### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Bearcat Families,

Over the last two school years Crystal River Middle School has experienced considerable academic and behavioral growth. This growth is directly connected to the support and dedication from our Bearcat Community. Parents, staff, and students have worked very hard, held high expectations, and provided the necessary support to provide an excellent learning environment for all students and it is showing!

We have recently received notification of two important accomplishments since our last newsletter. One of the major accomplishments is that Crystal River Middle School was nominated for the Fred E Rozelle State of Florida Sportsmanship award for the second consecutive year. This award is presented to one out of thousands of middle schools in Florida. The award is given to the top school that demonstrates sportsmanship on the field, as well as having a well-defined system of addressing student behavior and achievement on campus. We have high expectations for all students but our student athletes that wear the Bearcat uniform are held to an even higher set of expectations. as a is the foundation for all that we do. With the award comes a niche plaque and a \$2500 check that will be used to continue to grow our athletic programs.

Our second important accomplishment is moving from 4th to 2nd in FSA points of middle schools in Citrus County. This change is ranking was based largely on student acceleration and growth from the lowest 25% of students as measured by state testing. Student acceleration is based on the number of students taking and passing high school courses and receiving Industry Certification at the middle school level. All CRMS acceleration points came from students passing high school courses. We had the highest acceleration of middle and high schools in Citrus County. The lowest academic performing 25% of our English Language Arts students demonstrated the most growth of all four middle schools in Citrus County. Our bottom 25% in Math had the second most growth of all middle schools in Citrus County.

Adding these two accomplishments to last years growth makes the Bearcat community very proud! Last school year CRMS was awarded the District Science Fair championship for middle schools. Our student, parent, and staff climate surveys demonstrated major growth and a majority of the categories were the top in the district.

### **B.E.S.T. STANDARDS**

The BEST Standards stand for "Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking". After adoption of the BEST Standards on Feb 12, 2020, a 3-year implementation timeline to transition from the FLStandards to the BEST Standards went into effect. The BEST Standards will impact the subject areas of ELA and Math. Implementation for the ELA BEST Standards in all Reading classes is underway for the 21-22 school year, and full implementation for all ELA and Math grade levels will take place in the 2022-2023 academic school year.

### What is different about the BEST Standards?

In Reading and ELA, the BEST Standards depart from the FL Standards in that they emphasize foundational literacy skills, prioritizing the basic reading and writing skills. Students behind in grade level proficiency receive direct support targeting key reading components as a foundation for comprehension. Similarly, in Math the BEST Standards prioritize foundational skills, such as fluency with basic arithmetic. Altogether, the BEST Standards for ELA and Math emphasize the acquisition of concrete skills as key components for learning.

We are excited and looking forward to the BEST Standards!
