Students who demonstrate these expectations are celebrated monthly in multiple ways such as certificates, popcorn, ice cream, snow cones candy, chips etc.

PBIS improves outcomes—social, emotional, and academic—for every student, including students with disabilities and students from underrepresented groups.

President: Marianna Young Secretary: Leia Busby



Follow these instructions to set up your account:


When you go to myschoolbucks.com, you must "make an account." When asked to choose



your county, you must select **School District of Lee County**, NOT Lee County. Once you have done this, go to the little head on the top right-hand side of the screen and click on that. Then, click on "my students" and add your child as a student. This is when you'll be able to choose the school. Once you have done this, go back to the home screen and click on "store." Under the store tab, click browse all. You will find everything that you need here.

#### Counselor Corner

Cypress Lake High School counselors are here to support our students and we look forward to working with you and your student this year. At CLHS, the roles of the school counselors include academic advising and intervention, college and career exploration, scheduling and class selection, and planning for graduation. We are also fortunate to include Ms. Ranae Atkinson our College and Career Specialist as part of our team.

The next few months are exciting times for our seniors as they begin planning for life after high school. School counselors will be meeting individually with all seniors to complete their graduation contract. During this meeting, counselors will be sharing important information regarding diploma requirements, mandatory assessments, review current grades and help seniors plan for ways to meet their postsecondary goals.

It's not too early for juniors to begin to prepare for college which typically starts with scheduling college entrance exams. The counseling office recommends that students take the ACT or SAT for the first time during their junior year. It is recommended that students take both the SAT and ACT and based on their results take one of the exams again after studying or practice.
