Annual ESE Parent Survey is Underway

It is time for the Florida Department of Education's Exceptional Student Education Parent Survey.

Each year, the department surveys parents of students with an individual education plan (IEP) who receive special education services to determine how well schools are promoting their involvement in their children's education.

If your child receives special education services, make your voice heard. Take the ESE Parent Survey. Feedback helps the state and the school district improve educational services for children with special needs and their families.

The survey is confidential, but Pinellas County Schools receives overall results and improves ESE services based on parent feedback. As a result, the district created a helpline to assist families with navigating special education services and implemented options to make ESE Advisory Committee Meetings accessible to families throughout the county.

2021 Advanced Placement (AP) Exams-Updated

General Information

In May, students will be given the opportunity to take AP exams for the course they are registered to take. These exams provide students with a worldwide standardized measure of what they have accomplished in the AP classroom or as a self-study. Taking an AP exam allows students an opportunity to experience a college level exam while still in high school. Scoring well may provide students with college credit which opens more options in college, such as upper



level courses, double majors, or time for study abroad. Students not taking their AP exam shall receive a grade of F as the final exam grade for the semester. Students arriving after the exam starts will not be permitted to test.



GREAT NEWS!!! Pinellas County Schools Food and Nutrition Department have been approved for free meals to all students during the school day for the rest of this school year!! What does this mean to you? You get to eat 1 Breakfast and 1 Lunch per day for FREE, that's right - FREE!!!

Breakfast is served 2 times per day: 7:00–7:30 and 9:56–10:04. You can pick which time you want to get yours.

Lunch is served daily: 1:29-1:59.

ALSO: We continue to be a distribution school to provide meals for the week. Every Thursday afternoon, from 4:00-6:00 pm, we are providing families with 27 meals per child. 7 breakfasts, 7 lunches, 7 dinners and 5 snacks. You don't even have to get out of your car. Just follow the signs to the back of the school and our staff will load everything in the trunk for you. Spread the word – this is for ANY child under 19 years of age regardless of being a student or not.

This course is designed to prepare students to identify the attributes of fibers, fabric, and textiles. Hands on projects will help students learn the basics of hand sewing and simple clothing repairs. Students will also have the opportunity to use sewing machines to create their own projects; such projects include: pillows and pajama shorts!

Child Development

Grades 9-12

Length: 1 semester (1/2 credit)

Caring for children takes more than love. It is also one of life's greatest responsibilities. The course encompasses how life begins, prenatal care, principles of development, child abuse and neglect. Preparing for parenthood is this course's concern. Real Care Baby infant simulation is also included in this course.

Nutrition and Wellness

Grades 9-12

Length: 1 semester (1/2 credit)

What do shiny hair, a glowing complexion, high energy level and good grades have in common? They all require smart food choices. In this course, students will learn to plan and prepare nutritious food and learn to understand the principles of good nutrition. Demonstrations, laboratory, and experiments are included.

Principles of Food Prep

Grades 9-12

Length: 1 semester (1/2 credit)
Prerequisite: Nutrition and Wellness

Is entertaining your thing? Are you interested in international cooking, food from different areas of our country, or cake decorating? Join us to learn more advanced food preparation techniques from all over the world.

Food Science

Grades 10-12

Length: 1 year (1 credit)

Prerequisite: Other food/nutrition courses as approved by teacher This course is designed to stimulate the student interested in issues of nutrition and health, production and marketing of food, and behavior of food substances. Students will use the scientific method to explore the makeup of food and the science of nutrition. Students will have the opportunity to obtain their ServSafe certification in this course.

PCS User ID & Password

How do I Obtain a PCS Parent User ID and Password?

CURRENT STUDENTS

If you already have a PCS Parent User ID and Password, you do not need to get another User ID or Password for additional members in your family. Only one User ID and Password is issued per family. Simply use your User ID and Password to log in to the Student Reservation System to register your child. Then take the required documents to your child's assigned school (see document list below).

NEW OR RETURNING STUDENTS

If you have a new or returning student to Pinellas County and need to make a reservation for a public school and do not have a Parent User ID and Password you will first need to do the following: To obtain a username or reset your password, take a photo id (driver's license, state id, passport, etc.) into any PCS school and ask for one. You can also take a picture or scan it and send your request to: StudentAssignment@pcsb.org After you have obtained a User ID and Password you can use the school's computer or your home computer to complete your child's reservation, which will hold your child's seat at their zone school.

Why do I need a Parent User ID and Password?

A Parent User ID and Password is used with Focus and the Student Reservation System. In Focus when the student has been attached to the Parent User ID a parent is able to log into Focus and view a variety of different items pertaining to the student. Some of these items could include grades, attendance, homework assignments and have access to links to their students' teachers. Parents will use the Student Reservation System (SRS) for the following:

- Reserving a seat for enrolling a new or returning students for the Current School Year
- Reserving a seat for enrolling a new student for the Next School Year
- Changing your residence address
- Applying for District Application Programs (magnets, fundamental, or high school career programs)
- Applying for a Special Assignment Request


Does My Parent User ID Ever Expire?

Yes, Parent User Accounts that have not been used to log on to any district system (SRS or FOCUS) will be purged and deleted after 12 months of inactivity. If your ID is purged, you can have a new ID and Password issued by following the process described above and visiting any school or the Student Assignment Office with a valid photo ID.

How do I change my Passwords for Focus/SRS?

Parents who wish to change their current password may do so by clicking on "Forgot your Password?" near the bottom of the page in Focus. Then enroll into the Self Service Reset Password Management (SSRPM), after enrolling you will be able to reset your password. Parents must create a complex password that is a minimum of ten characters long. New passwords will require at least one character from three of the following four categories: lower case alphabetic (a-z), upper case alphabetic (A-Z), numeric (0-9) and special characters (examples: !,@,#).

If you are unable to change your password online or if you do not know your username or password, you must visit your school to have your identity confirmed and password changed. Please bring your identification with you to the school.









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
