

# REMINDERS-SCHOOL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

#### **ABSENCES**

#### **Testing Information**

FAST PM1 Asssessments are complete and PM2 will start in Decmeber and January. If you would like to access your student's scores from PM,1 please follow the directions below.



Citrus County families now have access to assessment scores via the Florida Statewide Assessments Family Portal.

#### Accessing the Family Portal

Log in to Skyward Family Access or Skyward Student. From the home screen. click on District Links in the upper right corner and then Statewide Assessment Scores.

Clicking on this link will open a new window to the Family Portal where student's current and previous test results can be viewed. Any student or parent/guardian of a student with available scores will have access on their portal.





Results for the current school year are required to be provided to the schools and available via the Family Portal, by the Florida Department of Education, no later than the July 31st of each year.

Assessment scores are also available via Skyward Student and Family Access Portal by clicking on "Test Scores" under a student's profile.

The Mobile Response Team (MRT) is a 24/7 on-call crisis intervention service provided through LifeStream Behavioral Health. MRT provides emergency behavioral health assessment, and diversion to alternatives to inpatient treatment when appropriate. Beyond working to resolve the crisis situation, the team also works with the individual and their family to identify and create strategies for effectively dealing with possible future crisis, and rapid follow-up after the initial contact. Anyone can call the MRT helpline at 352-408-6625.

### FOUNDATIONAL SKILLS IN MATHEMATICS: GRADES 6 - 8

Foundational Skill in Mathematics course is designed to enable students to develop mathematical skills and concepts through critical thinking, problem solving, and an online-learning program; ALEKS.

ALEKS is a research-based program that offers spiraling topics that constantly adapts to each student's knowledge helping students master their course topics through a continuous cycle of knowledge retention and positive feedback. Students in the Foundational Skills course have targeted goals each week to complete up to 18 ALEKS topics with a goal of completing their RTI 6, RTI 7 or RTI 8 course by the end of the first semester. Students that meet their targeted goals will receive incentives along while they are learning mathematics.

Please encourage your student to work on their ALEKS topics at home so that they can build their math knowledge and become a more confident mathematician.
