

DIGITAL FOOTPRINT WEB WISDOM: YOUR DIGITAL IDENTITY

In today's digital age, a person's online presence can significantly impact their future educational and career opportunities, which makes it important to be aware of your digital footprint. Imagine your digital footprint as a giant trail of all the stuff you do online – the likes, comments, selfies, TikToks, posts, and even the memes you share. It's like leaving a trail of breadcrumbs or your online shadow – everywhere you go, everything you do or say, even the funny cat videos you watch, it all leaves a mark. Just like your real-life reputation, your digital footprint shapes how people see you online. It's the collection of all the information and content about you that is available online, including social media profiles, comments, photos, blog posts, and more.

This is important to think about because first impressions matter a great deal. Sometimes your first impression may be your online presence, which can influence peoples' decisions. Scholarship committees, college admissions, and employers all scourer the internet to try and find reasons why you may or may not be a good choice.

HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO CONSIDER:

- Privacy settings: It is important to understand and adjust privacy settings on social media platforms to control who can see your posts and information.
- Think Before You Post: Once something is posted, even if you delete it, it can be on the internet forever so think twice before posting anything.
- Google Yourself: You should periodically search your own name and information to see what comes up. This allows you to assess and improve your online reputation.
- Positive Online Contributions: Try to not be a troll or engage with trolls, instead try and be a positive light, share your achievements, engage in meaningful discussions, and show your interests and talents.
- Manage Digital Mistakes: Apologize and correct if you have posted something you regret, this shows maturity and responsibility.

I encourage you to look at what your personal branding and digital footprint look like. You can develop a consistent online identity that reflects your values, interests, and aspirations. Look into creating professional online profiles to help guide others to see what you would like them to see. LinkedIn profiles can be created in high school, for networking and showcasing your skills and achievements. Something less formal could be a personal website or blog where you can showcase your work, projects, portfolio, and interests. These are all ways to take control of your online presence and to use it as a tool to help you achieve your educational and/or career goals.

SETTING SMART GOALS

We hope you are feeling refreshed in the New Year. From this point until the end of the school year, each day will bring more and more daylight! We cannot believe we are halfway through the school year! As we embark on the second semester, now is a great time to do some self-reflection around the first semester and set some goals for the rest of the year. January was Mental Wellness Month, but it is important to focus on Mental Wellness all the time, not just in January! Mental wellness is not something that occurs on its own, it is a muscle that needs to be strengthened every day. If you do not already have a self-care practice, the new year is a great time to incorporate one into your everyday routine. Small changes can turn into wellness habits that set the stage for hope, joy, and resiliency in the new year.

Second semester is a great time to reflect on what went well during the first semester and what could be better. What are your strengths? What was challenging? Once you have determined what area to improve upon, here are some ways to support you in achieving your goals. Set a SMART goal. **SMART goals are:**

S - Specific. Set goals that are clear and well-defined about what you wish to achieve (rather than, "I would like to wake up earlier next semester," a more specific goal would be, "I will wake up at 7:00am every morning on Monday-Friday."

M - Measurable. How will you know when you've achieved their goal? Track your progress!

A - Achievable. What specific actions will you take to achieve your goal? Consider any resources you will need to achieve your goal and whether or not it is achievable, given your set of resources.

R - Relevant. Why is this goal important to you? What are the benefits? Why is it meaningful?

T - Time-bound. When do you want to achieve your goal?

TutorMe 🕇

Tutor Me is an online tutoring program that will connect any FCPS middle or high school student to a live tutor, 24 hours a day in over 300 subjects. Log on day or night and in under 30 seconds you will be connected to one of over 10,000 verified tutors from the nation's top universities who are all experts in their field(s). Once matched, you'll enter a lesson space that features audio and video chat, screen sharing, virtual white boards and much more. The program can be used from home or school. Tutors can provide homework help, understanding

concepts, writing support, and SAT prep. There are also options for students that speak Spanish, French, and many other languages.

Students are able to <u>log into "Tutor Me"</u> using the single sign-in Clever tool found on their Chromebooks. Students can even access past tutoring sessions later on if needed. Teachers have added a link via their individual Schoology Course Page to the One-Pager. If your student needs help finding it, please have them reach out to their teacher for assistance.
