it is a "plan b," or "plan c" is crucial to the start of their college career. The goal of College Application Day is for every senior to complete one or more college applications and are celebrated by our faculty and staff. Each senior who completes their application receives an "I Applied," sticker to show their peers and teachers that they are that much closer to be a college student! In addition to applying to colleges, students will begin working on their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) applications by creating

their FSA ID number needed to begin the (FAFSA) process. Congratulations Class of 2020!

Your Clovis West Counselling Department wishes to remind you that we are here to help support your student both academically and emotionally. Please have your student sign up in the Counseling Center for an appointment with our CSU Representative should they have any questions.
- 3. **University of California:** Applications are submitted online beginning November 1st thru November 30th (NO EXCEPTIONS) at www.universityofcalifornia.edu/apply.

Upcoming FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) Workshops: October 3rd, and December 5th in the Computer Lab in the "C" Building from 6:00-8:30 pm.

Remember, you must take either an SAT or ACT exam to be considered for admission to a CSU/UC Campus. You can register for these at www.collegeboard.com or www.actstudent.org.

Several current and recent alumni of the Clovis West Instrumental Music department spent the summer participating in Drum Corps International as members of the following Drum and Bugle Corps:

The easiest thing to compare Drum Corps to is to Marching Band. While it's not a perfect comparison, corps actively call themselves "Marching Music's Major League". An average corps consists of 150 brass, percussion, color guard members between the ages of 17-21, participating in high level competitions with other corps at events around the country, called the DCI tour. The average tour consists of several parts - auditions, winter camps, spring training, and the tour.

Auditions typically begin mid-November, just as the high school and college marching band seasons are ending. Most corps traditionally hold a mix of weekend-long and single day audition. Auditions

generally require two things - a music audition and a visual audition. After their audition, members generally get one of three verdicts - a contract, a callback, or are cut. If a member is contracted, they are officially a member of the corps! They commit to march with the corps for the coming season, and officially get a spot in the line. They also commit to paying

Around Memorial Day, the corps members begin move-ins, starting the largest leg of the season. From then on, they are living, eating, sleeping, and marching with the rest of the corps until World Championship Finals. Over the course of about a month, the members learn the

show, putting together drill (the movements on the field) and music to build the final product. Members sometimes rehearse up to 16-18 hours a day, pushing themselves to their physical and mental limit. This gets the member ready, however, for the challenges about to be put in front of them throughout the tour.

Most of the drum corps experience is on the road. After spring training, members pack up their belongings and get ready to live on the move. Corps travel around the US, performing at competitions in high school, college, and NFL stadiums in from coast to coast. Sleeping on buses and in school gyms, rehearsing in high temperatures during the hot summer months, the tour is rigorous. The experience that comes with it though - performing in front of thousands every night, and making friends that will last a lifetime, as well as the life skills members develop - are difficult to make anywhere else.

Drum Corps is a big commitment - in every form of the sense. Members give up an entire summer to push themselves to their mental and physical limits, performing in front of thousands in stadiums around the country, in far from comfortable conditions. However, from it, members build a sense of community, character, and perseverance rarely found, and hard to replicate.

This year the Blue Devils Drumand Bugle Corps won their 19th Championship August 11th of 2019 at Lucas Oil Stadium!

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

WHO TAKES THE EXAM:

Any student may elect to take the PSAT. PSAT allows Junior students the opportunity to potentially qualify as a semifinalist in the National Merit scholarship competition. The PSAT/NMSQT is the official route of entry to the National Merit Scholarship Program as well as other scholarship competitions. Freshman and Sophomore students gain the experience of taking a standardized test, increasing their chances for becoming a finalist in the NMSQT competition their Junior year. Scores determine how they would score on the SAT exam and reveal their academic strength and weakness.
