Hello Parents/Guardians!

Please continue to reach out to your student's teachers if you have questions or concerns about your child's grades. Now is the time to address any academic issues as the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) is approaching very quickly. Remember that because of CDC guidelines due to Covid-19, we cannot have meetings in person on the school campus, but we can set up ZOOM meetings and phone conferences.

I wanted to share some tips for easing stress during FSA testing time:

- Remind your student to just try and do their best, this is an assessment to see what they know, not a test to punish them.
- The week if the FSA, make sure your student gets a good night sleep and eats breakfast.
- If your student is not feeling good the morning of the assessment, remember there is make up days for the test.
- Give your child words of encouragement on the morning of the FSA, you would be amazed at how a few simple words can change everything.

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
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
