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

DEPARTMENT NEWS

ELA

Our ELA department is currently providing many opportunities for our students to perfect their essay writing as our FSA test approaches. 6th-8th grade will be tested April 1st-3rd. Students are encouraged to study writing techniques, Cornell notes, and resources provided by their teachers in order to prepare for the test. In addition, our teachers are spending a great deal of time assessing student progress on reading standards as well. As a department we meet monthly to analyze data and develop lesson plans and activities that will better prepare our students for the FSA reading test in May. Our online textbook provides Level-Up Tutorials to support reinforcement and review for all of our ELA standards being tested on FSA. Please encourage your child to access these tutorials in the weeks leading to our May assessment. As always, thank you for supporting our ELA teachers and your child in providing the best opportunity for success.



TEST TAKING STRATEGIES

The FSA testing will begin April 1st for writing and in May for all other subject areas. Here are some test taking strategies that can help your student.

- Learn how to answer each kind of question. Standardized tests may have many types of questions, including, but not limited to: multiple-choice, gridded-response, short-answer, drag-and-drop, equation-response, multiselect and extended response.
- Plan to take about 5 minutes for each short-answer question and 10-15 minutes for each long-answer question.
- Read each question carefully and think about the answer before you choose your answer.
- Answer questions you are sure about first. If a question seems too hard, skip it and go back to that question later.
- There is no penalty for guessing or for wrong answers. Therefore, it is best to try to answer all questions, even if you are not sure of the correct answer.
- Think positively. Some questions may seem hard, but you may be able to figure out how to answer if you read the questions carefully.
- Relax. Some people get nervous when taking a test. Just do your best.

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PAY ATTENTION TO ATTENDANCE

School starts at 7:50 AM! Which means students need to be in their first class at 7:50 AM when the bell rings! Attending school is extremely important for children's social, emotional and educational development. Children who miss a lot of time at school can suffer in the long run from significant gaps in their learning. We need your support to ensure your child's education is not affected. Send children to school every day, all day to get the most out of their education.

How can you help?

- Encourage your child to get enough sleep to ensure that he/she is able to get up in the morning
- Leave home with plenty of time to get to school.
- Try to schedule appointments before or after school hours
- Don't let your child stay home unless truly sick. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to provide a written note within two (2) days of the student(s) returning to school. After 10 days of excused or unexcused absences, medical notes by a physician will be required for subsequent absences. If no medical documentation is provided, further absences are considered unexcused.
