## Principal's Press

I want to thank our staff, students, and families for making the start of the school year so successful. It is hard to believe that we are finished with the first quarter of the 2023-2024 school year. This year we have celebrated our End of Course testing scores, had a successful Homecoming, implemented a new hallway management system, and are continuing to find ways to improve instruction and engage our students.

There is already a lot to be proud of as a school, district, and community. In athletics, our sports teams are in the middle of playoff runs, and we have celebrated our Senior Fall athletes for their leadership and success. In Performing Arts, our Marching Band is working hard for their state championship event at the end of October, our drama students are preparing for The One Act Festival on November 11th, and the Show Choirs are gearing up for their competition season right around the corner.

We have so many hardworking and dedicated students, please let me take some time to recognize several. This year we recognize four students for being named National Merit Semifinalists. These students are Owen Crawley, Ian Fights, Anthony Gehrlich-Orr, and Quinton Jarrett. These four seniors scored in the top 1% of the 1.7 million students who participated in the 2022 PSAT. We also recognized Rylan Gehrlich-Orr, Xander Graman, and Ganesh Tiwari as Commended Scholars. These three seniors scored in the top 3% of the same 1.7 million students who participated in the 2022 PSAT. Additionally, the College Board awards 32,000 students from across the country with academic honors. To be recognized for these awards, students must have a GPA of 3.5 or higher, have excelled on the PSAT, or earned a score of 3 or higher on two or more AP Exams, and are African American or Black, Hispanic American or Latinx, Indigenous, and/or attend school in a rural area or small town. Fairfield High School's 2023 award winners are Betty Acheampong, Natalia Delgado, Harmony Haro, Kayla Howard, Quinton Jarrett, Mya Love, Nnenna Otisi, and Kyla Tillman. Finally,

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


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### THEATER NEWS


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### CCP ANNOUNCEMENT

### 2023 - 2024 PARKING PASSES

Parking Permits for the 23-24 school year are available for purchase using Payschools (www.payschoolscentral.com). **ALL** students driving to FHS (including by not limited to PSEO/CCP students, Flex and CBIP) are **REQUIRED** to purchase a yearly parking permit.

Parking Permit Applications are available for completion through Final Forms (www.fairfield-oh.finalforms.com). Only complete this form for the **STUDENT DRIVING** – please do not complete for siblings riding in the same vehicle and/ or if carpooling with another student – if the sibling and/ or other student will be driving to school at any time in a separate vehicle, please complete the Parking Application individually for that student. Please make sure that **ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION** has also been uploaded into your student's file folder in Final Forms. If further instruction is needed, please see https://bit.ly/3BYRyJK. Parking Permits will not be processed if information/documentation is missing.

### **REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:**

- 1.) Student's Driver's License
- 2.) Auto Insurance for vehicle being driven
- 3.) Current Vehicle Registration



Please allow up to two (2) school days for processing. Students may stop in the office BEFORE or AFTER school only to pick up their parking pass hang tag. PASSES WILL NOT BE DISTRIBUTED DURING ANY OF THE LUNCH BELLS.

Students are only permitted to park in the student lot. Parking is on a first come basis with the exception of seniors who have previously purchased a PAINT SPOT. There is **NO PARKING** at any time in a reserved area: Staff/Visitor area, Drop-Off/Pick-Up areas, Handicap spaces, Fire Lane, etc. **ALL** student parking is in the **FRONI** of the school building across from the tennis court area and includes the lower Marching Band practice lot. **SENIOR PAINTED SPOTS ARE CONSIDERED A RESERVED AREA.** 

Any student found parked or parking in a reserved area, outside of the student parking area, or parking without a Permit will automatically have the parking fee (\$55) assessed to their student account and are subject to discipline action, and/or having the car tagged/towed at the owner's expense.

Students called out for early dismissal will be verified as a registered student driver before being released; students identified by the parent/guardian as a driver but do not have a parking permit will have the \$55 parking fee assessed to their student account. Parking fees are a non-waivable school expense.
